# A Study In How To Throw Away Millions Of \$\$

 MELBOURNE — Australia has learned some costly lessons in its purchase of the American F-111 fighter-bomber which is now scheduled to be delivered here in 1973.

Twenty-four of the planes were ordered in 1963, when the estimated price was \$112 million. The purchase has been compared to the costly building of the Sydney Opera House, which also has had many faults that have taken years to rectify and which is likely to cost about \$100 million because of the delay in getting the F-111.

Some cynics have dubbed the F-111 the "flying opera house." Even government ministers have been unkind. One said the plane could either be regarded as the world's fastest crop duster or the most expensive flying totem pole.

Responsibility for ordering the aircraft is attributed to Sir Robert Menzies, the former prime minister, now retired.

## California Crops \$2.2 Million Loss Is Laid To Freeze

RIVERSIDE, Calif. (AP) — Freezing temperatures the first week of January caused about \$2.2 million crop damage in the Riverside County area. Hardest hit were the Valencia oranges, which were just maturing when the Jan. 3-6 frost struck, said Robert Howie, Riverside County agriculture commissioner.

"We didn't find a good one," Howie said after inspecting several Valencia orange orchards. Preliminary estimates place the Valencia loss at nearly \$1 million.

Howie said one fourth of the Coachella Valley tangerine crop was harvested when the freeze hit, but about 80 per cent of the remaining crop, with an estimated worth at about \$800,000, was lost. The Coachella area extends from near Palm Springs to the Salton Sea area.

Damage to the grapefruit crop was from minor to moderate, Howie added.

**Arson Trial Slated To Be Held Mar. 6**

Trial was set this morning for the week of March 6 in the case of Tommy Russell, charged in two counts of second degree arson and conspiracy to commit a felony. Russell is alleged to have ignited Meadows Marine and to have conspired with another man in giving him keys to break and enter Meadows Marine. Russell plead not guilty to the charges at arraignment this morning.

Trial is set for the week of March 20 in the case of David Mullis, charged with the Christmas Eve rape of his friend's fiancee. Mullis plead "not guilty."

Continued for two weeks is the arraignment of Mark Eklman, charged with the first degree murder of his wife.

Set for the week of March 6 is the trial of Herman Heidrich, charged in a two-count information with sale and possession of a hallucinogenic drug. Also set for March 6 is the trial of Robert Bowen, charged with breaking and entering with intent to commit a felony. Both Heidrich and Bowen entered not guilty pleas.

A special public defender will be appointed for Richard Goodall, charged in five separate informations emanating from his arrest on a number of stolen property charges in a "bust" of a large scale county-wide theft ring spearheaded in the burglary of homes and business establishments. Goodall is charged in 13 separate counts in the informations.

A special public defender also will be appointed for Aubrey Tappan, charged in only one two-count information. James Puckett, also allegedly involved in the ring, plead not guilty to the charges, and trial date will be determined later.

## Lake County Promises Support For More SR 46 Improvements

A Sanford delegation representing the Greater Sanford Chamber of Commerce traveled the maligned and often times thought to be "mired" SR 46 to Mt. Dora last night to a meeting with that area's chamber directors and members.

The purpose of their meeting was to discuss ways and means of aiding in the widening and repaving of SR 46 from the Wekiva River to U.S. 441. (This end of the artery is presently under construction from the Wekiva to the I-4 Interchange.)

Lake County Commission Chairman Tom Windron set the mood for the conference by stating that their county commission was unanimous in planning this at the top of their roads priority list, and "we'll pick up our obligation by buying the rights-of-way."

Windron said that additional assistance was needed in helping to "find the key to unlock some of the Tallahassee doors" in getting this project resumed again.

He added that this same stretch of road was approved for the '70-'71 State Department of Transportation budget for four-laning but at the last moment was advised that Federal IV Funds were no longer available. "We've offered to lend the state some of the necessary funds from our reserve secondary road funds budget (which is over \$1 million in Lake County) but the state was only willing to borrow one-half the amount and have Lake County donate an equal amount."

Windron refused, stating this would be a bad precedent to establish, not only for his county but would involve all other counties by their action.

