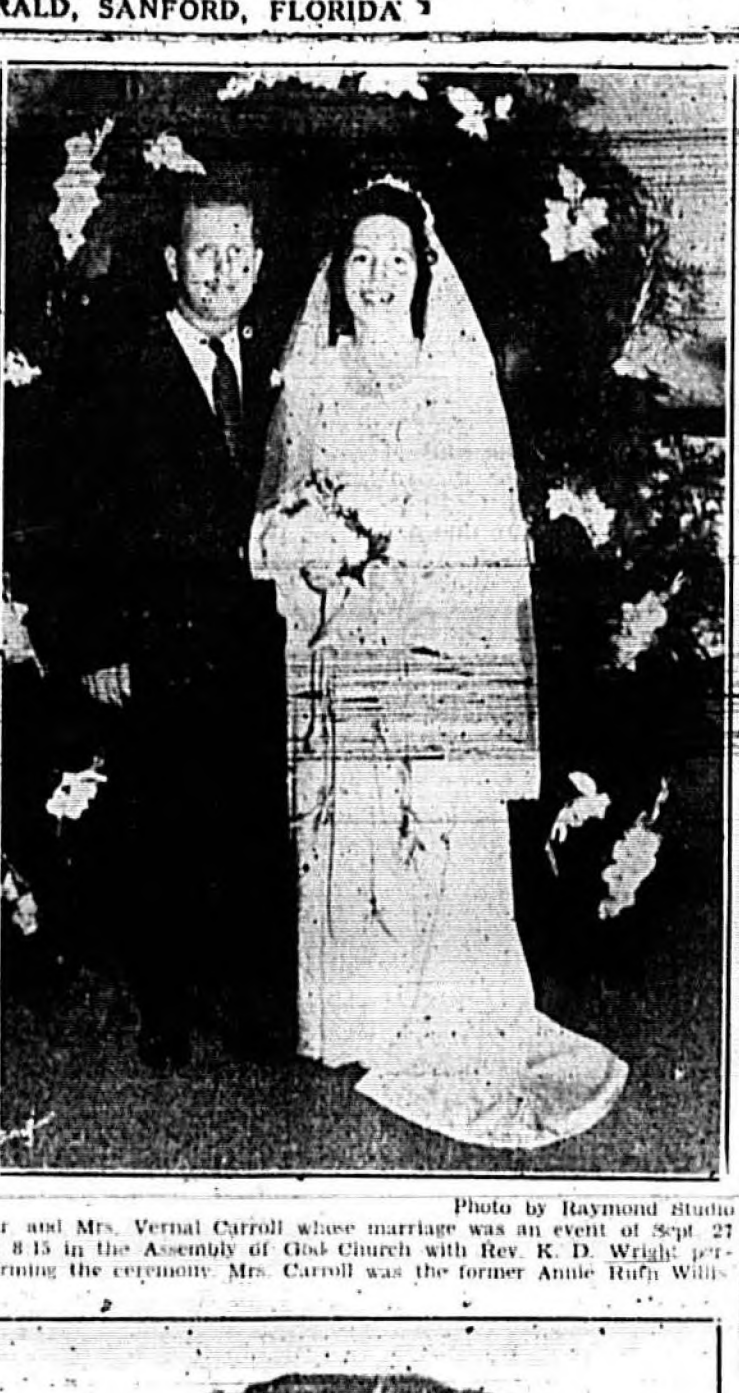

Unbeaten In 2 Years 14 Lettermen Back On Army's Machine

NEW YORK—As long as Army has a touchdown, it will win. That is the motto of Coach Earl Blaik and his 14 lettermen who are back on the Army's machine.

The U. S. Military Academy has the best trained athletes in the land and football is the No. 1 sport on the plains of West Point. However, Army will have to battle for most of its points this fall, for returning veterans have strengthened practically every college team in the land.

