Flood of Letters Gets Congress in State of Jitters

 WASHINGTON, Apr. 15. (WV)—The other night I sat across the table from a man who is considered one of the great news editors of these turbulent times.

"Aside from the big battles on this front or that," he said, "the biggest stories of the month and probably the next are those which concern extravagance, waste and chiseling on the part of labor, management and government."

"Why? Because letters, telegrams and editorials from you and your fellow Congressmen (a few months away from election in the whole House and part of the Senate) in a fine state of jitters. No one who has been around Congress very long is going to be too much perturbed about a deluge of mail on any specific issue. It's easy to arouse the pressure groups without arousing the real voters in ordinary times. A lobby for some cause gets hot up about some pending legislation. The word goes back down the line until it reaches the little people, and they write their Congressmen.

Ordinarily the Congressmen thumb through this mail, answer it (just for fear it might be a voter), make some notation of it in the Congressional Record, and unless it assumes headway proportions, go on about their business.

This time it's different. In the first place, it isn't determined that any of the mail demanding economic, an end to fooding, or a punishment—through new laws—of labor and management who also cut the war production line, is coming from any of the old organized pressure groups.

The flood of letters has come from the south and southwest and this sectional source has caused some Congressmen to demand an investigation. People have seen something in their own states and Oklahoma and a few other states have been most responsive in their demands for a clean-up of the labor-management squabbles and the wage and hour problems, the same can't be said for the complaints against the Office of Government Reports; the NYA, the CCC; and congressional pensions, to mention just a few.

Important enough to be included in the Congressional Record, with demands from their respective states that the Federal Bureau of Investigation, six such letters as (1) From a big defense contractor holder in Connecticut that he is receiving so many government orders for military and government agencies that it takes 50 percent of his time to answer them; (2) From a mail order business that near Trinidad, Ariz., millions of board feet of scrap lumber, owned by the government, had been burned up in government agency orders, while hundreds of citizens nearby secured the countryside for mosquito and other brush to combat their shortage of fuel and keep them from freezing to death. It has been a long time since this country was aroused to such a extent by the writing of its Congressmen. That fact and the nearness of election has a lot of them jumping when the postman only rings once.

215 Japanese Ships Have Been Sunk Or Damaged In Battle

Nips Claim Capture Of Bataan Forces; Corregidor's Guns Still Blast Away

WASHINGTON, Apr. 14. (AP)—Against huge odds, the beleaguered force of American and Filipino troops are reported as holding the Japanese at bay in the southern Philippine island of Cebu. The enemy is unable to push their way inland despite their possession of tanks and dive bombers.

WASHINGTON, Apr. 14. (AP)—Prying on the enemy's vital supply lines regardless of peril has accounted for approximately one-fourth of all the 215 Japanese ships sunk or damaged since the war began. Naval observers are quick to note the new commander-in-chief of the Pacific fleet, Admiral Chester W. Nimitz, an old pig-boat man, has United States submarine successes mounting since he supplanted Kimmel.

Imperial Japanese headquarters today claimed the capture of 40,000 prisoners from the start of the Bataan campaign to last Sunday. The communique said the prisoners included 12 generals, 5,100 United States troops and heavy war booty. But Corregidor's guns continued to blast at Japanese ships and land concentrations along Bataan's coast.

A late War Department communique yesterday reported that American-Filipino patrols carried out another daring raid in the southernmost Philippine island of Mindanao, this time putting the torch to eight Jap food warehouses near Digos.

Recently, a similar raid resulted in destruction of 22 enemy warehouses. The newest sorties occurred in the towns of Serib and Tamayud.

There is still no communication between Corregidor and our troops in Bataan and no reports of casualties in this area have been received for several days.
