



Conflict Of Interest-Two Views

Well, that "ol debbil" - conflict of interest - has surfaced again.

This time it is breaking into the open in two instances which are informative for every voter who is interested in the philosophy and the motivations which appear to be portrayed. One is in the request by Democratic Gov. Reubin Askew that all of his top appointees let

him see their personal income tax returns so that any conflict of interest may be prevented. The other is in the case of Republican U.S.

Senator Edward Gurney of Winter Park. An in depth study and report of the involvement of Gurney's law firm with work for the Florida Department of Transportation has been published by The Miami Herald.

When Governor Askew's move is put into perspective, the only logical interpretation is that this nationally known young Democrat is continuing to put into practice his concept of government as a public trust.

For this is a decision which is fraught with political danger. Conflict of interest is an issue which has exploded in the halls of Congress and even in the White House with reverberations which have ruined some careers and tarnished others to the point of no return.

Yet this is also an issue which has been allowed to fester in the body politic until the malaise of general disbelief and general distrust has weakened the strength of the whole.

The present primaries and the upcoming presidential election need to be cleaned of this miasma if the promises of the candidates and the platforms of the parties are to be honest and representative enough to deserve the confidence they should receive.

Governor Askew had heard the reports which had been current that some of his appointees were doing a sizeable business with the state and thus had been spurred into asking for the personal income tax returns, which would be treated with "complete confidentiality," to "avoid any circumstances that could lead to a

Nixon, Brezhnev Each Has His Bet

By RAY CROMLEY President Nixon is gambling the United States can stay three years ahead of Russia in the nuclear missile-sub-

marine-bomber arms race. He is betting, too, this country can so significantly upgrade its espionage techniques that American Soviet watchers can catch—early in their development—unexpected Soviet breakthroughs in such fields as laser, nuclear, space, undersea, radar and missile fuel and guidance technology.

Nixon adviser Henry Eissinger has another thesis, based on historical observation—that sometimes a momentum once lost can never be regained. This is true in war, in national expansion, sometimes in economic and scientific growth. It is also true, Kissinger believes, in an arms race of the magnitude of

Kissinger therefore believes that once the Soviet arms build-up momentum is halted, or slowed, even momentarily, and even if only in numbers, then important changes can take place in Russia. Counter pressures will

Rival claimants, other than the military, will be able to more forcefully demand a larger share of the rubles, raw materials and technicians, pressures similar to those which have been building up in the United States these

The Soviet Union's Brezhnev is betting, of course, that this agreement will bring the technical aid which will enable the Soviet scientists to catch up with their American rivals, both in military technology and in the application of computers and other advanced techniques to the management of industry and to the development of Internationally, Brezhnev is betting that the under

the Soviet Union's vast underdeveloped areas. developed countries will be so impressed by the numerical superiority allocated the Soviet Union in intercontinental missiles and ballistic missile submarines that these lands will be convinced that Russia is the world's number one military nation and most powerful country -and that communism is therefore the wave of the This psychology of ultimate victory is a major strategy

of the Kremlin in its drive for power and influence at home and abroad. Soviet Communist theory holds that peoples usually will turn for aid and support to that nation which is the acknowledged strongest or which seems to be.
That is, the Russians, like the North Vietnamese and

Chinese, are seeking a psychological victory, which in Marxist strategy is the basis for political victory. Nixon came to Moscow; Brezhnev didn't come to Washington. On paper Russia has more ICBMs or is allowed more, and is allowed more missile submarines. We have seen this desire for psychological victory elsewhere of late. It is for this reason that North Vietnam thus far has not been satisfied with a chance to control South Vietnam. Hanoi wants to psychologically publicly humiliate the United States and rub Nixon's nose in the mud and do the same for President Thieu's government

This is an essential part of victory. It would not prove that North Vietnam was stronger than the United States. But psychologically, by Marxist theory, it would advance the cause more than simple victory. It would make the people in the South more malleable and would establish the position of Hanoi in Southeast Asia and in the Communist and Third Worlds. It is in the same mode as Mao Tse-tung's thesis that it

is better to destroy one enemy division completely and totally, than to defeat 10 divisions. The psychological In the next decade we shall be able to see whether the Kissinger theory or Prezhnev's is closer to reality

