## Man who died after struggle identified

CASSELBERRY - Authorities have identified a 40-year-old Casselberry man who died Tuesday of an apparent heart attack after sheriff's deputies tried to subdue him and sprayed him twice with pepper spray.

Josef Jacob Kirshenbaum of 600 Georgetown Drive died about 6:50 a.m. Tuesday. He had complained earlier to a neighbor that he was having a heart attack, and then told rescue personnel that he had been smoking crack cocaine. When the paramedics tried to subdue him, Kirshenbaum fought them off.

After Kirshenbaum took one of the deputy's nightsticks, he was handcuffed and the paramedics worked on him again. but he died.

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement is investigating.

# **George: Trying to stay** a step ahead of the devil

CASSELBERRY - There is someone like Mark George in most neighborhoods. Someone who demands to be heard. Someone prepared - perhaps to wrestle the devil.

Clearly, Mark George is a force.

This summer he led the Citizens for Decency drive that led to getting the Public Decency Ordinance referendum on the Nov. 3 county ballot. At the same time, George began his run for Seat 1 on the Casselberry City Commission.

Should the voters agree with George, not only will he have helped to scrub nude dancing in the county and have a big say in Casselberry government, he also would emerge as a curious figure countywide. Some think he'll next make a run for the county commission.

George, 41, is one of the associate pastors at Community United Methodist Church in Casselberry. He emphasizes the word "Community" in the church title. He grew up in the community, went away for awhile, but has come back to be a community leader.

Appalled at the existence of nude dancing clubs in Casselberry and in the county, George wants to fight the adult entertainment business with one glove as a pastor and the other as a city commissioner. He says the opposition paints him as 'A radical, right wing conservative - totally out of the mainstream."

# Hurricane could bring area floods

SEMINOLE COUNTY Though Central Florida is not directly in the path of Hurricane Georges, county agencies remain on alert. Residents should also take the necesprecautions, officials nary said.

National Guardsmen are being assembled throughout central Florida, including Sanford, to support disaster relief efforts around the state. Athletic fields and back yards have been turned into middy swamps, suitable only

for ducks and those lucky enough to have waterproof sliocs, Hotels in the area are filing

up quickly with those who are evacuating from other areas. As of 3 p.m. Thursday, there were about 200 rooms available throughout Seminole County. Those rooms were going fast.

Terry White of the Marina Hotel on the lakefront in Sanford said "they are full at least through the weekend." The hotel is charging evacuces a special lower rate, she udded.-

John Blackwood, manager of the office of emergency management for Seminole County, said he believes most of the evacures in this area are coming from the west coast of Florida, especially the Tampa Bay area.

Blackwood added that four evacuation shelters, at Lyman, Lake Mary and Winter Springs high echools and at English Estates Elementary School, and one special needs shelter at Highlands Elementary School are scheduled to open as soon as they are needed. A pet-friendly shelter will be open at Sanlando United Methodist Church in Longwood.

"It's just plain yucky out here," said Krevil Lang, who was walking though Fort Melion Park with his five-year-old son Trevor on Thursday afternoon.

He said they had gone to Liberty Park on Country Club Road in Lake Mary only to find the low-lying park almost obscured by water.

"It was pretty flooded," Lag said. "I haven't seen it like that in a couple of years."

# Woman not guilty in drowning deaths

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS - Two small girls drowned in their back yard pool a year and a half ago, but Thursday a judge threw out an aggravated manslaughter charge against the mother of one of the children.

Circuit Court Judge O.H. Eaton said the case was a waste of taxpayers' money and a potential nightmare for grieving parents statewide. He called the proceedings off, saying there was no reason for 22year-old Rachel Reed to present her defense.

Reed, who works as a topless dancer, had been charged with the deaths of her 20-month-old daughter and her roommate's 3-year-old daughter.

Prosecutors said that Reed had fallen asleep, but were unable to convince Eaton that this was a crime. Had Reed been found guilty, Eaton said any parent who was ever hurt or killed because of a moment of inattention could be put on trial.

Michele Hall, the mother of the second victim, was not pleased with the judge's ruling and said she did not think "people should walk away from something like this." An officer for the Altamonte Springs Police said that Hall - not Reed had been warned twice that the children were wandering the neighborhood on other occasions.

Similar warnings were given both women from a state childwelfare investigator, and this said Assistant State Attorney Stewart Stone made Reed's unintended nap a crime.

Defense attorney Don Lykkebak said that the prosecutors had singled out Reed because of her profession. (Michele Hali also worked as a topless dancer.)

