



**Amtrak Fare Increase** 

WASHINGTON (AP) - Amtrak is going ahead with plans to raise rail passenger fares by 20 per cent for trips west of Chicago during the summer months. Amtrak Vice President Edwin Edel said Tuesday the increase is to take effect June 9 but fares will be reduced again in September.

Edel said the fare hike was "a marketing tool" intended to determine whether rates would have an effect on the amount of passenger business during the vacation travel

Amtrak, the national rail passenger corporation, announced last week that passenger fares nationwide would be increased by 5 per cent permanently on April 16. The summer increase on western service is in addition to that.



HERSHEY, Pa. (AP) - Fuel supplies should improve during the spring and summer as long as conservation measures continue, a Federal Energy Office official says.

John C. Sawhill, deputy FEO administrator, said he could foresee no significant shortages. But he added that if fuel conservation efforts end, a five to six per cent shortage could develop.

Although supplies should return to pre-Arab oil embargo levels, prices will not drop correspondingly, he said. He predicted a softening of the world market price and a leveling off of prices in this country.

# Johnson: Poor Man's Champion

On Dec. 29, 1898, in Raleigh N. C., a son was born to a poor couple named Johnson. They called the boy Andrew and he grew up in a poverty-stricken home with almost no ad-

vantages except courage. His father died when he was very young and he was apprenticed to a tailor. He had little chance for a formal education, but apparently he believed in making the most of the opportunity at hand, for he became a skillful and suc-

cessful tailor. When he was 18 he left Raleigh and moved to Greeneville, Tenn. There he met a young lady by the name of Eliza McCardle, and about a year later they were married. At this time Andrew knew the read or write.

However, Eliza had bee better educated and day after ay, while he worked in his ailor shop making fine clothes for other people to wear, she aught him reading and writing and arithmetic. So successful was she as a teacher, and so apt a scholar was her husband, that at the age of 21 he entered

Although he had been born and lived in the South, Johnson belonged to the poorer class and had very little use for the wealthy slave owners who maintained the big plantations of that day. Many of his peeches were directed against them, which caused him to ecome exceedingly unpopular with them. Education

But he was always the hampion of the common man. and one of the things he fought for during his whole political career was public education specially in his home state of

Johnson was first elected alderman and later mayor o His next step was to become a

nember of the state egislature and from there he ntered the U.S. House of Representatives where he emained for 10 years. Then, after serving two terms as overnor of Tennessee, he was elected to the U.S. Senate.

Andrew Johnson was a stron acksonian Democrat who held very decided views in favor of state's rights, yet when the southern states seceded he stood firmly for the Union and the Constitution. This policy, of course, made him popular in the North, but very unpopular in the South. The result was that in 1864 Johnson, even though he was a Democrat, was nominated for the vice sidency by the Republican

Bul in April, 1865, Preside incoln was assassinated and Johnson became president.



that improper stowage" frequently was the cause or a contributing factor. "Either the animal containers themselves were improperly secured or other cargo shifted in flight, thereby cutting off the air supply to the animals or damaging their containers and injuring the animals," it

Proposal Under the FAA proposa animal containers would have to be secured in cargo compartments to prevent shifting or sumbling during flight and be stored in such a manner that entilation would not be obstructed. Also, webbing or other means would have to be provided to prevent other cargo from coming in contact with the

animal containers. The proposed rule is the first step in implementing recommendations made by the House Government Operations Committee in its report last Dec. 21 on problems of air shipment of

domestic animals. The committee recommended a broad interagency effort (FAA, Department of Agriculture and Civil Aeronautics Board) to identify problems associated with the transportation of animals by air and to develop corrective regulations and standards.

The House committee, with Reps. Floyd Hicks, Democrat. and Joel Pritchard, Republican, both of Washington, leading the way, held four days of hearings last September to hear complaints from such organizations as the Humane Society of America, Dogowners Association of America and Animal Welfare Institute.

I find the cotton pieces are useful for quilts and the like but do not know how to use other pieces (besides making doll clothes) such as corduroy, knits, tweeds, rayons, linen, flannel, brocades and various mixtures of man-made fibers. I cannot bring myself to throw any hing away so would welcome some ideas for things that would utilize these "bits and pieces."-

POLLY'S PROBLEM

DEAR POLLY-My Pet Peeve is with the Postal Service. It keeps raising the price of stamps but seems to put less glue on the backs of these high-priced stamps. I am always adding more glue

to the backs so they will stick on letters .- JANICE. DEAR POLLY-and Thelma-I worked in a wholesale nursery for 13 years. To root plants we used a light soil mixture. Make your chrysanthemum cuttings from the top part of the stems and carefully pinch off the lower leaves leaving four at the top. Each cutting should be about four inches long. Insert pinched stem into soil about one quarter inch above the pinched off leaf.

Press soil around cuttings which are placed about one inch apart. Be sure to keep the buds pinched off. Plants should take about two weeks to root. Keep soil damp but not soaked and in a warm place. A portable greenhouse can even be made with a plastic covered frame with small air holes cut in the plastic .-PATRICIA.

DEAR POLLY-The following Pointer was used by a woman who did not have the use of a hand and hopefully it will help someone else similarly handicapped. To scrape vegetables she flattened one of those gold-colored scouring balls a little and attached it to a cutting board with four small fencing staples. The staples stood upright in the mesh so she could drive them in with a hammer. She draws the vegetables across the scrubber turning them when necessary. This does an excellent job scraping carrots, potatoes and so on .- TILLIE


