## Herald earns FPA awards

Seminole Herald staffers were honored this weekend during the Florida Press Association's annual convention at Jupiter Beach.

Photographers Tommy Vincent and Art Zielinski took first place in the Photo Series in One Issue category of the FPA Better Newspaper Contest. Their entry, titled "2000: The Year in Photos," was a compilation of the duo's work portraying the events that occurred throughout the year.

Editor Dan Ping and former staff writer Joe DeSantis earned a third-place award for in-depth reporting on the lawsuits and recounts following the November presidential election.

## County sets date for sales tax vote

Voters will determine whether to extend penny sales tax for 10 years

SANFORD — County Commissioners voted Tuesday 4 to 1, with Commissioner Grant Maloy dissenting, to give Seminole County voters the right to decide on Sept. 4 if the

one-cent sales tax will continue the next 10 years.

The one-cent sales tax, approved in 1991, is scheduled to expire in January 2002. There will be a three-month reprieve from the one cent tax regardless of whether the new referendum passes in September.

While the old one-cent tax revenues went strictly to road improvements, the new referendum, which is projected to bring \$534 million in revenues during the next 10 years, will be split 75 percent to road improvements and 25 percent to school improvements.

More than two dozen community members voiced opinions at the public hearing, including members of the county's Stop the PEST (Penny Extra Sales Tax) committee. Commissioners

## Chain saw sculptor

Mark Rice takes fallen trees and turns them into works of art

SANFORD — Motorists traveling along East State Road 46 near the Midway community may notice a grizzly bear standing in front of the Country General Store.

The 8-foot beast is actually a wooden sculpture created Monday by Winter Springs native Mark W. Rice. Within hours, the local artist used a chain saw to transform a 6,000-pound log into a wooden showpiece — much to the amusement of numerous spectators who stopped to watch Rice create his latest carving.

"It used to make me nervous when people would watch me," Rice said. "Not anymore. Now, I don't even know what's going on around me when I'm carving. And, I don't usually stop until the chain saw runs out of gas."

Rice's pursuit into chain saw carving evolved from his logging business, Timber Recovery Inc. He started the business in 1985 after seeing piles of burning trees on a site cleared for construction.

"I thought that was such a waste for all those trees to be pushed over and burned or taken to the landfill," Rice said. "There was no benefit to the environment to have those trees burning."

Rice went to the job site and asked to haul the trees away to use for lumber and other wood products. As the business grew, so did his customer base, and carvers began buying the timber for their wooden pieces of art.

Seven years ago, after watch-

ing a chain saw artist perform his craft, Rice decided he could also create sculpture with a power tool. He picked up the mechanical blade and went to work on his first grizzly bear.

"I just started fooling around, and it worked," he said. "I guess I am blessed."

Rice now travels throughout the county and the nation doing demonstrations in chain saw

carving. Nicknamed the "Woodbutcher," he's built a well respected reputation in the area for his pro-environment

## Sidney Vihlen Sr. dies at 92

Son of Carl Vihlen, one of Sanford's original settlers

SANFORD — Sidney Lawrence Vihlen Sr., died Sunday, June 24, 2001 at Central Florida Regional Hospital. He was 92 years old.

Vihlen was one of eight children born to Carl Lenard and Emma Vihlen, a Swedish family that was one of the first to settle the Sanford area. Born in Stockholm, Sweden, Carl Lenard Vihlen moved to Sanford just as General Henry

Sanford was creating the town. Carl Vihlen was a licensed horticulturist for General Sanford and is credited with developing the Valencia Orange. Like his

father, Sidney Vihlen Sr. was an enterprising businessman. Vihlen Sr. owned Vihlen Electric Inc. in Sanford. He purchased the business from its founder E.B. Randall, who established the company in 1917. Vihlen bought him out in 1952.

According to his son, Sidney Vihlen Jr., his father was most

## Sign marks Goldsboro's history

Florida's second black city was incorporated almost 110 years ago

SANFORD — Almost 110 years after it was first incorporated, the Goldsboro community has a historical marker to call its own.

County officials and members of the Seminole County Historical Commission gathered Thursday to commemorate the history of Goldsboro with the dedication of a historical marker located in front of the 13th Street Police Sub-Station in Sanford.

"This one's long over due," County Commissioner Randy Morris said. "This is one of the founding cities in Seminole — a city with a checkered history."

