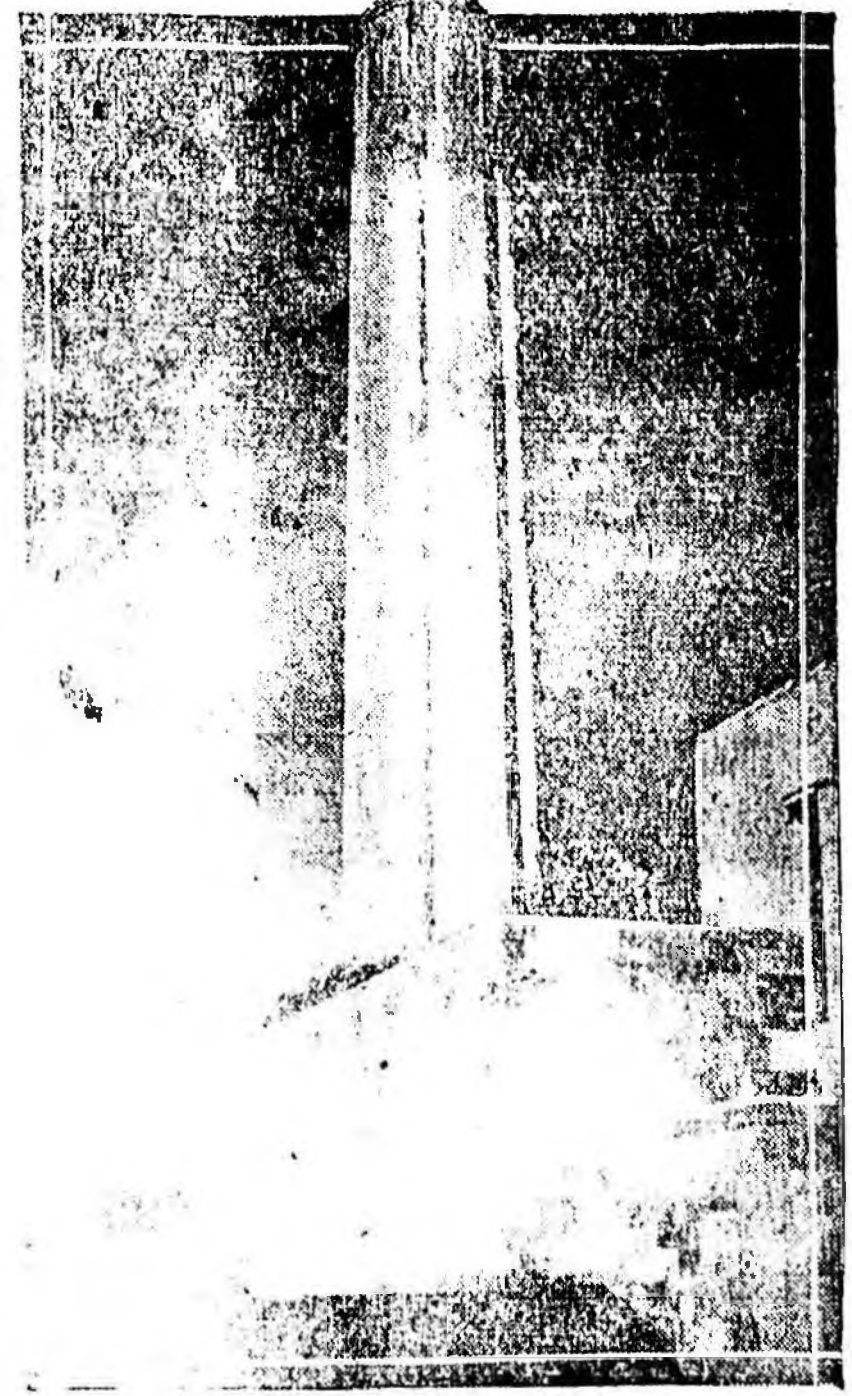

STRING TO START ROLLINS TILT

Moore Tells That Rollins Offer Tough Opposition Here

Is Only In Fair Condition

Florida Fans Will Get To See the Great "Phoney" in Action

Mercer Bears are traveling today bound for this state where the Bruins will tangle with the Rollins College Tars in the first event of a big Army-Navy celebration Thursday.