Wolfinger denied Reed's occupation had anything to do with the deaths. He said his office would continue to be "very aggressive" in cases of this nature.

## **Melissa's story**

Editor's Note: The last part of this story was inadvertently omitted from the Sept. 24 edition of the Seminole Herald. It is reprinted here in its entirety.

SANFORD - Melissa is 23years-old and pregnant with the child of a man who was shot to death 12 days ago. Her hazel eyes are still wa-

lering.

She isn't sure what she is going to do and what is to become of the child who has no daddy.

"Every day there are more and more WIIYS, more and

more WHAT WILL WE DO'S." Melissa said.

Melissa, who asked her last name not be used, was engaged to Paul Kafka, a 23-yearold who was killed in his car on a Saturday night in the Washington Oaks section of Sanford. Maurice Williams, a varsity football player at Win-ter Springs High School, ad-mitted to police that he shot Kafka. He is now in custody.

When Maurice walked up to Paul's car and killed him, not only was Paul's life destroyed but so were all of his friends, family and loved once." Meliasa said. "How can a boy, 17, be so thoughtless and uncaring to be able to decide to take another



## Cleaning uniforms can be a challenge

When the ball's in play, a clean uniform is the last thing on anyone's mind. But, once that final whistle blows, those dirty uniforms come in from the field and off the court to confront their next challenge; getting clean.

The best cleaning method depends on the fiber content of the fabric, the type of soll and the color-fastness of the dyes. Synthetic fibers, including nylon, polyester and spandex, are commonly used to create fabrics that are washable at high temperatures.

However, because the dyes used for athletic uniforms are often water-soluble, fading or dye transfer during washing may be a problem. To avoid this, read and follow instruc-



tions on garment care labels. Frequently, a cold water wash is recommended because higher temperatures may cause the colors to bleed. To prevent bleeding, it's also best to avoid soaking the items for long periods of time. If a damp garment cannot be cleaned immediately, hang it to air dry. Mud, grass and perspiration are common cnemies of clean athletic uniforms. Before treating these stains, test the removal procedures in an inconspicuous spot on the garment.

For mud stains, let the garments dry and then brush off as much of the mud as possible. Pre-treat with a preterit product, a paste of granular detergent and water or a liquid laundry detergent.

For grass stains, pre-treat with a product containing enzymes. If the stains remain, launder with a bleach that is safe for the fabric.

For perspiration stains, apply a pre-wash stain remover or rub the affected area with bar soap. If the fabric color has changed, treatment de-

pends on the age of the stain. For fresh stains, apply ammonia; for old stains, apply white vinegar. Rinse thoroughly, then launder. If the stains remain, wash in a product containing enzymes or oxygen bleach.

Athletic uniforms should be dried at a low temperature. A high temperature may cause shrinkage and permanent wrinkling. When dry, remove items from the dryer and hang them up to help prevent permanent wrinkling.

**Tired of Struggling** 

Dear Tired. Maybe we can help you to work a little less hard and get better results in your parenting. First, let's deal with hitting (beating/spanking) as a solution to a child's misbehavior. It doesn't work. When a parent hits his/her child, it sends the

wrong message. It tells the child that it's OK for bigger people to be physically aggressive with smaller or weaker people. While time-out for BRIEF periods (not more than 30 minutes under any circumstances) is appropriate for a 6year-old child, unless a calm discussion of where the child went wrong either precedes or follows it, the child usually feels that the parent is getting even with him, and so the score is settled. The next time your son has a

tantrum, try these techniques: 1. Look or move away from him. Do not honor his misbe-

havior with your attention. 2. Do not speak to him while the tantrum continues. Maintain a neutral expression and attitude until the tantrum ends. 3. If you feel he may be in danger of harming himself or others, hold him in a "harness hold" until the tantrum ends.

When he is not misbehaving, make extra efforts to praise him, smile at him, tell him you love him and are proud of him, make eye contact with him, touch him in positive ways. Be sincere and don't wait for his behavior to be perfect before using these techniques.

Contact the school counselor and ask for a referral to a parenting support group, as well as about the school's opinion on whether mediation might be appropriate for your child.

### DEAR JUDGE RAAB: Glad I could help. I agree, the original letter is worth a reprint:

DEAR ABBY: I am a self-supporting single parent and recently was out on a date with a "fun" guy. He handled his beer just fine. I left him at 1 a.m. to drive home, knowing I'd had enough wine to necessitate caution while driving.

I was concentrating on being a careful driver when a light started to flash behind me. I pulled over, and the lady officer gave me the field sobriety test, read me my rights, took my driver's license and handcuffed my hands behind my back. I remember telling her that i was a professional and asking if I had to go through all that. She said I did.

