#### Parents can report out of zone students

SANFORD — Public school parents can snitch on students who are attending schools to which they are not zoned with a new hotline set up by the Seminole County School Board.

The School Board monitors student enrollment to verify that only county students attend county public schools and that students comply with attendance zone and/or transfer policies.

Significant numbers of non-Seminole County students annually seek to enroll in Seminole County schools, according to a news release. The Out-of-Zone Residency Check Hotline, 407-320-ZONE (9663), is the most recent addition to the district's on-going efforts to ensure Seminole County Public Schools are populated by Seminole County residents who live in the school zone or who have received a Board-approved trans-

Parents or community members who believe a student is illegally attending a public school are asked to call 407-320-ZONE (9663) and provide the following information: Student name, school name, area or address where you believe the student is living, reason you believe the student is out-of-zone.

All information provided will be used to investigate the situation and will be confidential.

Families who relocate are advised to immediately report the new address to their student's school to ensure contact information is updated.

## NAACP seeks charges against auards

SANFORD — The Seminole County Branch of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People has urged State Attorney Norm Wolfinger to bring charges against two security guards who shot and killed a 16-year-old black youth in July.
"The NAACP is calling for a judicial

inquiry of this incident and that proper charges be brought against these security guards and that they be prosecuted to the full extent of the law," wrote Turner Clayton Jr., president of the Seminole County NAACP, in an Aug. 25 letter.

Seminole High School student Travares McGill was shot through the heart by one of the two security

guards at Country Lake Apartments. The guards said McGill tried to run them down in the car he was driving. The incident took place around 3:10 a.m. Sunday, July 17.

SANFORD - The downtown Sanford Community Redevelopment Agency held a town hall meeting Monday evening to discuss next year's budget and most of the discussion revolved around promoting events and

Due to an increased tax base to the city, the CRA will have about \$300,000 left over in its budget next year after \$368,000 is spent for loan payments, Fort Mellon Park, executive director costs, and operating costs. The CRA is also considering setting aside \$100,000 for contingencies.

Most of the crowd, which consisted of downtown business and building owners, and residents, wanted to see the CRA fund promotional events that would boost downtown customer traffic, such as Alive After Five.

"Is there any money for promoting Sanford?" Maria Shreve, of 1118 S. Palmetto Ave, asked.

Board member Jeff Triplett said that the CRA had discussed putting aside money for that specific purpose.

Parsell had suggested \$24,000 a month to assist Alive After Five, and other promotional events, but the board soon found out that the Art Asylum, a local group of downtown artists, felt the event needed \$39,000 a year to support it. The Art Asylum, who put on a spring art and jazz festival last year in downtown, also requested that \$24,000 be set aside for that event again.

The CRA had discussed in past meetings that they would be more willing to release some funds for both of those events, but wanted the downtown merchants to assist financially in the Alive After Five events.

According to Kim House, a representative of Art Asylum and a downtown business owner, she spent close to \$250 at each event in free wine and entertainment.

"Everybody's put in quite a bit," House said.

House also suggested that the city needed a Mainstreet again downtown, essentially an organization that would act as a mail manager for downtown businesses, help with promotional events, and could act as a liaison between the city and the business owners.

Parsell and the other members were supportive of having a Mainstreet again, but said that they could not fund it, but could possibly provide some seed money.

Audience members who wanted the CRA to fund Mainstreet said that most of the downtown business owners were in full time jobs, and could not volunteer to run a Mainstreet. House said that it would probably take \$75,000 to get it started.

The government can't do it all," Parsell said.

Board member Bruce McKibbin suggested that they look at starting one, but that the downtown merchants needed to make sure it had support from one another and the community before asking for money.

Theo Hollerbach, who owns The Willow Tree Cafe, said that there were 118 businesses associated with the old Mainstreet, and even if those businesses put in \$100, that would not come close to the costs associated with funding it. He said that especially a lot of newer businesses could not afford \$500 to \$1,000 a year in membership dues.

"I understand your job is to promote the CRA district," Hollerbach said.

"Not necessarily," Parsell said. baffled,"

"I'm totally Hollerbach said.

Parsell explained that the CRA's main charge was to improve and fix a blighted area, mostly relating to roads, streets, lighting, and other infrastructure problems.

