7th AF Regroups In Viet Planning

SAIGON (AP) - U.S. officials are reassessing the Vietnamization program because of the disappointing South Vietnamese performance in the Laoian invasion and the current North Vietnamese offensive in the central highlands.

It was learned today that the U.S. 7th Air Force is planning a complete reorganization and consolidation of its squadrons in South Vietnam in an effort to become more proficient in providing cover for withdrawing American forces, During the cutback of 100,000 more troops be-

tween May 1 and Dec. 1, reduction of the 40,500 Air Force personnel will likely be kept to a minimum, sources said, with perhaps only one air wing pulled

The sources said that under the new program,

U.S. B52 bombers and tactical fighter-bombers have helped contain the offensive in the central highlands and apparently have kept besieged Fire Base 6 from being overrun a second time. While South Vietnamese fighter-bombers fly some missions in support of the base, they must be supplemented by U.S.
