Fate of teen dance is still up in the air

LONGWOOD · Continued support for a teen dance program in Longwood is on hold while the state conducts an

inquiry into the program.

The State Attorney's Office is looking into the use of forfeiture trust funds by the Center for Youth Diversions, Inc., the sponsor of a weekly teen dance.

The State Attorney's Office is requesting secountings from

the City for 1995-1996 provided by the Center for Youth Diversions of its use of forfei-ture funds which it receives from the city.

The City Commission financially supports the weekly teen dance at the Teen Center with financial aid from the City's confiscation account. Off-duty city police officers are present at the dances, paid by the City.

The Teen Center is fully funded for the remainder of the year, according to Drago. Please see Dance, Page SA

Historic cemetery gazebo will get a facelift

SANFORD - Restoration work is underway for the historic gazebo in the Lakeview Cemetery in Sanford. The octagon shaped gazebo,

48-feet in diameter, is being repaired to look like it did when it was brand new. The structure will be designed to withstand 100 mile-per-hour winds, according to city engineer Bob Wafter. The renovations are ex-

pected to be complete in one month. The bid for the renovation work was awarded to the Weshmark Corp. for \$42,500,

alongside club members Mary Davis and Erin Dehlin-

tery was purchased in the 1920's, and the gazebo may have been built before the cemetery was purchased, according to Alicia Clarke, curator of the Sanford Museum.

The gazebo was built large enough that a hearse could pull underneath. There were benches on the inside, and it served as a shelter area for burial services, Clarke said.

"It was big enough to drive a wagon through," Clarke said. There was no floor, it was only dirt. You could sit inside when it was raining, or if for some other reason you wanted to have services in the gazebo."

Because the gazebo was cen-The 30-acre Lakeview Ceme- trally located as part of the cemetery's design, museum officials believe that it was built at the same time as the cemetery, possibly at an ear-

lier date. The city purchased the cemetery from the family of T.J. Miller, who at the turn of the century owned a furniture store where the First Union Bank on First Street is now located, and owned an undertaker's parlor behind the furniture store.

"At one time he was the only undertaker in the city," Clarke

Miller's horse, Bob, who pulled the hearse for the T.J. buried near the cemetery's entrance on Hardy Avenue, Clarke said.

"It is turned so it faces the road that Bob traveled on," Clarke said. The stone on Bob's grave

says that he was faithful for 26 years. The handcarved stone was damaged in 1980, and replaced by a local company. "He has become sort of a lo-

cal legend," Clarke said. "People talk about him as if they knew him, when they weren't old enough to have known him."

Bob's obituary ran in the July 3, 1914 Sanford Herald. T.J. Miller was the main un-

dertaker in the city at the turn of the century," Clarke said.
"It seems this horse would have taken everybody to the

cemetery."

I am so proud of these students, almost 100 of them," said club co-sponsor Karyn Roberts. They actually pay to join the club and then work endless volunteers hours in their community."


While the 10-year-old club is open to all grade levels at the high school, only 11 juniors and seniors participated in the cleanup of Sandra Monroe's yard, "because they can drive," Roberts said.

The first four volunteers to

arrive picked up trash around the yard while waiting for the other helpers, who, as Roberts said, "had a heck of a time getting there." A key volunteer, the student with all the lawn maintenance equipment, was an hour late after he got lost

trying to find Monroe's house. The interact members spent about 3 1/2 hours performing the work and have been asked to return to do some minor repairs and paint. Roberts said that it will have to be within the next three weeks, because students have 9-week exams then and are already busy with prom this weekend.

Drawing on the example of their adult counterpart — Ro-tary Club of Lake Mary — the students tackle weekly projects, always after school hours. When helping at Seminole Children's Village, the high school students might take the kids on a field trip. Picase see Clean, Page SA

The threat of further growth by the gambling industry is upactting to the county's leaders. Seminole already has two dog tracks and a jai alsi fronton - three of the 32 legal gambling businesses in the state of Florida.

Those who favor casino video games argue that 38 percent of the video revenue would go toward classroom construction and other educational needs. At the same time, struggling pari-mutuel businesses such as dog tracks and jai alai fron-tons are expected to make \$200 million from the reve-

The bill moving through the Florida House and Senate is raising concern in many areas. Volunta County officials also

are concerned. Seminole County Commissioner Randy Morris said no matter what happens to the bill in the legislature, Gov. Jeb Bush would probably apply his veto. "The new governor is anti-gambling." Morris said. "He'd hardly be in favor of this." First, let's see if it gets out of committee to the floor of the Senate and the House.'

In November 1996, the citizens of Seminole County voted to amend the county's Home Rule Charter to prohibit caby a referendum election in the county. Groot says the video lotteries and casino gambling are one in the same. "We're genuinely concerned for the good of our citizens."

When Habitat for Humanity builds a new home, the students are found working in most phases of construction. Habitat benefits from the altruism during the holiday season as well, when the service club members wrap gifts at Seminole Towne Center as a Habitat fund-raiser.

Roberts said, "My classroom looks like a grocery store in November and December," when the group collects canned goods for the Salvation Army's Seminole County effort. Roberts' students also help sort them for Second Harvest Food Bank.

Some other services the students perform for area seniors includes installing mailboxes and also large house numbers so that the address is clearly visible to an ambulance or other emergency vehicle.