Mayor Linda Kuhn stepped up to the podium from the crowd, to clarify. She told the crowd that CRAs are created by a state statue and that a lot of their money cannot be spent on promotions. The point of tonight's meeting, she said, was so that the CRA could come up with a plan for their money to decide what the most critical projects are.

Kuhn said that Mainstreet had to be supported by the community, not just 1st Street. Kuhn was the executive director of the old Mainstreet.

"This organization cannot fund a Mainstreet," Kuhn said of the CRA.

She suggested they start an organization on a volunteer basis, whether through the Art Asylum, or anyone else who is interested.

Kuhn also addressed the Alive After Five events and said that she felt this event needed to continue, and that it was not an event just for the merchants.

"Sanford has historically done things on the cheap," Kuhn said.

She urged the CRA not to do it that way for the Alive After Five events.

"We need to invest money in promoting our city. It needs to be funded," she said.

Kuhn also said that she knew that Art Asylum members Kim House and Denise Hurley had worked hard on putting numbers together to make it a good event, and that if House said they needed \$39,000 to fund it, the CRA could count that it was an fairly accurate amount.

Hurley told the CRA that September 8 of this year will be the last Alive After Five events until they can get it up and running again, which may not be until next year.

"We don't do sloppy work," Hurley said. "We can't do it with the money you've



## Hospital can treat sleep disorders

SANFORD — The Sleep Disorder Laboratory at Central Florida Regional Hospital in Sanford has been serving the community for seven years and is dedicated to diagnosing and treating sleep disorders which can adversely impact an individual's quality of life. An estimated 40 million Americans suffer from sleep disorders ranging from obstructive sleep apnea (OSA) and restless leg syndrome (RLS) to narcolepsy and insomnia.

Although society tends to view snoring as a humorous condition, the reality is that it can be a symptom of a sleep disorder and is no laughing matter for the chronically sleep deprived. The most common of these conditions is OSA, typically seen in 40 to 60 year old men and often characterized by snoring snorting and interrupted breathing patterns, leading to insufficient oxygen intake and a poor quality of sleep for both the patient and the bed partner.

Patients often complain of waking with dry mouth or a headache and have difficulty staying awake throughout the day. The treatment for OSA typically includes continuous positive airway pressure (CPAP) which involves wearing a mask while sleeping that delivers a stream of air to the throat to open the patient's airway.

According to Central Florida Regional Hospital neurologist Sam Shanmugham, M.D., board certified in sleep medicine, untreated OSA can have senous neurological and cardiovaccular commiquences

Yet, despite these significant risks associated with OSA, patients are reluctant to mention sleeping problems to their physician.

"For this reason, we are only seeing the tip of the iceberg when it comes to diagnosing and treating sleep disorders," says Karuna Ahuja, a pulmonologist on Central Florida Regional Hospital's staff who is also board certified in sleep

"It's an inherent problem that requires patient education to recognize treatable symptoms and physician awareness. Physicians should ask specific questions related to quality of sleep and then if necessary refer the patient for sleep studies."

A sleep study is a painless, non-invasive procedure that involves recording a patient's brain waves, eye movement, heart rate, muscle activity, breathing patterns, oxygen level and body positions while the patient is asleep.

Training and certification in sleep disorders is a key component to accurate diagnosis and effective treatment. Central Florida Regional Hospital's sleep lab has four registered polysomnographers who conduct sleep studies and three physicians, board certified in sleep medicine, who interpret the data provided by the technicians. "The sleep studies done at Central Florida Regional Hospital are very clean stud-ies," says Ahuja. "The technicans have been trained by the hospital's EEG crew, so the monitoring electrodes are applied exceptionally well. This ludge chiramete testimoral arti-

keeps the physician alert to new research in the specialty that can be related to other medical conditions. "For instance, in the pediatric population, there, is new research that associates restless leg syndrome and sleep apnea with attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD)," she says. "It's not that well known yet, but there is clinical data that shows if you treat the child's sleep apnea, more than half of those patients can come off the stimulants used to treat ADHD."