I was driven to the police station in a police car. The officers were very courteous. I was given a Breathalyzer test. My rating was .13 — the legal limit is .10. I was fingerprinted and ticketed for DWI. There were no prior traffic violations.

I was not allowed to leave unless someone picked me up. (I didn't want to tell anybody.) I said I'd stay the night, but the officer strongly discouraged it, so I called a friend to pick me up at the police station at 3 a.m. (It was terrible having to call my children and explain why I needed my friend's phone number.)

While I waited, I was locked in a cell like a common criminal. When I arrived home, it was time to go to work. I was required to report my arrest! It was humilisting to tell my work administrator.

I chose to retain an attorney for \$1,000 to walk me through the legal process. I was completely without my driver's license for 30 days, and I was allowed to drive only to and from work for the next 60 days. Because the alcohol content was below .15 and there was no previous record, I was given special consideration such as the work permit, and the mandatory time in juil was counted as the time I waited in jail for my ride home. I was lucky.

My car insurance more than doubled for three years, and it will be seven years before I qualify for the less expensive rates. This experi-

## Treating gout with Zyloprim

DEAR DR. GOTT: For years I have been taking colchicine for gout. Now my doctor has prescribed Zyloprim to prevent acute attacks. He plans to get a flushed feeling and I'm hot all stop my colchicine after three months, but I continue to have painful joints. Is this an appropriate strategy?

DEAR READER: Gout is caused by an accumulation of uric acid crystals in the joint spaces. Until Zyloprim has had a chance to block the formation of such crystals, you can develop gout attacks. Therefore, you may have to continue the colchicine until the Zyloprim has reached maximum effectiveness, because the colchicine will relieve the acute symptoms.

Ordinarily, Zyloprim and colchicine do not interact. Therefore, I believe that simultaneous use of the two drugs is entirely appropriate.

To give you related information, I am sending you a copy of my Health Report "About Gout." Other readers who would like a copy should send \$2 plus a long, self-addressed, stamped envelope to P.O. Box 2017, Murray Hill Station, New York, NY 10156. Be sure to mention the title.

DEAR DR. GOTT: Please give me Information about myelofibrosis. I have been told by my doctor that it is very rare and that I have to have blood transfusions periodically because there's no other treatment.

**DEAR READER: Myelofibrosis is** an uncommon disease of the bone marrow, characterized by the formation of scar tissue that interferes with the production of infection-fighting white blood cells, called neutrophils.

As a consequence of the disease, the body is forced to call on secondary, less efficient sources of blood cells, notably the spleen and liver. Put simply, myelofibrosis causes a lowering of the white blood cell count that is not compensated for by blood-formation in sites other than the bone

Some specialists consider the ailment to be a form of bone-marrow cancer; the condition is often seen in patients with leukemia. Hodgkin's disease and bone-marrow damage (from radiation or chemicals such as phosphorus). However, myelofibrosis may occur without an obvious cause.

It typically is associated with enlargement of both the spleen and the liver. No universally effective therapy has yet been developed. **Transfusions** provide temporary respite by supplying the vital blood that the patient lacks.

In my opinion, patients with myelofibrosis should be under the care of hematologists, specialists in the diagnosis and treatment of blood

DEAR DR. GOTT: My doctor prescribed niacin to lower my cholesterol level. However, every time I take it, I over. Is this dangerous?

DEAR READER: On the contrary, flushing is a recognized and predictable consequence of niacin therapy. You can reduce the strength of the reaction by taking an aspirin tablet with the niacin. Or you can simply put up with the symptom, which will ssen after several weeks of therapy.

DEAR DR. GOTT: On occasion, you have suggested to readers that they flush out-dated or unusable medicines down the toilet. Won't this contaminate the water supply?


**DEAR READER: Once dissolved**, drugs quickly decompose in septic


fields and municipal sewage treat-

ment plants. Such discarded medications are very unlikely to reach a drinking-water supply. In my view, this is a non-problem.



## Palmetto Ave. Baptist; growing with a vision

SANFORD - Members of Palmetto Avenue Baptist Church. located at 2626 Palmetto Ave., recently celebrated a ground breaking for a proposed Fam-ily Life Center. This facility measures some 11,200 square feet downstairs and another 3,200 square feet upstairs. Over 300 people gathered for this special time.

"The tacility will certainly be a blessing to the church school, Liberty Christian

We are really excited about this. We would like to buy the property across the street and put the sanctuary there in a few years. We really must work swiftly to negotiate that.
