Railroad Retirement Act

Another bill recently signed by President Roosevelt, perhaps the last of his great legislative achievements, is the Railroad Retirement Act which sets up a pension fund for railroad workers who have reached the age of 65. An estimated 1,000,000 men are now in the employ of the railroads, and it is estimated that 1,000,000 more will be added by the act, a further explanation of its many provisions might well be in order.

Anyone who works for a "carrier," whether railroad, express company, or sleeping car company, or in the capacity of a trainman or office man, day laborer or while on work, comes under the provisions of this act. Any such person who has reached the age of 65 is automatically retired and is paid a monthly pension which ranges upward to a maximum of \$120 a month, depending upon the length of service, for the rest of his life.

The act limits various somewhat under certain conditions. By mutual agreement between both employee and employer the retirement age can be increased one year at a time until the employee is 70 but under no conditions more than that. Furthermore, any person who has had 30 years of railroad service can avail himself of retirement benefits even though he may not yet be 55 years of age. The amount of the pension varies considerably with the length of service and other conditions. As a means of computing a particular pension, the following explanation is furnished by Lee M. Eddy, in the current issue of Labor:

Multiply the first \$50 of your "average monthly pay" by 0.02, and the next \$100 or part thereof by 0.015, and from \$150 to \$300 multiply by 0.01. Average monthly pay is \$300.00. There is no count. Then add the three figures you got as above explained, and multiply this sum by your total years of service. That gives you the amount of retirement pay you will get each month.

Example—Mr. John R. Ralston worked 30 years for the "carriers." His "average monthly pay" was \$170. Then—

\$50 times 0.02 equals \$1.00
 \$100 times 0.015 equals \$1.50
 \$50 times 0.01 equals \$0.50
 \$3.00 equals \$3.00

Sum \$3.00
 And \$270 multiplied by 30 equals \$81 monthly retirement pay.

If you retire after 30 years of service when less than 65 years old, you will get 1-15 less retirement pay for each year you are younger than 65. For instance, if the above Mr. John Ralston retired at age 64, he would get 14-15 of \$81, or \$76.60 per month. However, if the carrier retires you for physical or mental disability, your retirement pay will not be reduced even though you are less than 65.

The pension fund will be raised through a two percent assessment against employee pay checks and a four percent assessment against the corporation payroll. Always the employer will contribute twice as much to the fund as the employee. In other words a worker receiving \$100 a month would contribute \$8 to the pension fund and the railroad would contribute \$8. Such contributions will be made on August 1 of this year, while the actual payment of pensions does not begin until February 1 of next year.

In the event of a worker's death before he reaches the retirement age, the amount of his pension contributions, plus three percent interest, is paid to his wife or other legal heir. In the event of death after retirement, whatever balance the worker may have in the pension fund, minus the retirement benefits he has already drawn, plus three percent interest, is paid to his wife or other heirs.

The federal government itself is custodian of the pension funds and is authorized to invest them in U. S. government bonds paying regular interest.

to the list of those who should honor a traitor by killing him." Two other names were tentatively added to the list of those in high places who lost their lives when it was reported that von Tschickly, personal adjutant of von Papen, had killed himself and George Strasser, once a leading Nazi organizer, had been shot.

von Papen's exact position was not clear, but it was considered significant that while he—the third highest in command in the Reich—was ordered to remain in his house, Hitler held a long conference with Dr. Joseph Goebbels, propaganda minister, and Hermann Wilhelm Goering premier of Prussia.

Meanwhile, Vice Chancellor von Papen, closest friend of von Hitler, was executed yesterday at Reichstag prison "as traitors." The determination of Hitler and his colleagues to carry on resistance was voiced in a radio speech by Dr. Joseph Goebbels, propaganda minister, in which he warned that those who conspire against the state are "playing with their own heads."

The fifth choice, according to persons in New York close to the administration, by Benjamin Franklin Paden, counsel for the Senate committee that inquired into the exchange practices and Frank Shaugnessy, president of the San Francisco stock exchange.

HITLER KEEPS IRON GRIP ON GERMAN RULE

Crown Prince Reported As Having Been Driven Out Of Germany To Holland
Today's developments in Germany: Chancellor Hitler in a special order put an end to extreme measures for the control of the "second revolution" announcing that effective July 1 all offenders against the party would be dealt with by regular courts.

The eyes of the nation were focused on Berlin where a cabinet meeting was in session. It was stated to accept the realization of Vice Chancellor Franz von Papen and to replace him with Hermann Wilhelm Goering, the Prussian premier.

From Amsterdam, a British news agency reported the former Crown Prince had been expelled from Germany and had arrived by plane at Bonn. At Berlin this was described as a "second revolution" announced that effective July 1 all offenders against the party would be dealt with by regular courts.