Roberts co-sponsors Interact Service Club with fellow educator Robin Dehlinger, who teaches world history. Roberts teaches American history, government and law studies. She said that Better Living for Seniors looks to groups like hers for help because the general public probably doesn't realize the agency seeks ongoing community support.
"Every one is pretty much

aware of Second Harvest Food Bank and Habitat [for Human-ity], but I don't think people realize that Better Living for Seniors seriously needs volun-teers." In fact, she quickly provided the phone number for more information on how to help -- (407) 333-8877.

Lentils - but not in soup, please

Back in the 60s and 70s, I learned to hate lentils. I was living in a variety of shared households with vegetarian agendas, and lentils made an almost nightly appearance in soggy, unappealing looking soups at those communal tables. It was years before I could look at a lentil again

Then, several years ago, I met one of my "food heroes." Arthur Schwartz, who hosts a funny, informative, and just plain great to listen to syndicated radio show called Food Talk Arthur was testing recipes for his book 'Naples at Table and he served mea lunch of lentils and pasta that made me take a second look at the bean I had been maligning for so many years. One of the great things about lentils is that, unlike many other kinds of beans, they don't need to be soaked overnight before using, which means you don't have to plan way ahead. But

like other legumes - they are hearty, inexpensive and easy to cook Experiment with French or Euro pean" lentils brown on the outside and creamy yellow within - or with red or "Egyptian" lentils, both available at health food and specialty markets. Or use the common brown kind sold at the grocery store

I have grown to love lentils with duck and with salmon. 



The Seminole Athletic Conference softball standings got all jumbled up Tuesday night as both Lake Mary and Semi-nole were upset, while Winter Springs rolled.

Oviedo scored three runs in the third inning and ended Lake Mary's 15-game winning streak, 6-1, at Lake Mary.





An agreement that works

It is something I have discussed be fore, but it is critical in today's deal. You have three low cards in the suit

You have three low cards in the suit partner bid. Which do you lead?

It depends on the auction and where you live. In Britain, MUD (middle-up-down) is popular. Yet this is dangerous. Partner will think you have led from a doubleton, only realizing you have three after seeing your second. have three after seeing your second card, which may be too late.

The best agreement is to lead the lowest card when you have not supported the suit, but to start with the highest card when you have raised partner, so that he knows you don't have an honor.

This deal occurred during a Canadian International Pairs in Toronto. At most tables, South was in four spades after East opened one club. The club lead was ducked, East winning with the jack. East generally switched to a diamond, declarer successfully finessing the queen.


After a trump to the queen and ace, East exited safely with a diamond or a trump. However, it was now simple for

trump. However, it was now simple for declarer to play king, ace and another heart to establish a discard for his losing club. (This works whenever hearts are 3-3 or East has a doubleton hon-

It looks straightforward, but one East found the answer. At trick two, Haig Tchamitch returned a club into dummy's ace-queen tenace! Then, he won the first round of trumps and gave his partner a club ruff. Eventually, the defenders scored a heart trick for one down.

This defense should have been found at more tables because the six couldn't be low from three. It had to be a singleton or doubleton.

ASK DR. GOTT

Vomiting may have physical cause

DR. GOTT

DEAR DR. GOTT: My 26-year-old daughter has a terrible problem. Since the age of 4, she has had recurring bouts of vomiting. She says her throat fills with phlegm, but we can't see anything. The doctors say the problem is in her head. We don't know where to turn.

DEAR READER: Before labeling your daughter's problems as emotion-al, I'd want to make absolutely certain al, I'd want to make absolutely certain that she isn't suffering from an uncommon abnormality of her upper digestive tract — for example, a spasm, a blockage or a kink. Take her to a gastroenterologist, who should perform certain tests, including and a space of the escape. endoscopy (examination of the esophagus and stomach using a lighted fiber-optic tube). Only after her digestive tract proves to be normal would I recommend evaluation of any emotional factors that may contribute to her problem.

DEAR DR. GOTT: My boyfriend has an itching on the end of his penis and a feeling of pressure in his testicles after sex. His other girlfriend is prone to yeast infections. A third girlfriend has had herpes. I don't have any symptoms, but wonder if I should be

treated. What is causing his problem? DEAR READER: I think he has too many girlfriends. Perhaps he would have less itching and pressure if he were to limit his affections to one partner. Medical studies have clearly shown that multiple sexual partners increase the risk of a wide variety of sexually transmitted diseases, not only for the central character, but for everyone with whom he or she has relations.

In my opinion, your boyfriend should be checked for venereal diseases. This should include a general medical exam and blood tests, as well as a microscopic analysis of any penile discharge. In addition — to be on the safe side — you, too, should be checked by a gynecologist. Some sex-

ually transmitted diseases, such as chlamydia and herpes, may cause few. if any, symptoms early on, but may lead to serious consequences, including infertility, if not treated. I believe that both you and your boyfriend should seek medical attention.

DEAR DR. GOTT: For several months, my nose and cheeks have been turning red — only in the evening. By morning, the skin has returned to normal. What could be causing this and how do I stop it?

DEAR READER: Your symptoms suggest that something in your envi-ronment may be irritating your skin. Allergies can do this. So can alcohol beverages. Try to analyze what it is that you are doing after sunset that you're not doing during daylight. If you cannot ferret out a cause, see a dermatologist — preferably one who is willing to examine you during evening hours, at the height of your