Actually, they proved nothing, except possibly that civilized society is able to function not because there is a policeman on every corner, or in front of every statue, out only because the majority of people are decent and law-abiding and not insane. Suppose the Pieta had always been heavily guarded

There is no assurance that this would have prevented the attack. It might only have escalated the challenge to someone determined, for whatever reasons, to destroy the

Even if the madman had been stopped, it is obvious that complete protection cannot be given every statue, every painting, every fresco or manuscript in every church or museum, in Italy or anywhere else. Society simply has to depend in the last resort upon the basic

In both instances the wake from a passing boat, which failed to slow down for a smaller fishing boat, almost capsized the small boats, throwing waves over them.

Do we HAVE to have people drowned before this situation is corrected? Or can a few reminders to operators of high powered craft cause them take a hint and show a little more courtesy to fishermen on the river?

Lake Monroe seemed to be the hottest of the "hot spots" for bass the last few days. Don Carter and Mike Roberts teamed up Saturday morning to take their limit on top water plugs fishing around the shore line and were home by 9 a.m. The bass averaged from two to 31/2 pounds.

The seawall around the lake front has produced some good strings especially around the culverts, according to Jim Blythe of the Plaza Sports Shop. The Mepps Spinner has been the most consistent lure in this section. Jim mentioned that his father, J. M. Blythe, located three large bass fishing in Lake Norris with Lewis Dinkins Wednesday, "H oppie" Hopkins landed four on Thursday and five more Friday ranging in size from six pounds down. Blythe said to be sure to mention that "Hoppie" used his "trusty" fly rod and a yellow Hula Popper for this catch. (Could this be a local

Paul and Mrs. Johnson returned home to the Osteen Bridge Fish Camp Sunday after a months vacation in Texas. Paul failed to come up with any Texas size fish stories - said he didn't even take his tackle out of the car. Wally Songers who has been taking care of the camp while the Johnson family was away, had glowing reports of the bass fishing between Osteen bridge and Lake Monroe. Three high school boys fished this area from 3 to 6 p.m., and landed 30 bass in the last three days. A six and a seven pounder came in Sunday plus several limit catches made by other anglers during the weekend. Specks are still around the bridge, hitting on live Missouri minnows fished deep.

Don Smith at the Seminole Sporting Goods Store had reports of so many large bass caught on a fly rod this week he was almost afraid to mention it. Bruce Clarke out-lasted a 13 pounder and during the same week took others weighing 12, eight, six and five pounds. Mike Maples used his fly rod for seven bass then switched to casting tackle and a Devil's Toothpick lure to land three more.

Louie Garner found the bass willing to hit on a blue worm on the river near Blue Springs and ended up with five - total weight 20 pounds. A five pounder topped the string of 10 taken by A. C. Smith Sr. around Mullet Lake Park as he plugged with a Devil's Toothpick top water lure. J. W. Smith of Lemon Bluff didn't quite make his limit, only nine, up to seven pounds was his score and the lure was a grey spot.

George Cheney of the Wekiva River Haven camp listed several good catches of panfish and catfish, one of the best being made by the J. B. Simpson family. Fifty-two catfish made up a pretty heavy string for them.

Salt Water Fishing

Contrary to reports published in the fishing news of another Central Florida paper, Spanish mackerel are showing up close to shore in the Daytona Beach area. Many are being caught from the piers and surf fishermen were treated to a good run of them near the Old Timers Saloon between Daytona and Port Orange this week. Two different sources supplied this information.

Wayne Brady of the "Fishing Hole" tackle shop in Daytona had word of a catch of 50 pounds of trout landed from the high bridge north of Ormond by Elmer Snyder and another haul of 40 pounds of trout made by Jim Sullivan fishing at night from the Main Street Bridge. All were caught on Trout Tout lures and live shrimp. Snyder's catch had several nice channel bass included.

Bluefish and trout have been the best bet from the piers around Daytona but a new record for flounder was set on the Sun-Glow pier this week, a 14 pound, 10 ounce specimen. Trout fishing in and around Scottsmoor has been fine for several days, most of them being caught on the Devil Horse


We are finally near the end of our present road. Each and every one of us will soon be travelling down his own separate paths.