Goldsboro was the second Florida town incorporated by black citizens. In 1886, William Clark opened a store in the vil-

lage of Goldsboro, and on Dec. 1, 1891, registered voters incorporated the town. According to the marker, the town boundaries, generally triangular in shape, were south of West 13th Street, between Olive Avenue on the west and Clark, now known as Lake Avenue, on the east.

For almost 20 years, Goldsboro officials prevented Sanford from expanding its boundaries to the west, but on April 6, 1911, Sanford passed a resolution of its intent to absorb Goldsboro. Despite protests

from its citizens, the state legislature voted to revoke the incorporation on April 26, 1911, making Goldsboro part of Sanford.

"This shows the differences between the two municipalities have changed during the century," Morris said. "This is a way to keep history living."

According to Seminole County Historical Commission Chairman Linda Batman, the Goldsboro marker is a way of portraying all of Seminole

## One-car wreck nets sizable cocaine bust

MAITLAND — A Seminole County Deputy may have stumbled onto "a piece in a bigger puzzle" after responding Sunday morning to a routine one-car accident.

More than 250 grams of cocaine, a dozen Ecstasy pills and \$1,500 in cash were found on a passed out driver who apparently

drove off the road and was found at approximately 6:30 a.m. June 24.

According to Deputy Sara Klein's report, just west of Oxford Road, on the right-of-way of Derbyshire Road, she responded to a call of a driver who "appeared to be impaired beyond his normal facilities."

Klein found Kim Jee-Hoon

## Uncle Jones Bar-B-Que robbed by son-in-law

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS — Uncle Jones Bar-B-Que employee Wendell Merriman, 44, who is also the son-in-law of the establishment's owner Henry Jones, robbed the restaurant Sunday for approximately \$300 with a fake gun, according to Jones' daughter Nikki.

The restaurant's dishwasher

was arrested by Seminole County Sheriff's Office after what officials called a slow speed pursuit through the fairly immediate neighborhoods. For about a mile, a green Volkswagen, driven by Dwayne Edwards, 22, and passenger Merriman, led deputies "at extremely low speeds" around the roads of Mercury, DeSoto,

## Be careful when you sing 'Happy Birthday'

Another history lesson. Today, June 27, back in 1859, was the birthday of Mildred J. Hill, who became a school teacher in Louisville, Ky. If she was still around, we should all gather and sing, "Happy Birthday to You." Of course, she would expect nothing less. After all, she is credited with having written the song.

Her sister, Patty Smith Hill, also a school teacher, born March 27, 1868, was the author of the original lyrics which were first published in 1893 — called at that time, "Good Morning To All." It was used as a morning greeting in classrooms and church meetings, and was published in the book "Song Stories for the Sunday School."

In 1924, the words were changed to "Happy Birthday to You". Now, it is believed to be sung, somewhere in the world, at least once every minute of every day. In case you are ever on a quiz show that asks the most often sung song in the world — you now know the answer.

Back then, few song writers or lyricists ever got paid for their creations, and Mildred and Patty are said to have never made a dime. Eventually however, as the song was licensed, it generated about \$1 million a year for its copyright owner, who apparently (history doesn't say) obtained the rights from the two ladies.

Even today, people who sing "Happy Birthday to You" in a public performance for which they are paid, are required to obtain permission, and pay a copyright fee. I haven't the slightest idea how much that may cost, or who owns the copyright now.

It does make me wonder of Marilyn Monroe got copyright approval before she sang "Happy Birthday Dear Mr. President" to John F. Kennedy a number of years ago.

But have faith. The copyright will expire in the year 2020, after which it will become public domain, meaning anyone can sing it any time, for profit or pleasure, without a license.

Mildred J. Hill died in Chicago on June 5, 1916 never knowing how popular her song would become throughout the world. Her sister Patty Smith Hill died in New York City on May 25, 1946, at the age of 78. She was fully aware of the popularity of the song, which was sung to her every year on her birthday during the final decades.

Now considering the letters I received regarding my columns in May and June about the origin of Mother's Day and Father's Day, I expect to hear from readers about someone else who developed this song. (I'll have a column on those two "corrections" in this weekend's edition).

Regardless, my family sang the song to me this past Saturday and I feel certain they didn't obtain copyright clearance to sing it. Of course it was a not-for-profit singing, so I guess they're safe.

