NEW YORK, Feb. 5—Although Japan has been considered the most vulnerable from the viewpoint of supplies of raw materials atch as iron and steel scrap, it is now indicated that Japanese stockpiles of scrap are far greater than is generally realized, and are sufficient for arms production at peak rates for many months, according to a survey issued yesterday by "Iron Age."

The magazine estimated Japan's pile of iron and steel scrap at the beginning of the current year at about 10,000,000 tons. In the last 10 years it is pointed out, Japan received about 11,600,000 tons from the United States, a period in which the Japanese steel industry produced approximately 56,000,000 tons of steel ingot and chattings and about 30,000,000 tons of pig iron. Among factors taken late account in making the anyey are Japan's imports of finished steel products as well as scrap and recovery of old metals from large-scale wrecking operations in Chins.

War - Time

Daylight Saving Time, or as President Rossevelt has dubbed the new device for increasing daylight working leases, "War Time," goes into effect at 2:00 A.M. next Menesy and all government offices, railroads and other interstate commerce businesses are required by congressional act to set their clocks ahead one hour and to keep them as an for the duration

terstate commerce businesses are required by congressional act to set their clocks shead one hour and to keep them so set for the duration.

The new time has been adopted primarily for the benefit of people living in the north and in the larger metropolitan areas where the days are sheeter than they are here. By getting to work an hour earlier, workers will have, in effect, one hour more of daylight in the afternoon, in which to continue their labors in behalf of national defense or to engage in recreational activities which will help to keep them fit.

There is also a possible additional advantage in the event air raids ever come to this country. The extra hour of daylight in the afternoon will give people another hour in which to get home before durk, before the raids start and blackouts begin. It will help to eliminate traffic and congression on highways during possible blackouts and put people in their homes where they belong during raids and where they can see to their own blackouts.

Although there would not seem to be as much necessity for War Time in Florida where days are longer, where the proportion of war industries is negligible as compared with the tourist business and farmers whose day is from annup to sunset anyway, Governor Holsand and his cabinate have decided that all State business will be trainsacted in accordance with the new time and working hours have been adjusted to conform conveniently.

In the case of public schools throughout the state, they will operate on War Time but their opening and closing heurs will be advanced one hour so that in reality the sun will be in the same relative position when they open and close as formerly. This was deemed necessary by the fact that school buses operating in rural areas would otherwise be compelled to begin picking children up while it was still dark.



NEW YORK. Feb. 5—Although Japan has been considered the most vulnerable from the viewpoint of supplies of raw materials arch as iron and steel scrap, it is now indicated that Japanese stockpiles of scrap are far greater than is generally realized, and are sufficient for arms production at peak rates for many months, according to a survey issued yesterday by "Iron Age."

The magazine estimated Japan's pile of iron and steel scrap at the beginning of the current year at about 10,000,000 tons. In the last 10 years it is pointed out, Japan received abort 11,000,000 tons from the United States, a period in which the Japanese steel industry produced approximately 56,000,000 tons of pigiron. Among factors taken into account in making the aurvey are Japan's imports of finished tieel products as well as scrap and recovery of old metals from large-scale wrecking operations in Chins.
