### Pitcan wins spelling bee for second time

For the second consecutive year, Yannik Pitcan, a student at Tuskawilla Middle School in Oviedo, has won the Seminole County Spelling

# **Voters reject 'boss mayor'**

By 2-1 margin, city residents voice favor for city manager

SANFORD - By a landslide margin, Sanford voters rejected a proposal to change how the city operates.

In all but one district, the "no" votes heavily outweighed the "yes" votes. The final tally was 2,083 "no" votes to 894 'yes" votes.

Overall, 2.977 residents casts votes. That's 665 more votes than in the March 2001 mayoral election. In fact, almost as many people voted against the proposal, 2,083, as voted in the

2001 mayor's race, 2,312. "(The total vote count) was precisely what we predicted," sald former Mayor Bettye Smith, who was co-chairman of the "No Boss Mayor" committee that opposed the amendment to change the city's govemment from a city manager form to a strong mayor govern-ment. "We predicted 3,000 votes."

"It was a win for the people of Sanford," Smith added. "The people sent a strong message that our current form of government is the best possible government."


Current mayor Brady Lessard proposed the amend-ment to the city charter and was joined by two commissioners to put the question to the voters.

"The Committee for Better Government is thrilled this was on the ballot and the people got to decide," Lessard said. "The people have spoken. I think the one thing that has come from this is that we have tattooed

accountability on City Hall."

Lessard said city officials will Immediately conduct a national search to fill the city manager's position vacated by former city manager Tony VanDerworp's resignation in January.

"We are prepared to start the search (Wednesday)," Lessard said. "Now it's time to make sure this form of government works as well as it can."



# Baseball great Buddy Lake dies

SANFORD — Buddy Lake, one of Sanford's great sports heroes who once pitched a 19-inning shutout, died late Sunday, March 2, 2003. He was

A memorial service has been planned for 2 p.m. Saturday, March 15, 2003, at All Souls Catholic Church.

Though remembered most for a Florida State League game in 1947 where he pitched 19 shutout innings and hit a game winning home run, his overall

winning home run, his overall play stands out amongst the city's fine baseball tradition.

"I don't care how many of our young people get to play in the major leagues or win World Series rings," Commissioner Whitey Eckstein said, "Buddy Lake will always be Sanford's premier baseball player."

Strong words considering they come from the father of David Eckstein, shortstop and sparkplug for the World sparkplug for the World Champion Anaheim Angels, and especially since Lake never made it past spring training in

made it past spring training in the major leagues.

But in his long minor league career as a pitcher, and switch-hitting outfielder and thirdbase-man, Lake made a significant mark on the history of Sanford. And he did it at a time, during the Great Depression and World War II era, when the town so badly needed it.

"Those of us still alive will never forget what Buddy Lake gave us," said Doug Stenstrom, former Sanford politician and longtime friend and neighbor of Lake. "Buddy gave us so much to look forward to, we all wanted play baseball like Buddy

Bernard David Lake moved with his family to Lake Monroe while he was just seven months old. At the time Sanford had a team in the first incarnation of the Florida State League, and

# Statewide employment growth slowed in 2002, study shows

the Florida Agency for Workplace Innovation shows the state grew by just 43,400 jobs in 2002.

That may sound like a lot, but Florida is used to much more.

"As a percentage increase, that's very small, +0.6 percent," said David Marks, president of Marketplace Advisors, Inc. in Orlando, an economics consulting firm that is recognized as one of the leading experts on town centers and downtown districts.

Worst hit were the Ft. Lauderdale MSA and Brevard MSAs (Metropolitan Statistical Areas), Marks said. Both lost jobs during the year, 4,400 in Broward and 3,400 in Titusville, Melbourne and Palm Bay.

The Miami and Tampa-St. Petersburg region topped the

> Some employment sectors showed more strength than others, Marks said.