Notre Dame appears well equipped to give the future generals an interesting afternoon when they play here on Nov. 9 in the 33rd meeting. But it must be remembered Notre Dame has a strenuous schedule including a game with Navy this previous week.

Army, unbeaten the last two years, again must be rated No. 1. Coach Earl Blaik has 14 lettermen back. Eleven of them are starters.

The Cadets have three other letter winners as reserves. Before the season is out they'll probably be alternating as starters for their experienced enough to make most college teams.

The temporary bench sitters are Tackle Harold Tavel, Halfback Elwyn Rowan and End Tom Hayes.

Rating teams behind Army promises to be as difficult as selecting the 1946 All-American team. Seven All-American acres are back from last year and two from 1944. In Hamilton Nichols, Rice guard, and John Ferraro, Southern California tackle.

Almost every section in the country boasts standout teams. On the Pacific Coast they're ranked about Southern California's Trojan in the Southeastern Conference it's Alabama; Texas in the Southwest Conference; Duke in the Southern Conference; Notre Dame in the Midwest against such Big Nine states as Ohio State, the Oklahoma Aggies in the Missouri Valley; the Missouri Tigers in the Big Six and a scramble between Denver, Utah and Colorado in the Big Seven.

GAINESVILLE, Oct. 4. (Special)—Pre-Homecoming feature of the University of Florida's Thirty-ninth annual Homecoming will be a concert Oct. 17, by the famed United States Navy Band, officials of the Lyceum Council, sponsors for the concert have announced.

Musical highlight of the Homecoming week-end, the concert is expected to draw a capacity crowd of students and old grads to the Florida Field stadium. This season marks the first fall tour of the Navy Band since 1941 and more than fifty musicians and seven soloists will make the trip from Washington for the University appearance. Lieutenant Charles Brender will conduct.

The Blue Key sponsored Homecoming program will get under way Oct. 18 at 3:00 P. M. when Senator Spessard L. Holland, a Florida alumnus, will dedicate the Murphree Memorial erected to the honor of Dr. Albert A. Murphree, for 17 years president of the University of Florida.

The program will also include an organ recital by Claude L. Murphy, University organist, at 4:00 P. M. and two conducted tours of the campus and university facilities.

Annual Blue Key banquet with Congressman-elect George Smathers as guest speaker is slated for 7:30 P. M. Oct. 18 in the gymnasium, with the annual Gator Growl following at 8:15 P. M. in Florida Field Stadium.

Saturday's program, highlighted by the Miami-Florida football game, includes numerous intercollegiate parties, a meeting of the University of Florida Alumni Association, the legislators' barbecue and the Homecoming pep club dance.

Exhibits will be set up for the Homecoming week-end by the Agricultural Experiment Station in Engineering and Industrial Experiment Station, the University Library and the School of Architecture and Allied Arts.

It appears likely that Allen will sit out Kentucky's games until the situation is cleared up by conference officials. Officials of the school have entered a formal protest against the ineligibility ruling delivered by the conference executive committee, but the head coach of the Wildcats, Paul (Bear) Bryant, said he had instructions to leave Allen on the sidelines until further notice.

Meanwhile, the rest of the coaches in the southeastern loop are putting their charges through final tuneup practices today. The University of Florida Gators and the Tulane Greenies are putting their all into practice as they get ready to face each other Saturday. The Gators will stop over at Pensacola tomorrow for a short practice session before coming on to New Orleans.

The Georgia Bulldogs are already on their way to Philadelphia. They expect to arrive there in time for a practice session under the lights tonight. The Bulldogs play Temple tomorrow night.

The football weekend in the Southeastern Conference is starting a little early for one of the conference powers, the Georgia Bulldogs. Coach Wally Butts' team left Athens last night for an invasion of the east and a Friday night encounter with Temple.

