Hiroshi Kato, 27, fishery expert, said today he saw a new eruption June 25 while conducting a survey about two miles north of the Bayonnaise.

"At about 4 p.m. The Bayon naise suddenly shot up two water columns 20 yards high and several other columns of 2 to 3 yards high followed," he said.

President Eisenhower has spoken out against the practice of confusing issues about important legislation by attaching "riders" to important bills. A rider is often a measure which could not be enacted if it stood alone but which is attached to an important bill generally favored in the hope that it will slide into law on the momentum of the latter.

Several necessary bills are now tied up in Congress because riders pertaining to segregation have been attached to them. As might be expected, southern members of Congress oppose these bills and they are in danger of not being passed at this session.

At issue here is not the question of segregation. What is important is the question of whether legislation on segregation should not be considered and debated on its own merits.

The use of riders enables a minority faction to defeat a bill simply by attaching to it a rider which is unacceptable. Quite often the rider is only remotely concerned with the legislation to which it is joined.

use of riders is a way of frustrating the will of the majority and in principle this is intolerable in a democracy. Political strategy and parliamentary tactics in pressing for a desired end are understandable, but legislation by trickery is not.

Stand Of The Quakers

The fact that Quakers do not believe in fighting does not mean they are lacking in courage. The Quakers of Plymouth Meeting, Pa., for eight years stood up for their librarian, Mrs. Mary Knowles, whose discharge was demanded by such influential organizations as the American Legion and the Daughters of the American Revolution. These in perfect sincerity attacked the librarian on the ground that eight years ago she had worked at a school now on the Attorney-General's subversive list. The Plymouth Meeting Quakers believed in Mrs. Knowles, and refused to yield to the clamor.

Now the Ford Foundation has recognized the bravery of these Quakers, and has awarded their group \$5,000 to make up for contributions stopped under local pressure. The Foundation does not reflect on the sincerity of the objectors, but commends the Quakers' SAM DAWSON courage for not yielding to opponents so formidable when a moral issue seemed at





No Reply Offered By Coast Guard

NEW YORK (P) - A radio message relayed to the Coast luard said today a fishing boat with 21 persons aboard was sinking off the New Jersey coast. Seven hours later no trace of the vessel or survivors could be found, indicating a possible hoax.

Asked if the message and a hoax, the Coast Guard would only say they were proceeding on the basis the messages were authentic. The first message reported tha boat had struck a mysterious object, caught fire and began to sink. A subsequent message reported survivors were being taken aboard a submarine which was "not an American."