Great care has been devoted to creating a homelike setting that's conducive to sleep. Each room has a television, a dresser and a bathroom for comfort and privacy allowing patients to shower, dress and go to work after the study. The two rooms set aside for sleep studies are in constant use and according to director of cardiopulmonary services Donna Hayden, a registered respiratory therapist with a BS in cardiopulmonary science, plans are in the works to add two more beds in the next year. "Our patients are referred to us by family practice physicians, neurologists, and pulmonologists for comprehensive sleep studies. Using the study data and treatment recommendations, the referring physicians follow up with the patient,"

says Hayden. "We are only just beginning to understand the relationship between sleep and the brain says Dr. mechanisms, Shanmughma. "The specialty is still in its infancy, but in the near future, I predict that we will have better sleep disorder medgatures with fewer aide effects to offer our patients for an improved quality of his "



plaint said. Woodruff defeated

Mitchell in a close run-off election March 29 for the District 1 commission seat. Woodruff filed two complaints against Mitchell's campaign the day before on March 28.

Woodruff alleged that photos of people in a campaign newspaper ad run by Mitchell implied endorsement of the candidate. On Tuesday, Mitchell said he apparently did not have all the information to make that claim. He said he didn't know, for instance, that someone other than Mitchell had chosen the photos for the ad.

The second complaint centered on phone called made by Mitchell's campaign to voters. The calls were made to District 1 voters on March 27. The caller identifies herself as a mother who lives in the district. Woodruff maintained that the person did not exist.

Mitchell said at the time that the person did exist, but with the woman's permission, the campaign had an actor record the message using the person's name.

Mitchell said he supplied investigator Margie Wade with a statement by the woman, Pamela Martin Bryant, but it was not mentioned in Wade's report.

In fact, the staff investigation led by Wade recommended that the elections commission find probable cause on two counts of violating Chapter 106 of the Florida statutes.

One says that Mitchell failed to file a written statement authorizing a company to make phone calls\_for the campaign. The second violation said the advertisements showed people supporting Mitchell before he obtained written approval.

Mitchell maintained that he didn't get permission because the ad did not say the people in the photos with him supported his campaign. The ad simply

that he was showed involved in the community, Mitchell said.

He appeared before the elections commission and showed members the letter from Bryant giving him permission to use her name in the phone calls. He also told the commission his view of the advertisements.

Twenty minutes he left the commission meeting with both complaints dis-

They said the people in the ads were not even identified, how can that show support," Mitchell said Tuesday describing the elections commission meeting.

The case hinged on what Mitchell knew or was told about Chapter 106 of the Florida election law.

According to investigation documents, City Clerk Dougherty said she had given Mitchell a copy of the Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook and Chapter 106. Mitchell even signed a statement that he understood Chapter 106, but he maintains he was never given a handbook by Dougherty.

A campaign worker picked one up later on, but Mitchell gave it to his treas-

urer thinking it was information for him. me a handbook," Mitchell

wants to see something done about ensuring black candidates receive fair treatment by the city in elections.

Dougherty never called Mitchell to tell him about the requirement of having written authorization on file for someone to make phone calls on behalf of the campaign. Dougherty told investigators that she had made such a courtesy call to another candidate.

At one point, none of the candidates knew about having to file written authorization for phone calls made for the campaigns. Mitchell simply told the elections commission, "Who are the laws written for, him or me."

Mitchell said there is a history in Sanford of black candidates having their campaigns tampered with. He cited an early 1990s election where some absentee ballots were dismissed because signatures didn't match. The same signatures were allowed in the presidential election that same year, Mitchell said.

"I'm not going to be quiet about this," Mitchell said Tuesday. "I'm not going to be quiet until I get both of them to openly apologize to me." He referred to Dougherty and Woodruff.

"I feel I was discriminated against," Mitchell said. "We were not given the same courtesy."

Mitchell has maintained that he never willfully violated any laws. If he had he would be the first to say so, he said Tuesday.

"I definitely don't want a divided city or even a divided district, but I feel I'm due some respect," he said.

Mitchell vowed Tuesday that he would run again in 2008, the next year the District 1 seat will be up for election.

As this story unfolds, put yourself in the shoes of Susan's sister, Sara Perkins, 30, and Susan's mother, Bobbie Boyer, as they relive the story and explain the confusion, anger, sadness and emptiness, as the year of "first misses" comes to an end, and the reality sinks in that this devastation is real and the answers to their questions are elusive.

