





Marriage Opportunities

Southern girls marry earlier than those of any other section of the country but girls in the West have the best chances of eventual marriage. This is not our idea but the expressed opinion of the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company. In fact, the company adds, this is for Western girls whether they live in cities or .n rural areas.

"The chances of marriage before age 20 are greatest, for girls living in the South, particularly for those living in small towns; the chances are smallest in the Northeast, and least of all in the urban centers of that part of the United States," the company says. This relative disadvantage of the city is found in all sections of the country, ac-

cording to the 1940 census. "In the country as a whole 11.1 per cent, or one-ninth of the native white girls of ages i5 to 19 were married at Inland Newspape. Representatives, Inc. represents The Hernich of the automal field of advertising and over—only 6.3 per cent of the girls in these ages were married; in the smaller cities—down to 2,500 inhabitants—the figure was 9.9, per cent, and in smaller towns and villages the figure was 15.1 per cent.