Construction employment was strong, and while typical construction jobs are short-term, solid sector growth means steady paychecks and that's good for the economy. Other sectors didn't fare so well.

"Retail employment in Florida has been a real downer," Marks explained. "Florida lost 7,100 retail jobs over the past 12 months. The Orlando MSA lost 1,800 jobs, and this was largely due to a slowdown in the number one tourism market in the

Marks said you have to look

statistics to find the good parts.

"Some of the retail employs ment categories show growth, Marks said. "The most obvious sector is building materials. Home Depot and Low's have been expanding statewide, and that shows in the figures.

Florida gained 2,200 retail jobs last year in the building materials sector.

"What we are seeing is steady evolution of retailing. There's a lot of consolidation going on, and while we used to see many retailers with different specialties, now we,re seeing one or two retailers like Wal-mart that sells everything under the sun under one roof," he said, adding, "that means more sales but fewer workers overall.

"We continue to lose jobs here year after year to foreign mar-kets. Florida lost 13,900 manufacturing jobs last year, Orlando lost about 1,400 jobs."

# 'Kool-Aid' sentenced to 10 years

SANFORD - Sanford-resident James Arthur Clinton was sentenced to 10 years in federal prison followed by five years supervised release last week for possession of a firearm by a convicted felon.

Clinton, or "Kool Aid" as he is called on the streets, was prosecuted as part of Operation Cease-Fire, a gun violence prevention program which partners federal and state prosecutors with federal, state and local law enforcement.

"By prosecuting Mr. Clinton in the federal system, we have assured the community he vic-

timized of at least 10 years of protection from him," said Seminole-Brevard Attorney Norm Wolfinger. "He was indicted and entered a plea in less than 60 days, providing Seminole County with some of the quickest justice we've ever experienced. This is one of the most important facets of Operation Cease-Fire."

Clinton, who has several prior felony convictions, was arrested on Aug. 4, 2002, outside Buzzard's Roost, a club located at 2921 S. Orlando Drive in Sanford, He was indicted by a federal grand jury on Sept. 11, 2002, and entered a guilty plea to the charge on Oct.

Operation Cease-Fire is the local network developed by Wolfinger's office to coordinate Project Safe Neighborhoods activities with the U. S. Attorney's Office and law enforcement, such as the Sanford Police Department which effected Clinton's arrest. Sanford officers Hector Aviles and Allan McCoy, along with others, pursued and captured Clinton after he pulled a gun on a bouncer at the club.

In addition to moving cases through the federal system quickly, Operation Cease-Fire cases can, in some instances, garner stiffer prison terms.

# Oviedo girls handle Lake Mary to earn first state trip

OVIEDO - The Oviedo girls basketball team proved once and for all that it has reached the level of state power. Saturday night on their home floor, the Lions methodically rallied from a big first quarter hole to beat tournament tested Lake Mary for the third time this sea-son, 41-35, to win the Class 6A-Region 1 Championship and earn their first every trip to the State Tournament.

Oviedo (28-4), ranked No. 4 in the state poll, will take on Palm Beach Lakes (23-7), a 44-33 winner over Palm Beach Gardens (21-6), on Thursday at 8:30 p.m. at The Lakeland Center. In the other half of the 6A bracket, two-

The two winners will meet for the state

title on Saturday at 7 p.m.
Oviedo had been operating in the shadows of the Rams and Winter Springs the past couple of seasons, but the young Lions stepped up to the plate this season and were even ranked No. 1 for a week in the middle of the season.

# SCC softball team off to record start

WINTER HAVEN - Big things may be brewing at Seminole Community College.

The Raiders' softball team of coach Courtney Miller have been a on a tear, setting a school record for consecutive wins to open a season and most wins in a row.

SCC opened the season by winning 15 games in a row and the biggest victory was No. 15 as the Raiders outdueled Mid-Florida Conference rival Lake City Community College, 3-2.

Both teams came into the game at 14-0 and SCC can now truly consider itself a national power after playing the multi-time national champion virtually even the past two years.