Injury lists through most of the conference appear to be dividing this evening, as the squads get ready for the weekend tilt. For the Bulldogs, however, Coach Wally Butts has added to the sick roster. Line Coach J. B. "Ears" Whitworth has been placed under observation for an undisclosed malady at Emory hospital in Atlanta, and he probably will not make the trip to Philadelphia.

The Tulane Green Wave and the Florida Gators seem to have their game pretty well doped out. Coach Henry Frka of Tulane is putting the emphasis on passing, and Coach Ray Wolf of Florida's spring team is on pass duty. The Gators did pretty well.

At Alabama, Coach Frank Thomas comes up with a frank comment on the Crimson Tide's defense against the South Carolina 17 formation. Thomas labeled the effort "pretty sorry" as receivers gained consistently against the regulars.

There's good news at Auburn, where the Tigers are preparing to entertain Furman. Jack Cornelius, injured right tackle, has come around into playing condition. In Atlanta, the injured list at Georgia Tech looks a little better with ace quarterback Frank Broyles rapidly rounding into shape.

The current dispute in the conference, President John J. Tigert says he has sent a telegram informing the University of Kentucky that star back Ermal Allen has been declared ineligible. Some reports from Kentucky in-

cluded the wildcats were planning to use Allen on the basis of an earlier decision, which said Allen could play.