"Just bury me in my bed," I moan. Standing two feet outside the sneeze zone and holding a dust mask over his mouth, Sweetie stares down at me. My teeth are chattering, my bones ache, my eyes are puffed out like a molly fish, and you could grill fajitas on my forehead.

"Does this mean you're not cooking dinner?" he asks.

After the bed levitates a foot off the floor and my head spins 360 degrees,

## Green ways

### Environmental policies won't wash with voters

Poor Jeb Bush. His place as the family's most politically promising scion — real presidential timber — has been usurped by his less serious brother, George. Indeed, Jeb's political future is in jeopardy after the Florida presidential election debacle. As Florida's governor, he is blamed by many for the mess, especially the obstacles encountered by hundreds of legally registered African-American voters.

And now his big brother George seems determined to exacerbate Jeb's political troubles by insisting on a plan to drill for oil and gas off the Florida Panhandle, despite Floridians' objections. Beaches are sacrosanct in the Sunshine State, one of the few environmental issues that unites business owners and tree-huggers.

With thousands of miles of coastline and some of the world's most beautiful beaches, Florida depends on outdoor tourism to fuel its economy. Critics of the drilling plan fear not only ugly oil rigs souring the view from the white sands and turquoise waters, but also oil spills that would wreak havoc with the shore.

Though Jeb has begged his brother not to proceed, the president has not backed down. Emphasizing President Bush's strong ties to the oil and gas industries, Democratic wags like to say that in the Bush family, oil is thicker than blood.

But Gov. Bush just got some unexpected help from Congress. On Thursday, despite pleas from the White House to let the drilling leases go forward, 70 Republicans joined with Democrats to postpone the leases for six months. In a separate vote, the House also passed a measure that would prevent the White House from exploring for oil, gas or coal on lands designated as national monuments.

What has happened to President Bush's juggernaut, just a few months ago rolling over the objections of critics? What has happened to the executive White House, run like a business by a CEO who brooked no insubordination?

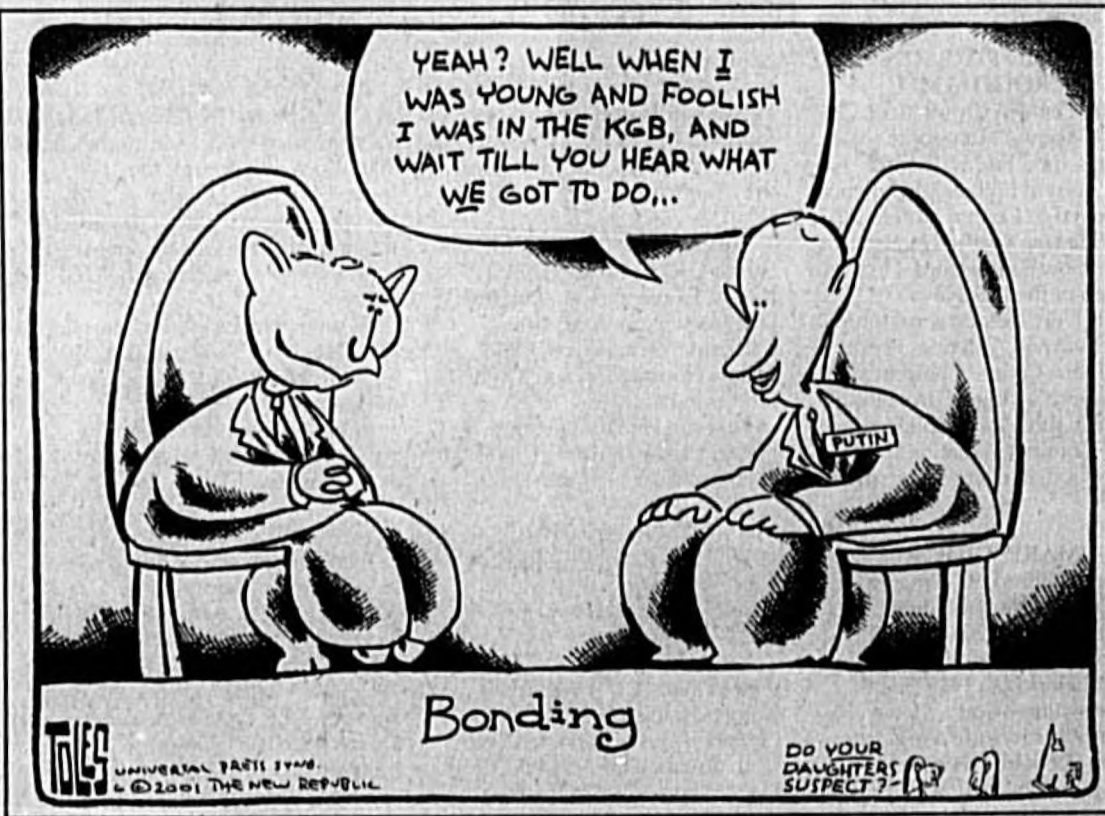
Quite simply: Politics happened. Even Republicans understand the risks they take when they enrage the voting public — especially over the environment. And polls show that Americans are pretty upset over the president's environmental policies these days. A New York Times/CBS poll released recently showed that 46 percent of Americans disapprove of the Bush administration's handling of environmental matters, while only 39 percent approve. (The rest had no opinion.)