The Raiders finally tasted defeat for the first time in the very next game as Santa Fe Community College knocked off the flat locals, 2-0, in an M-FC tilt.

But SCC got right back to its winning ways, going 4-1 and finishing third in the Polk Community College Tournament in Winter Haven over the weekend.

The Raiders are now 19-2 on the season and well within striking distance of the school record for wins (48) in a season with a month and a half still to be played.

SCC was to have hosted Central Florida Community College from Ocala in an important M-FC doubleheader on Tuesday before heading to Jacksonville tomorrow (Thursday) for another big M-FC doubleheader with Florida Community College at Jacksonville.



# SCC baseball wins fourth straight

AVON PARK - After seeing its record fall under .500 for the second time this season the Seminole Community College baseball team finally broke out of its scoring slump and has now rolled to four victories in a row.

The Raiders' most recent win saw them pound out 22 hits in a 21-2 thrashing of South Florida Community College (3-12) in Avon Park.

David Timm (3-1) earned the pitching victory with six strong innings of work, giving up two runs on five hits while striking out eight and walking none.

Sanford's Uriah Kimmig worked three scoreless innings of relief to earn the save.

The SCC offensive attack was led by a monster 5-for-6 output from Oscar Malave'. Dan Quartararo, Courtney Propst, Mike Hnytka and Sanford's Chris Krall each collected three hits with Propst blasting his third home run of the season and Tyson Malik launching his first homer of the season, a three-run shot.

The Raiders were struggling at the plate as they dropped their sixth game in eight starts, 3-1, to Indian River Community College on February

John Madden (2-1) was touched for a pair of runs, one earned, in the first inning but settled down to allow only one more run over the next seven innings and left the game after giving up two earned runs on four hits, striking out six and walking one over eight innings.

But his offensive mates let him down as they could not score until the bottom of the ninth inning despite collecting eight hits.

The lone run came on a Propst homer. Ben Sprague, Malik (double), Quartararo, Sean Greear, Hnytka, Matt Matheson and Devin

Williams had one hit each. SCC then faced its first out of state program this season and got healthy in a hurry.

Taking on the Community College of Baltimore County at Catonsville, Maryland, the Raiders cranked out 13 hits, seven for extra bases, in rolling over the Cardinals, 15-0, in seven innings.

Tryo Beall (1-0) got his first victory of the season, giving up no runs on five hits over five innings. Kimmig worked the final two innings, giving up one hit and striking out three.

Offensively, Krall, a freshman from Seminole High School, had his first big game of the season, going 3-for-4 with his first collegiate double and first home run, scored two runs and drove in

What will make the outfielder's blast even more memorable is that it was a grand slam that came during a nine-run fifth inning.

Greear also had three hits, going 3-for-5, with a pair of doubles, two runs scored and two RBI. Also contributing were Donnie Brukhalter (2-

for-5, fifth home run of the season, two runs, four RBI), Quartararo (2-for-5, double, run, RBI), Malik (2-for-5, two runs, RBI), Matheson (1-for-2, his first home run, three runs, three RBI), Kevin Kotch (two runs) and Malave' (run).

SCC then completed a sweep of the doubleheader with Quartararo supplying most of the offense in a 4-1 victory.

The sophomore second baseman blasted a pair of solo home runs, his second and third of the season, to lead a six-bit attack. Propst had a double and scored a run, while

Burkhalter singled and scored a run, Winter Springs' John Michael Howell singled in a run, Malave' had a single and Greear drove in a run. Freshman Brent Morse (1-0) was the winning pitcher, giving up two hits and one unearned run, while striking out four over five innings. Trent



Lake grew up-watching it before eventually playing for the team following his graduation from Seminole High School in 1930.