#### The Crime

Susan, who worked for a window tinting company, was helping a friend tint the windows inside her spa one evening near the Altamonte Mall at 626 Maitland Ave. in West the Seminole Professional Building. Bobbie and Sara said this was typical of Susan, who always lent a hand to family and friends.

A masked man entered the business from the front with a rifle. He demanded money from the two women, but when he found out that they had less than \$100 on them, he forced them to get into Susan's car, a red 2001 Ford Focus. Susan drove the car, while the robber had her at gunpoint, to the Washington Mutual Bank near the Altamonte Mall, and forced them to withdraw money from the ATM. The amount withdrawn was less than **\$**500.

He then forced both of them to get into the trunk. The car pulled out on the roadway and Susan knew where there was a trunk release. As they drove near the mall, the other victim waved her hands out the back of the open trunk.

The man, who Sara believes may have realized that the women opened the trunk, turned onto Boston Avenue, which makes a sharp turn into Orange Drive. The other victim jumped first from the moving car and rolled to safety, but Susan wasn't as lucky. She hit her head on the pavement when she jumped and went into

cardiac arrest while being transported to a trauma unit. She never regained consciousness. She died the next day.

From what Sara and Bobbie have heard from the other victim, the suspect held a gun on Susan throughout the entire episode.

According to the other victim, as retold by Bobbie and Sara, two cars went by and didn't stop.

"You would have had to drive around my sister," Sara said. "You would have seen her."

Two other people did stop, but the first person did not speak English and did not have a cell phone. The next person to stop called 9-1-1.

"If all that is true and people didn't stop, that is so beyond belief," Sara said.

The Altamonte Springs Police Department has not identified the suspect as of the one-year anniversary. The crime occurred on Tuesday, Aug. 31, 2004. The suspect has been described as a 5foot-11-inch black male, aged 18 to 24, and 170 to 180 pounds. He was well built, smelled of motor oil and had big eyes.

The Questions

Who was the suspect? Did he have a car, and if so, why did he make them drive Susan's? How could no one have seen anything at such a busy intersection before 9 p.m.? Why hasn't anyone come forward? What would the suspect have done if the women did not jump from

the moving vehicle? "That somebody did die like this, and she's my daughter, there's just so many questions," Bobbie said. "Nobody knows anything, except that she's gone."

Sara and Bobbie still hold on to hope that someone who may have seen something will come forward, whether it is the suspect, or anyone he might have told, or even a witness who may not have come forward yet.

Sara said she knows that sometimes people see something strange, and then wait to see if they read it in the news or see it on television. When they don't, they just other relatives. believe that it was nothing. According to Sara, there was very little coverage of her sister's death because the state was bracing for Hurricane Frances.

Sara said she wants the suspect to know that the family is not going to stop as long

"There aren't words you can put to that. Only people who have that close of a relationship can understand. It's a feeling. It's a bond," Sara said.

Susan's mother, Bobbie, said that it seems unreal that it has been a year since it happened. She said they were all just an average family, and that anyone is subject to this type of tragedy.

"Your life will never be the same again. You're never going to be the same again," Bobbie said.

Sara's hope is that people connect to this story on a deeper level. She said she remembers seeing a story in the news and feeling temporarily bad for the family. But, then she was back to her own life. She hopes that this isn't another instance where people think for a moment, "How tragic", and then move

Sara said the more people who hear this story, the greater chance of finding someone who may have seen something that night.

Now, Sara and her mother struggle to get through the days. Sara claimed that not having her sister there to talk to is surreal.

"I want to pick up the phone. My automatic reaction when something happens is to call Susan," Sara said. "It's such a feeling of confusion. Who do you talk to?"

Sometimes it is unbearable for both of them, and Sara cannot imagine what the rest of her life will be like without her sister.

#### Resolution, Not Closure

The women are still pressing for media coverage on the death of Susan Perkins, and after writing numerous letters, Bobbie has gotten her daughter's case on the America's Most Wanted Web site, www.amw.com.