Rollins College Tars are expected to be in good condition for the game. Although giving the Purple Hurricane her hardest fight of the season in Greenville, S. C., Saturday, the following were either wholly incapacitated with injuries or played the game through sheer grit: "Phoney" Smith, tackle, right halfback, and center, right halfback, end, boil on ankle. FIGHTING CELERY FEDS HOLD THEIR LAST SCRIMMAGE

Sanford High School Squad Will Play Daytona Beach As Feature of Armistice Day Celebration Thursday

The Sanford Athletic field was the scene of one of the hardest practice football games ever staged this year, Tuesday, as Sanford High's "Fighting Celery Feds" held their last hard scrimmage before the game with Daytona Beach Thursday. Coach Wheeler has worked the boys up to their best form in preparation for the game which is expected to be one of the hardest on the schedule. The team is chock full of fight and the players are optimistic over their chances in the game with Daytona Beach.

Tuesday's practice started with a fast signal drill with over two teams in the field. Following this a practice game was played and several new plays used. The first squad displayed great strength both on the offensive and defensive and it was almost impossible for the second squad to gain. The running attack of the first squad was centered around Captain Thompson, Stodesbery and Mobley with "Moble Dick" Maxwell plunging the line for good gains. Maxwell is developing into a great line player and he will be a constant thorn to Daytona Beach in the game Thursday. Few teams in the state have faster runners than Sanford High has in Thompson, Stodesbery and Mobley, and when these three boys are given any interference at all they are good for constant gains.

The "Celery Feds" are also well equipped with defensive stars. Few defensive players are better than Mobley while Captain Thompson and Maxwell are not far behind them in their defensive play.

The line is also in far better shape than it has been and the boys are well prepared to give a good account of themselves against Daytona Beach. Sanford High has a strong forward wall and every boy is in shape to play the game of his career Thursday.

However, Daytona Beach must not be underrated for it has one of the best teams in their history and will doubtless be in good condition for the game Thursday. Daytona expects a hard fight from the Celery Feds and from all reports available is practicing hard for the game which will be the feature of the Armistice Day celebration in Daytona.

Big Ten Coaches Have Set Nov. 26 As Date When Schedules Will Be Drafted

CHICAGO, Nov. 10.—(AP)—Athletic directors and football coaches of the Western conference have chosen the eve of the Army-Navy game to draft the 1927 football schedules. They will meet here Friday, Nov. 20 and intend to witness the gridiron spectacle after arranging their names for next season.

Rumblings of new alignments among the traditional Big Ten opponents were heard today, the annual Chicago-Northwestern series being one which gossip says is likely to be broken. Illinois is ready to accept the place in the northwestern program for 1927 and the purple also are anxious to arrange a big inter-sectional game to fill their new double-deck stadium with its seating capacity of about 70,000.

A. A. Stagg, director of athletics at Chicago, remains silent on the reported break with Northwestern.

Chicago has an engagement with Pennsylvania to be played in the West in 1927, but it is questionable if Illinois and Pennsylvania will again meet next year.

The Michigan-Minnesota and the Indiana-Northwestern double-headers of this year undoubtedly will not be arranged for 1927, but the coaches do not want any more of the double-header games, provided it is possible to arrange schedules without them.

Although the Big Ten rules provide that each Big Ten team will play four games within the conference, John L. Griffith, commissioner of athletics, is opposed to the double-header idea and hopes it can be avoided.

Coach Rockne, of Notre Dame, who has been playing conference opponents and also beating them, hopes to arrange at least three games with Big Ten foes next season. Rockne will play the University of Southern California here giving, using the Soldier's Field as the battleground.

Rockne hopes to renew the contract with Northwestern. The games between the two schools have provided one of the high lights of the football season. Notre Dame also will play the Army next year and also may again engage Minnesota.

Coach Yost, of Michigan, has arranged to play Navy at Ann Arbor on November 12, next year, and will dedicate the monster new Michigan stadium, with its seating capacity of 75,000 with the Ohio State game on October 22, 1927.

In announcing that the Buckeyes will share in the dedicatory ceremonies, Yost set at rest rumors that an eastern eleven, probably Harvard would be asked to come to Ann Arbor for this game.

Purdue's showing against Navy although losing 14 to 17 makes it apparently certain that the Boilermakers will come in for its share of attractive games. Both Purdue and Indiana will go East to meet Harvard next fall.

WINTER PARK, Fla., Nov. 10.—(AP) (Special to The Herald) Coach Orr's charges completed their last strenuous scrimmage Tuesday afternoon when his varsity ran rough shod over two squads of freshmen.