In 1933 at just 19-years-old, he got his first taste of pro ball with Harrisburg, an affiliate of the Boston Brayes in the New York-Boston Braves in the New York-Penn League. He pitched 11 innings in his debut, giving up 13 hits, seven walks and seven runs while striking out three en route to a loss. But he would settle down after that, winning 15 games that season, and found himself in spring training with the Braves a year later, playing alongside an aging Babe Ruth.

He never did catch on with the

Braves, and three years later moved on to Albany. In 1937 he developed arm trouble that forced to leave the game and return to Sanford for a two-year period.

He made his return to baseball in 1939 with the St. Augustine Saints of the second incarnation of the Florida State League, and won 16 games. Still, his bat proved so potent that they turned him into a full-time outfielder the next season and he lead the league in hitting with a .352 batting average.

After a stint in the Navy during World War II, he finished his playing career with Sanford Giants, a local team with the once again reestablished Florida State League.

It was while playing for them on July 19, 1947 that he blanked DeLand for 19 innings then beat them with a solo shot in the bottom of the 19th of the back-end of a doubleheader.

"He has been very generous to the museum," said Gary Taylor, Sanford baseball historian and museum volunteer. "One of the most significant things we have in the sports exhibition is the

original score sheet from that 19inning game. Julian (Stenstrom) had given it to Buddy and Buddy later gave it to the museum.

Taylor, who grew up hearing stories about Lake's athletic prowess, said Lake allowed the museum to tape many of his con-

versations with old ballplayers at vari-ous baseball functions in recent years. "As these old ballplayers die, a lot of this history gets lost, especially the minor league stuff," Taylor said. "You can find the major league stuff pretty easy, but a lot of the

minor league stuff is

hard to come by." Taylor said Lake's death leaves a void not only in the city's baseball community, but the Sanford community at large. Stenstrom agreed.

We never had anybody like Buddy Lake in Sanford," Stenstrom said. "And he was not only a great player but a true gentleman. We've lost a legend."

# **Charlie Youngers Finishes 18th** At Citgo Bassmasters Pro Tour

Sanford, Fl (Feb. 10, 2003) - Determined to work his way back to the Classic, long time Central Florida resident Charlie Youngers finished 18th at the CITGO Bassmaster Tournament at Lake Seminole, Georgia last week. This finish puts Charlie in 48th place in the overall Busch sponsored BASS Angler of the Year point system. He is also in the running for this year's CITGO Horizon Award, which recognizes the most improved angler based on last season's final results.

Charlie made a dream come true when he qualified and fished the Bassmasters Classic in July 200, after only two years on the pro tour. But he's had two disappointing seasons since then. "Last year I couldn't catch a fish in a bathtub," Charlie said.

This year is different. The 2003 season began with tournaments in Florida at Leesburg's Harris Chain, where Charlie finished 95; and Lake Okeechobee, where he finished 90. Respectable the new CITGO finishes; but with 175 anglers competing, the middle of the pack in his own back yard wasn't good enough for Charlie. So he went to someone else's back yard.

Conditions last week at lake Seminole were much like last year - cold and windy with rain. With the help of a Berkley Frenzy bait handed out at the tournament briefing, Charlie weighed in five bass at 13lb. 11 oz. the first day of the tournament, to take 20th place. On the second day conditions worsened and many of the anglers struggled. As the water got colder the fish moved deeper. Using 17lb. Trilene line, Charlie had faith he could pull fish from the deep, tangled roots of the thick stumps, and brought in four bass weighing 8 lb. 11 oz. At the end of two days he finished in the money, advancing to 18th place in a field of 175 competitors (only the top 12 anglers go on to fish a third day in

Bassmaster tournament format.)

Charlie's confidence is back and he's looking forward to the upcoming CITGO Bassmasters tournament at Toledo Bend, Louisiana, February 20-23rd. With a current overall standing of 48th, the road to the Classic just might be on Charlie's itinerary this season after all.

Charlie is a long time resident of Central Florida, living in Sanford with his wife, Deborah, who travels with him on the tournament trail.