Lake County Engineer Fred Harbison estimated that it would cost over \$500,000 for the rights-of-way to eventually make this a four-lane road into Mt. Dora.

Sanford Mayor Lee Moore suggested that other involved areas should be invited to a forthcoming joint meeting probably to be held in Sanford the second week in February. This portion of SR 46 is important to completion of a much-needed direct route connecting I-75 with I-95.

Sanford Chamber Executive Director John A. Spolski recommended Department of Transportation Secretary Edward Mueller be invited to this meeting and reminded those in attendance of the excellent cooperation offered by Mueller and his staff towards the needs of Seminole County. "I'm certain that if we can show a united front, Secretary Mueller would be cooperative in helping us to attain our goal."

Also representing Sanford, this meeting in addition to Moore and Mayor Lee Moore, President A. K. Shoemaker, Robert Dashu, Vernon Mix, Harold Kestner and Herald Associate Editor John A. Spolski.

## City Tract Is Open To All Bidders

Sanford City Commission's action Monday throwing open the sale of a 14-acre city-owned lake-front tract to all interested parties was a move that has attracted considerable attention.

Estridge said at least two other sites as alternatives are under consideration in the event the Seminole Boulevard property, adjacent to The Herald, is not available.

Estridge said his group plans to construct 240 apartments and option contracts to prepare the site might run \$146,000 or more.

City Commission will allow each prospective bidder to make his own bid and bring to determine how much to offer for the property.

Since then at least three other groups or individuals have indicated desiring to purchase the property.

The first group, consisting of I. E. Estridge III, James Rhiner, Cecil Tucker II, Walter Gilmore and Douglas Stenstrom, indicated immediate use of the property with a \$1.5 million apartment project.

As far as is known other offers to the city have been mostly speculative, with no announced intention to improve the property in the near future in order to allow return of taxes to the city.

Apparently the City Commission has taken this into consideration by the imposition of certain ground rules or stipulations that must accompany all purchase proposals. These include: Price offered for the property; property use; starting and completion date of any project; value of the project to be constructed; and city reserving the right to accept or reject all bids.

A 10 per cent deposit will be required to accompany each bid proposal. The city will not pay a commission to a broker handling the property sale.

Estridge told the Commission Monday his group has a good loan interest rate, but if the project is delayed more than 15-20 days that the commitment might not be available for that particular site.

'Honest Mistakes'—Urgency Of Welfare Programs

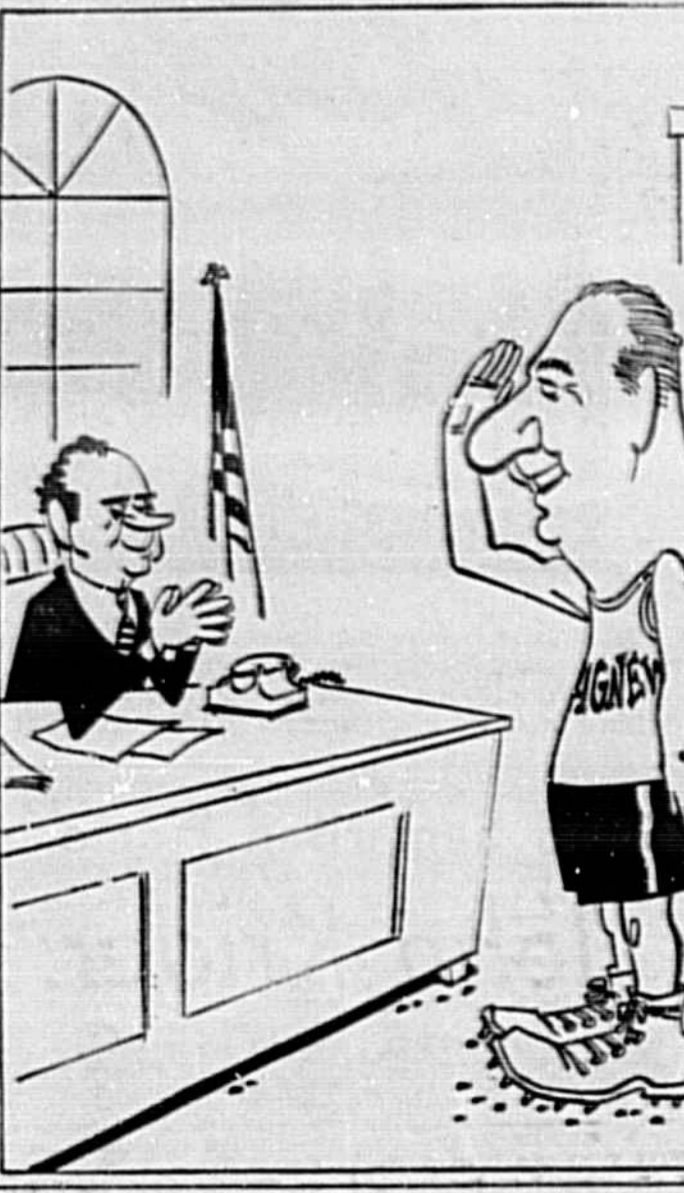
A study by the federal government indicates that about 700,000 Americans are ineligible for the welfare benefits they receive.