Anyone with any information, however small, is encouraged to call the Crimeline at 1-800-423-TIPS. They are offering an award up to \$5,000 for information that leads to an arrest. Callers can remain anonymous. The incident occurred on Tuesday, August 31, several days before Hurricane Frances last year around 9 p.m. at night. They were in the Washington Mutual Bank around 9:10 p.m. If you saw anything suspicious that night in any of the areas mentioned in this story, or if you have heard anything about this robbery, please contact Crimeline.

Sara said when she speaks in front of the camera or to other people about her sister's death, they always tell her how strong she is. She said she may appear strong on the outside, but she isn't on the inside.

"I'm doing this for her, because she can't stand up for herself," Sara said. "I want answers so bad, but that's also a double-edged sword. There will never be closure. but there could be resolution. It could bring peace to us, but there can't ever be closure. How could there? There never will be."



Even though quarterback Steven Moffett was a sophomore in 2004, the Winter Park native put up decent numbers in his first year as a full-time starter under center.

In comparing Moffett to UCF all-time great Daunte Culpepper, their numbers were very comparable in their first year as a starter. Culpepper, the starting quarterback for UCF during his true freshman season in 1995, averaged 188 passing yards per game in the Golden Knights' final season as a I-AA member. Moffett averaged 172 passing yards per game and completed 64.2 percent of his passes, the third best single-season mark in UCF history last year.

Moffett also totaled two 300yard passing games to one for Culpepper.

Lake Howell's Brandon
Marshall returns to wide
receiver this season after
spending much of last year at
defensive back because of the
injuries. The 6-foot-4, 230pound senior, who will be
wearing No. 6 this year, had a
good spring a pre-season camo
and will be one of Moffett's
favorite targets this season.

One of the biggest questions for the Golden Knights will be how to replace all-time leading rusher Alex Haynes? UCF will

look to several players to fill the void of Haynes, who graduated last December and is now in training camp with the Baltimore Ravens.

Perhaps the biggest surprise of preseason camp has been the play of freshman tailback Kevin Smith. The Miami native has been sensational, showing excellent athleticism and the ability to break the long run in camp. With terrific agility and speed, Smith has shown he can run in-between the tackles and also break a run to the outside. Even more shocking, Smith did not play tailback his senior year in high school at Southridge High School in Miami. Smith played defensive back as a senior, but rushed for 1,125 yards and 15 touchdowns

as a junior for Southridge.
Junior Dontavius Wilcox is
the starter at tailback after a
solid spring and preseason
camp.

Jason Peters is another running back who should see significant time. Peters is the starter at fullback entering the season. He was ranked by some media outlets as the No. 3 tailback in the junior college ranks last season.

South Carolina begins the 2005 season with the return 39 letterwinners from last year's 6-5 team. The Gamecocks welcome back 11 starters - four on offense, four on defense and three on special teams - as head coach Steve Spurrier begins his first season at the helm.

South Carolina sophomore rover Ko Simpson was named a first-team preseason all-conference honoree by the Southeastern Conference

Simpson was joined on the preseason all-SEC squad by offensive tackle Na'Shan Goddard, who was a secondteam selection, offensive tackle Jabari Levey, who was recognized with a spot on the third team and kicker Josh Brown, who also garnered third-team honors.

Widely recognized as one of the top safeties in the country this preseason, Simpson comes off a freshman season in which he led the SEC and ranked third nationally with six interceptions. He also recovered three fumbles and scored two defensive touchdowns in 2004.

Spurrier, who has coached a national championship team, won seven Southeastern Conference titles, and won nearly 78 percent of the college games he has coached in, begins his first season as head football coach of the University of South Carolina. Spurrier was introduced as USC's 32nd head coach on Nov. 23, 2004, before an overflow news conference crowd in the south end zone of Williams. Reice Stadium.

Williams-Brice Stadium. Spurrier has compiled a 142-40-2 (.777) won-loss record during his 15 seasons as a major college head coach. He led the Duke Blue Devils to the 1989 Atlantic Coast Conference championship, before returning to his alma mater, the University of Florida, as head coach in 1990. During his 12 seasons with the Gators, Spurrier's teams won seven Southeastern Conference championships, one national championship and finished ranked in the top 10 nine times. His record at Florida was an amazing 122-27-1 (.817). Spurrier, Trophy as a quarterback for the Gators, most recently was head coach of the NFL's Washington Redskins (2002-03).