You'd think the president would know better, since Republicans have been here before. When President Clinton thrashed Republican nominee Bob Dole in 1996, the GOP leadership was forced to acknowledge that the Republicans' perceived hostility to the environment played a role in Dole's defeat. Thereafter, Newt Gingrich, who was then House speaker, started doing a lot of photo-ops at zoos.

It was a lesson that didn't stick. The Bush administration has come in with a slew of policies that show a callousness toward precious natural resources. President Bush never saw a national park that he thought wouldn't look better with an oil rig in it; Vice President Dick Cheney believes energy conservation is for wimps. It is hard to disguise those policies, even when the president poses for pictures holding a turtle in one hand and a fishing rod in the other. It won't wash.

Poor Jeb wasn't able to persuade his brother of that. Maybe congressional Republicans, fearing a voter backlash, will succeed where Jeb failed.

## American Dream now belongs to the world

The Stevens Indicator, the alumni magazine of the school from which I received an ME (Mechanical Engineer) degree more than 30 years ago, includes a list of new faculty each year. The current issue profiles the 15 appointed in 2000-2001.

Here are the names by department: Electrical and Computer Engineering: Edward Blicharz, Rajarathnam Chandramouli, Hong Man, K.P. Subbalakshmi, Uf Tureli; Chemistry and Chemical Engineering: Svetlana Sukhishvili, Olga Malteeva, Nicolai Panikov; Mathematical Sciences: Darinka Dentcheva, Mohammad Abanjeh; Systems Engineering and Management: John Farr, John Keating, Robert Seymour, Bernard Skown, Robert Stinerock.

That is part of today's reality in American hard-sciences scholarship and achievement. The teachers in that group all did their graduate work at American universities, where by some estimates more than half of the doctorates in the hard sciences now are earned by foreigners. Their undergraduate degrees are from,

among other places, the University of Madras, Humboldt University in Berlin, the University of Suzhou, Ural State University, Indian Institute of Sciences, Bangalore and Yarmouk University in Irbid, Jordan.

It is not, strictly speaking, a new reality. Albert Einstein, after all, did not do his undergraduate work at Princeton. He was, like many of the Nobel Prize winners who helped make the

University of California the greatest of public schools, a refugee from the Europe Hitler conquered. Like some of the new professors at Stevens, his English may not have been perfect, but he spoke an international language called mathematics.

Already, two Indian-Americans — Hargobind Khorana of Harvard and Subramanian Chandrasekhar of the University of Chicago — are Nobel laureates. Indian-Americans, in fact, are among the most educated citizens and residents in our country. Over the past 25 years, Indian-American children have been

three times as likely to graduate from college as white American children. Perhaps most important in terms of what the future will look like in the United States, the percentage of Indian-Americans who are between the ages of 18 and 24 is five times more than the percentage of white Americans who are between those ages.

The traffic in highly educated young men and women from Asia to the United States is a complicated business. Estimates of the numbers of graduates from American schools of science and technology who stay in the United States rather than returning home range from 50 percent to 80 percent; one of the things that complicate statistics is love and marriage. Many foreign students end up with American husbands or wives.

Many Indians, though, decide to go home after working here for a few years. There are more opportunities at home now because of the global economy and evolving communications technology, which allow them to do the same kind of work and teaching they can do in the United States or Europe. Many go back because "family values" mean so much less here than in

Asian societies. Some, particularly Chinese, go back for patriotic reasons: They want to share in the building of their own countries.

