The property owners also contended that they pay property taxes, and will, in addition, have a tremendous financial burden for any temporary im-

It is equally logical to expect that this phase will mass and be properly taken care of. But what is not to be overlooked at this time is the urgency of creating some way to relieve the pressure which traffic is making and will do so in even greater degree in the years ahead as east-west traffic is bottlenightmarish confusion which surrounds Orlando.