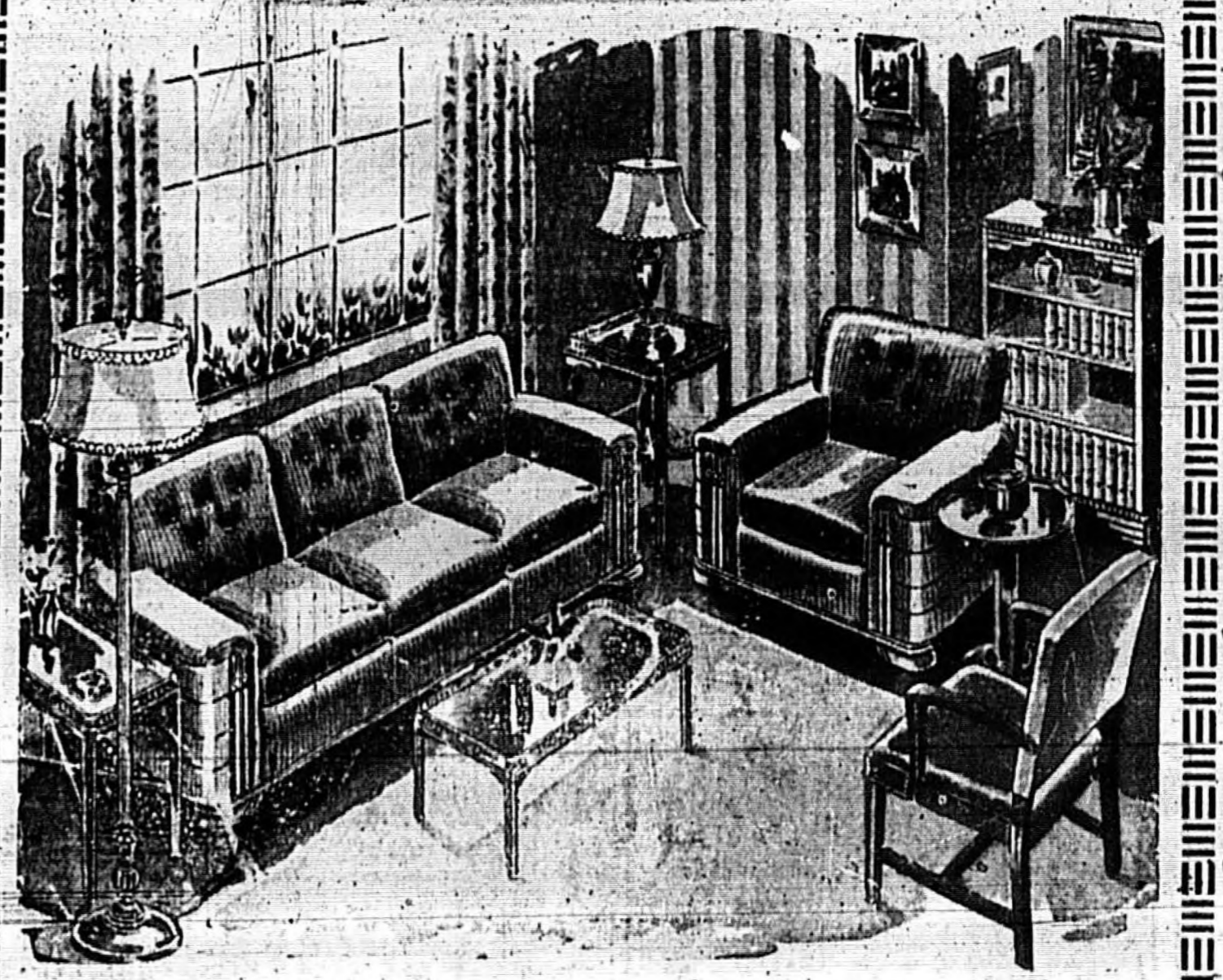

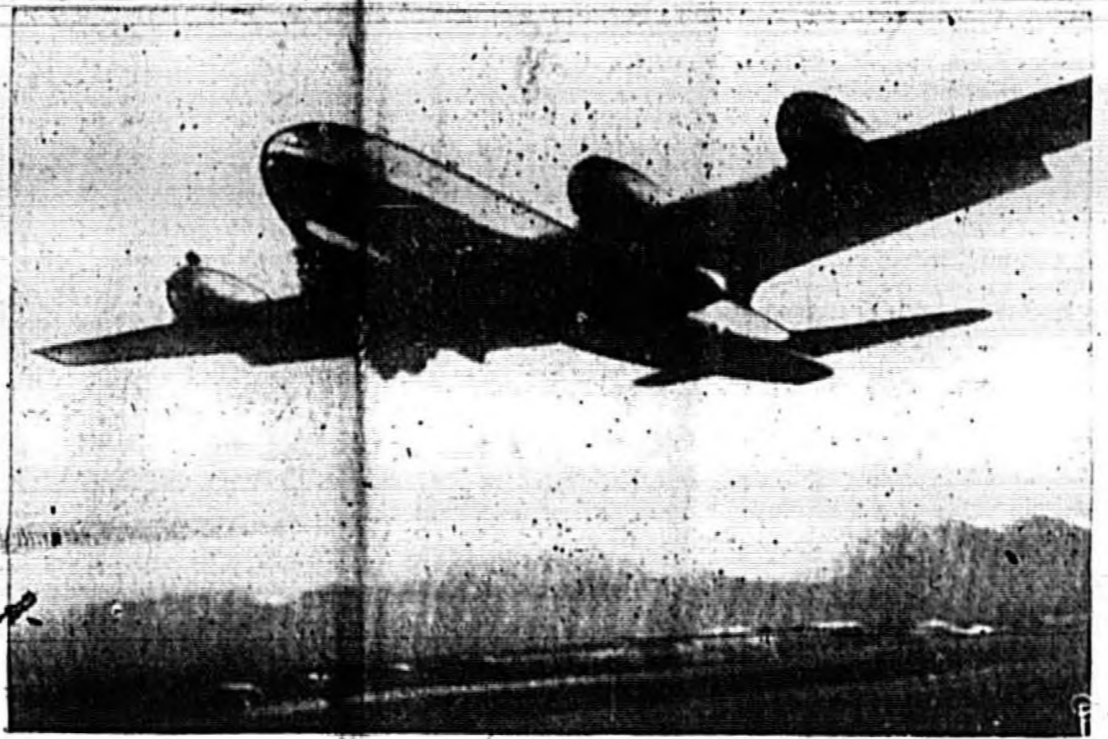