You can say that these "aliens" are taking jobs from our kids and other Americans, but how many of our kids are accomplished in stochastic optimization, as is Dr. Dentcheva, or three-dimensional sub-band video-coding algorithm, as is Dr. Man? Or, you could say that we are stealing the best and the brightest from the rest of the world, particularly Russia and the poorer parts of Asia.

Either way, I think, American wins. This is a meritocracy. Most of these people are doing jobs that very few Americans can do, just as many other immigrants (many of them illegal) from Mexico and Central America are doing jobs Americans don't want to do — like scrubbing dishes in restaurants plain and fancy.

The advances made by educated new immigrants have caused pessimists here to conclude that the "American Dream" is dead. The opposite is true. The American Dream belongs to the whole world now.

The bear that took Rice two weeks to create seven years ago now takes him only eight hours to complete. He creates various wildlife sculptures from almost any kind of wood, although he prefers camphor. He recently created a backyard sculpture for a family who wanted to preserve the remains of a tree struck by lightning.

"You just have to work with the wood," he said. "But, you also have to realize, the wood will only let you do so much."

Although Rice's work is now more intricate than when he started, the bear remains the foundation of his art — especially if he happens to make a mistake while carving.

"If I'm carving a bird, and I do an oops, then I do a bear," he said. "I can make a bear out of anything. What's bad is if I do an oops during the detailing, then I

have to get creative."

A year ago, Rice formed a partnership with Gary Ganas, owner of the Country General Store. The diner has become the artist's studio and gallery, which attracts customers to the local eatery.

"Mark came here to eat, and we started to be friends," Ganas said. "He started bringing a few pieces in, and it just started to happen."

"He's amazing, and he's got talent," he said. "He looks at a piece of wood, and he can see what's there."

Both men seemed pleased with the partnership, and there's only one rule they live by when it comes to art and food.

"I told Gary I would stay out of his kitchen as long as he

leaves my chain saws alone," Rice said.

Rice's hobby has become a family legacy. Two of his sons, Richard and Mark Jr., have started chain saw carving and have their artwork on display at the diner.

"If I can't share the stuff I'm doing, then there's no sense in doing it at all," Rice said. "I don't do it for the money. I do it because I love doing it."

