### Velde Removal As Probe Head Asked in House

Rep. Roosavelt Calls For Action On Resolution Charging False Accusations

WASHINGTON un-Rep. Roose-vell (D-NY) today asked the Unite to remove Rep. Velde (R-III) as chairman of its Unamerican Ac-tivities Committee.

Roosevelt introduced a resolution for removal of Velde, He told news

men his move was based on "the admittedly falso and reckless charges" Velde made against Mrs.

Agnes Meyer, a threatened investigation of Reds among clergymen and "the fact that he (Velde) acted to the hoth leateness without consultation of fellow members of the

Velde was officially elected chairman of the group by action of the House when the new Congress organized in January.

Velde suggested last week end that his committee might look into Communist influences in the churches. This stirred up protests from a number of clergymen, in cluding Velde's own pastor.

It also ran into quick opposition from other members of the committee.

No drastic changes are proposed, though these may come later. The discussion was on abolition of passport coatrol and customs duties among the four countries, the holding of common examinations for universities, co-ordination of health organizations, and studies looking toward greater economic unity.

There has been some coolness toward Sweden on the part of Denmark and Norway because the two latter suffered from German conquest, while Sweden escaped that fate through neutrality, not offering to come to her neighbors' ald. Greater goodwill should now result.

"Such action," he said, "is demanded by the importance and magnitude of these functions, which affect the well being of millions

of our citizens."

Eisenhower's plan calls for the head of the new department to be assisted by an undersecretary and two assistant secretaries.