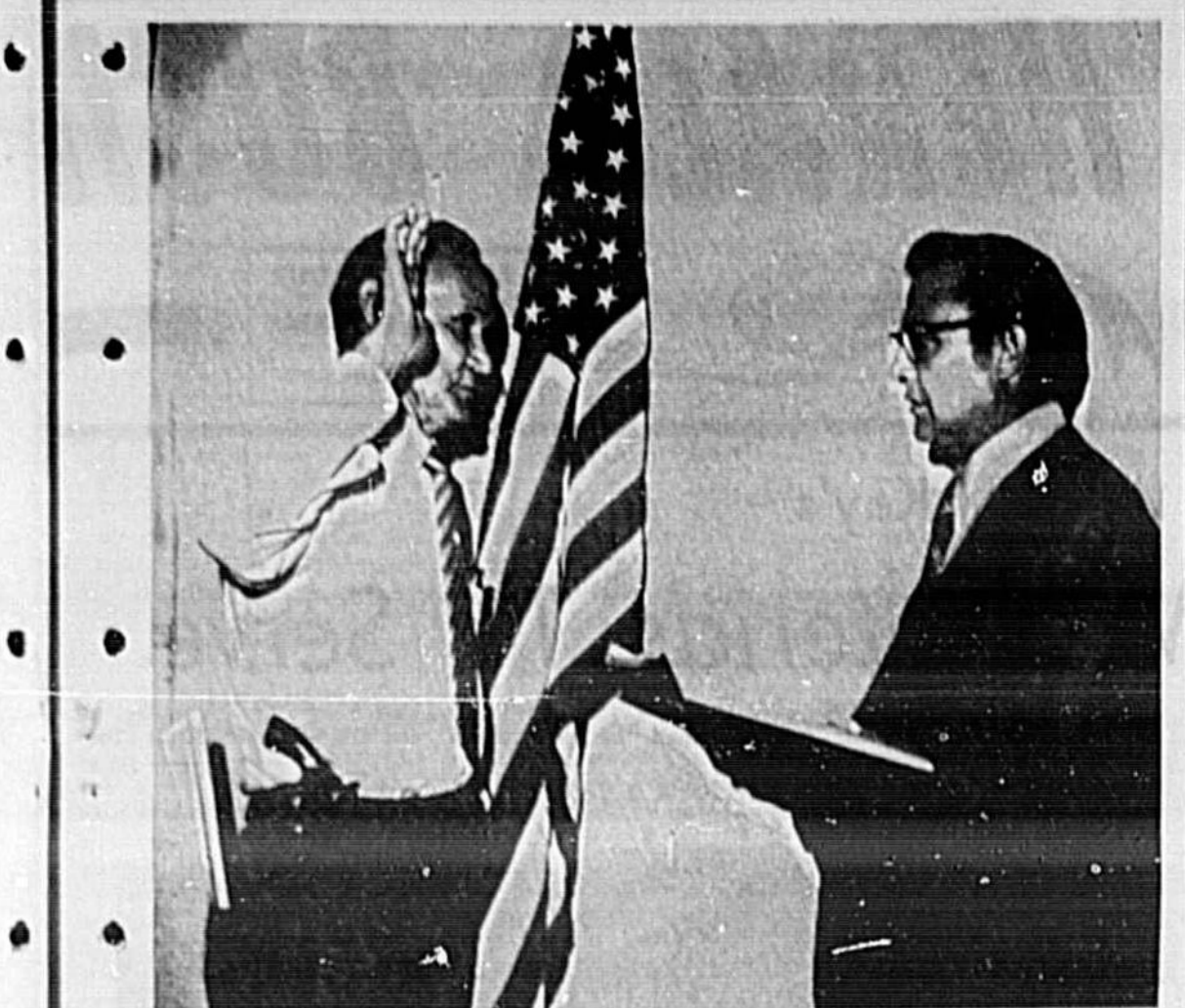