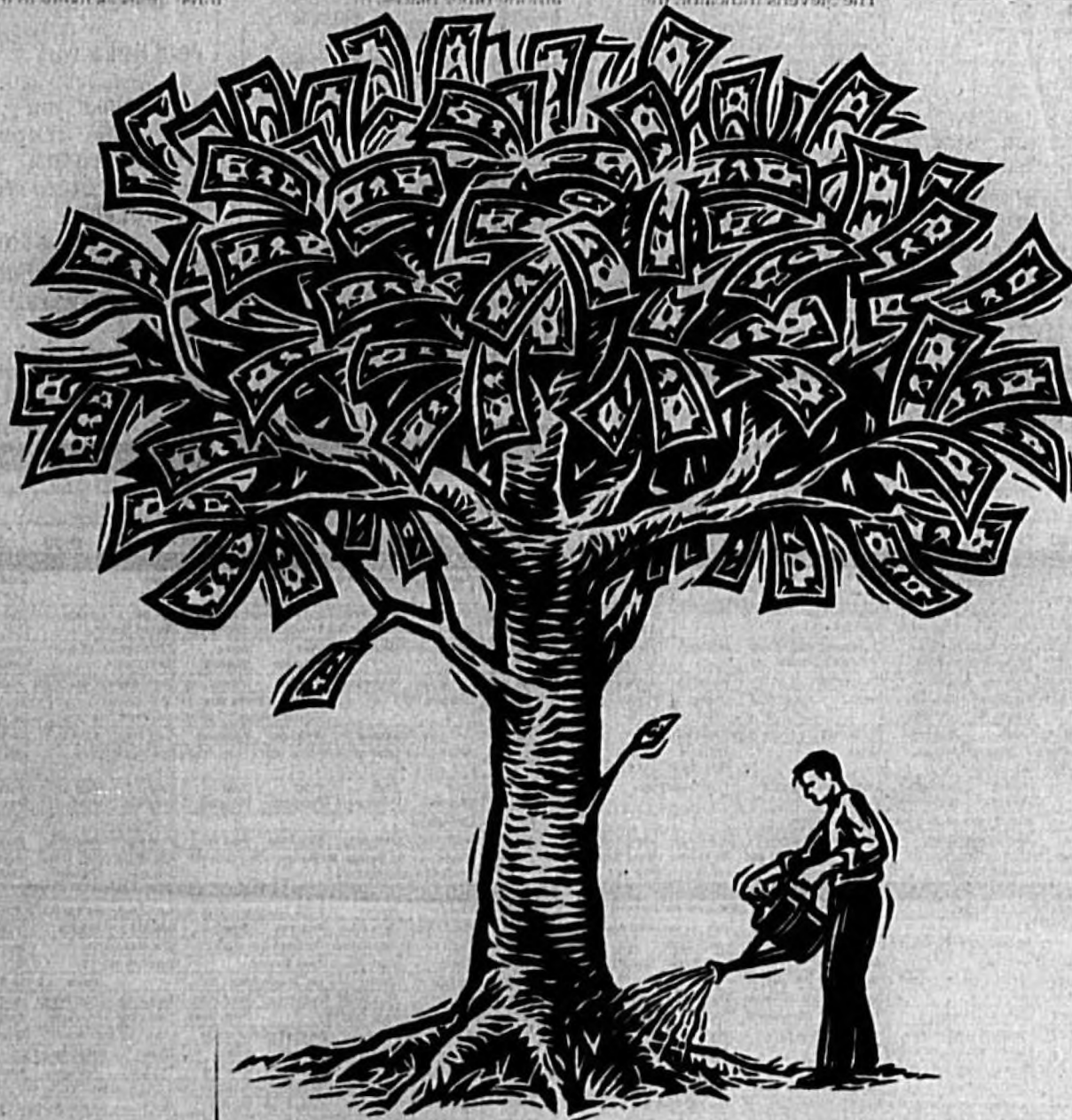

"Believe me there has been a lot of thought, involvement and planning to get us here today," Chairman Dick Van Der Weide said to the audience. "I think it's good we have citizens interested. We have public hearings on our budget sometimes and hardly anybody shows up."

Van Der Weide checked with the Supervisor of Elections before the board meeting and he said in the last 10 years there has been five elections held the day after Labor Day.

As for the \$161,000 proposed to be spent on educational mailings, commercials and advertising, Commissioner Grant Maloy was successful in trimming that amount to \$121,600 after he brought pointed out the county only \$60,000 for a similar campaign on the trails and public lands referendum last November.

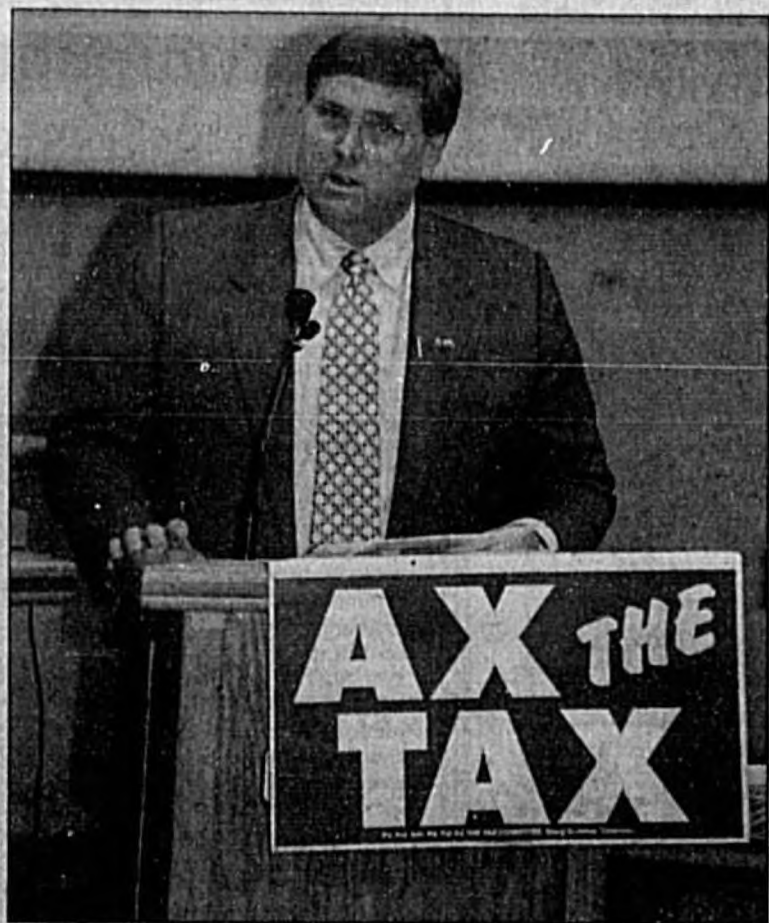
"I think it takes dissent, as well as advocacy, to create great ideas," Commissioner Carlton Henley said. "That's what makes America great; the right to dissent, but as county commissioner, we are faced with problems we have to solve."

