

Only Slight Ray Of Hope Held Out For Two Pacific Fliers

One Report Says Airplane Was Sighted Landing Upon Small Island Off Coast

SEATTLE, Sept. 10. — (A.P.) — Ships from the coastguard cruised south of the Aleutian islands today hunting for the missing fliers Don Moyle and Cecil Allen but officers of the coastguard termed the search hopeless before they started. Two incidents remained to bolster convictions of a few who clung to the belief that the aviators are safe.

There was an anonymous message saying a large monoplane had been seen to land on a small island off the British Columbia coast. The other was a report from four passengers aboard the vessel Arthur J. Gildwin in the vicinity of Dutch Harbor, Alaska. They heard the drone of what sounded like an airplane between nine and ten thirty last night. The sound was heard coming from the southwest gradually dying away to the southeast. The fliers left Japan early Tuesday with a 47-hour supply of gasoline hoping to fly here. The gasoline supply couldn't have lasted longer than yesterday noon.

Moyle and Allen left Samushiro Beach, 375 miles north of Tokyo at 3:30 P. M. Monday (E.S.T.). They expected to get their wheels on the airport here in from 29 to 44 hours.

Neither flier had extensive experience as a navigator, and a slight miscalculation would have led them far from their course. They carried no radio, and if they landed in the water, they would be helpless. They had no food.

Last reported at Puleo Erino, Hokkaido island, 110 miles from Samushiro Beach, the fliers got into a promising start.

Although numerous ships along the Seattle-Oriental route failed to report the plane, hope was not abandoned until the fuel supply was known to be exhausted. Miss Frances Brunca, fiancée of Moyle, who flew up from her home in Riverside, Calif., to greet the fliers, reluctantly left the airport yesterday afternoon. She said she could no longer hope that the fliers would reach the goal in one flight, but was confident they had landed safely at some point along the route and would continue to Seattle without delay.
