Herndon Leads Squad To 40-33 Victory Over Old Rivals

Coming from behind by taking advantage of every break, Seminole High scored a 40-33 victory over the Orlando Tigers, Big Ten opposition, in a fast basketball game played here last night.

It was the ninth victory in 14 starts for Seminole, and it was the greatest of the season, coming as it did over a traditional rival.

Semotional spring by center O. P. Herndon who turned in 15 points was a feature of the game which saw Seminole find itself after a first quarter battle in which the Tigers held the lead, 16 to 11.

Herndon made eleven foul shots in 12 attempts and sank four three point goals during the evening, several of the field goals being long shots.

The Tigers presented a smoothly working attack at the start but it faltered toward the close of the game and after Seminole took the lead, 21 to 18 at the half, the Tigers never were able to penetrate a tight defense set up by the victorious Seminoles.

In forward Hagar and center Hayward the Tigers presented two of the most capable players seen here this season, while during the early part of the game guard McGuffey performed ably.

For Seminole it was nearly all Herndon, although every player in the game scored one or more points except Charlie Robinson, J. W. "Hot" Altman turned in his usual fine game as did Leslie Harnage and Jack Hughes, the latter returned to form after an illness.

Oliver Miller's eight points made him second high Seminoles scorer, while Earl Whitten picked up six points in the last quarter.

Seminole held the Tigers to two points in the second quarter while it was making 10, while during the third quarter, scoring was about even, Seminole racking up 10 points to the Tigers' nine.

A feature of the game was the sharp-shooting of Forward Hagar, who, given seven free shots, sank every one for a new local record of straight free shots.

A second feature found Earl Horator of the Tigers in an attempt with Referee Bob Lockett Lockett accused Horator of an infraction at the end of a play.

The 20 points taken by Seminole last night brought its season record to 221 points in 14 games against 823 points scored by the opponents.

O. P. Herndon is far and away the team's best individual score having racked up 101 points this season. Other scorers: Whitten, 67; Altman, 66; Robinson, 59; Miller, 29; Hughes, 28; Pearson, 20; Harnage, 15; Pardon, two; Cornell and Phillips, one each.

During the 14 games, Seminoles players have had 139 personal fouls called on them while their opponents were penalized 177 times for personal fouls.

Seminole players have attempted 209 free shots, completing 95 of them, and they have attempted 62 field goals, completing 144 of them.

The squad leaves here early Friday for Lake City where it will meet the Lake City squad that night, Saturday night the team plays at Tallahassee, and next Tuesday it plays at Deland.

The next home game comes on Thursday when the Laysons team plays here, while on Saturday Feb. 16, Seminole meets the strong Landis team of Jacksonville on local courts.

Huey Stages Show Before Legislators In Georgia Capital

Long Explains Share The Wealth Plan He Wants Okeyed

ATLANTA, Feb. 7.—Senator Huey P. Long entertained Georgia legislators and a packed gallery yesterday with a suspending-expanding exposition of his redistribution of wealth program.

The Louisiana Kingfish, nattily attired in a purple shirt and blue tie, pushed back his double-breasted grey coat to snap his red suspenders in accompaniment to a hearty chuckle in the Georgia house of representatives for their "audacity in inviting me here."

Then he launched into his "share the wealth" speech, which he ought to be making in the United States Senate, but I've already made it there five or ten times.

Long explained how he'd limit incomes by drastic taxes on 207 things over a million dollars, scaling up to 100 percent on the ninth million. He'd redistribute the money by building and maintaining better schools and colleges up that everybody could get a good education. And he'd give everybody over 60 years old a pension of \$20 to \$40 a month. This would remove the old men from industry and give the younger men a chance.

The Kingfish had a simple solution for the farm problem. Every farmer would be allowed to raise as much as he could, the surplus to be stored in government warehouses. When a two years supply was laid up the farmers would quit farming for a year to build roads, and schools and more warehouses.

The New Deal came in for frequent attacks. A wrestling match thwarted Long's desire to speak to a big crowd at city auditorium last night. He increased his audience by arranging a radio hook-up. The State house chamber, normally seating 100, was jammed with 1200 people who filled every available space in the aisle.

The Kingfish's onslaught was suggested here by Congressman J. Elliott, who went to grammar school with Long in Winfield, La. "Wasn't your father a Baptist preacher?" Long asked Elliott.

"Yes," the congressman replied. "I remember him well; he was a damned good preacher," said Long.

Long continued his journey toward the State house chamber, where he had nothing to say about the troubles besetting Louisiana in Louisiana, as he had just returned from a tour of inspection in 1934.

Long's central work in the State house is one of duties which will insure public health and safety.

Celery Committee Adopts Procedure For Emergency

(Continued From Page One) when the truck starts rolling. A crate means a standard Florida crate with inside dimensions 10 by 20 by 22 inches.

The Control Committee is to meet on Wednesday prior to the proposed pro-rate period, and if it is considered advisable, to establish the period, all shippers and independent growers are to be notified at once and by not later than 9:00 o'clock Thursday morning. All notices must be confirmed by the shippers or growers, and each must make application for an allotment before 9:00 o'clock on Friday morning.

Field committees will examine each block of celery described in the applications for allotment on Friday.

The Control Committee then shall meet at 2:00 o'clock on Saturday to again consider the advisability of establishing the pro-rate period. If the period is ordered, the committee shall determine the percentage of available celery available to ship, and shall pass on the estimates of the field committees on each individual application for allotment.

The secretary of the Committee shall apply the percentage to the available quantity to be shipped by each shipper or grower, and advise each as to the number of crates he may ship during the week.

No celery may be shipped during the pro-rate period unless an allotment is issued covering it, and no allotment will be issued unless application for it is made to the Control Committee in accordance with the rules.

For the purpose of verifying estimated yields, the state is to be divided into five sections—East Side Sanford, West Side Sanford, Ocala, Manatee and Sarasota, and average outside these sections shall be allocated to the most convenient sections.

Each section is to be in charge of a member of the Control Committee appointed by the chairman and the member is to appoint a committee of not less than two members each, of growers, shippers, farmers, or other qualified persons, who shall advise the Control Committee.

Mrs. Henke's testimony was to the effect that Flech was poverty-stricken when he sailed for Germany and had to borrow money. Her "yes" was in answer to prosecution questions bearing out this fact.

Nettily was marching forward with his witnesses, getting an order, connected story into the record. Somebody saw Flech in the restaurant; somebody else saw him casually put a \$5 bill off a thick roll of currency at the corner of Sixth Street and Broadway in New York City.

And then along came Gerta Henkel. Her appeal had arrived in this trial at last. Love and money are said to be at the roots of most crimes, but as Attorney-General W.C. Clegg said in his opening statement, the matter for the Lindbergh kidnaping was nothing except "Money, money, money."