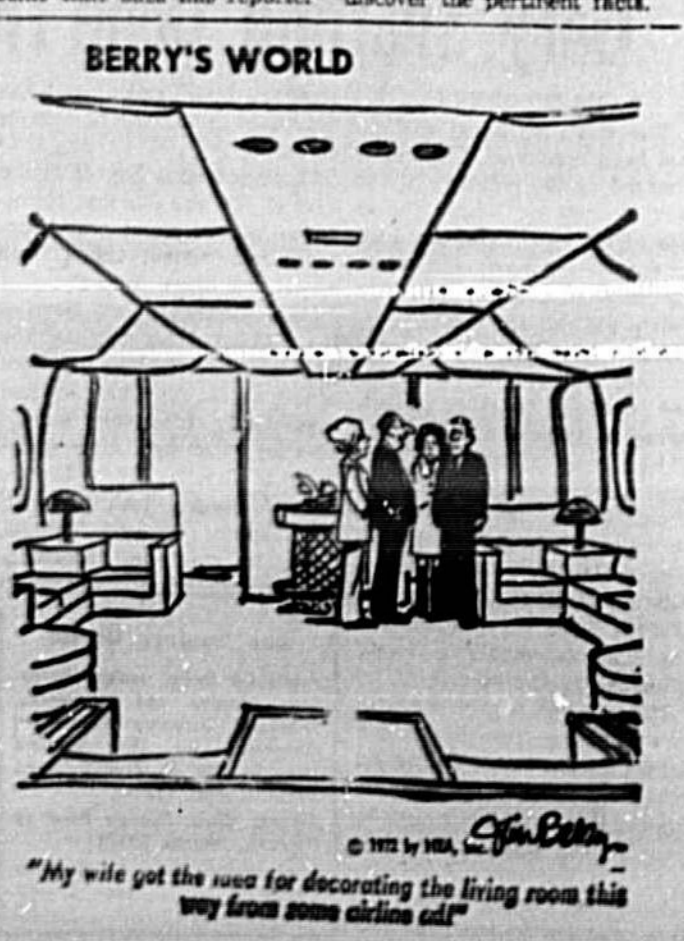

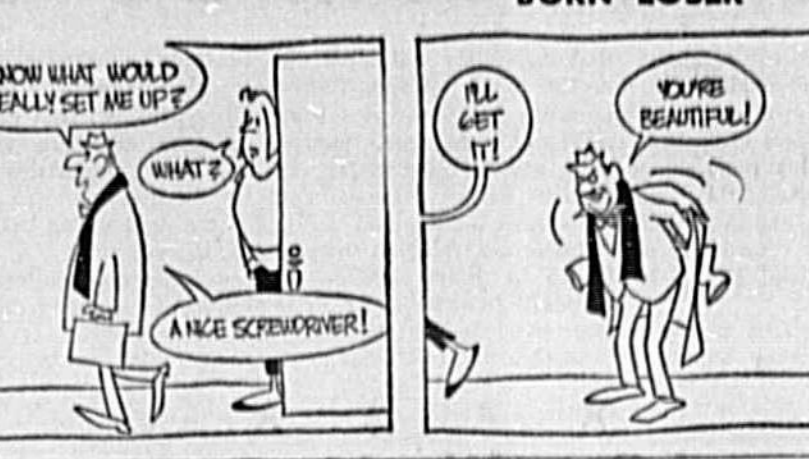