Supporting the referendum were several key officials, including Superintendent of Seminole Schools Paul Haggerty and Sanford City Manager Tony VanDerworp.

"The idea of partnering that transcends all of this is not getting the attention it deserves," Haggerty said. "When we talk about the quality of life in Seminole County, one of the subliminal, intangible factors is that the county is working well together."

Eight schools will be renovated and two new schools will be built if the new sales tax is approved by county voters. The school system is set to receive \$133 million which will add more than 150 classrooms to the county's school system.

While all seven cities in

Seminole County, as well as the school system, signed off on the new referendum — compared to only four in 1991 — one mayor is not so sure the one-cent sales tax is best thing for the people.

"I abstained from voting when the mayors in Seminole voted on this at the Vision 2020 meeting," said Longwood Mayor Paul Lovestrang. "I don't vote for tax increases, and I don't recommend them to people. They used to fund highways without sales taxes. What happened to that money?"

"The only way to control government is to cut-off the supply of money," Lovestrang added. "Sure, it (the new sales tax) will help us. We are currently improving our roads — it might take awhile longer but the extra money won't help us that much."

Each city is allocated a certain

percentage of the one cent sales tax for road improvements. Longwood is set to receive a little more than one percent or \$5.6 million.

Sanford is scheduled to receive \$15.7 million for projects VanDerworp labeled "vital to the city." Those included in the city's plans are intersection improvements to 13th Street and US Highway 17-92, which VanDerworp said was a "matter of public safety." Also important in Sanford's projected plans are improving the roads north of State Road 46, which VanDerworp said will help improve the business district in that area, and the Mulberry Avenue extension.

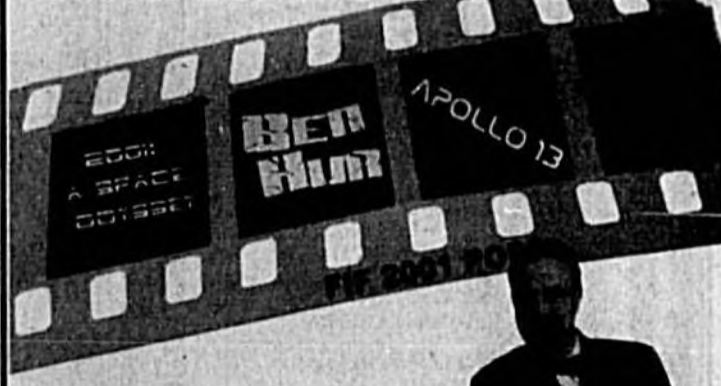

## Florida's often hostile environment doesn't mean grass can't grow

Not every turfgrass problem is necessary a disease problem. Improper cultural practices are many times responsible for the brown areas that are frequently found in many lawns. Unfortunately, the climate in Florida frequently favors disease development. Many of these diseases require similar environmental conditions to begin, as well as increase in severity and organisms that cause diseases are already present in the turfgrass.

In such a hostile environment, it seems almost impossible for the plants to survive but simple cultural practices that enhance plant vigor and increase tolerance to disease are the key to proper turf health.

**Diagnosis**  
 Turf diseases cannot be diagnosed by the shape or color of the spot. Disease symptoms can be confused with improper cultural practices, pesticide damage, nematode or insect injury. Brown areas that increase in size and spread to new areas may be induced by disease causing organisms.

Proper diagnosis of turf diseases requires laboratory analysis.

**Contributing Factors**  
 Diseases can be expected to occur on poorly maintained turf. Imbalances in nitrogen and potassium levels, as well as thatch accumulation, will result in less vigorous, more susceptible turfgrass. Periods of high humidity, over-irrigation, rain, heavy dew or fog will favor the incidence of many of the fungal diseases of turf as high moisture is needed on the plant surface for infection to take place.

**Mowing**  
 Improper mowing height and frequency can weaken the grass and lower its tolerance to disease. Dull mower blades inflict greater tissue damage than sharp blades. The damage is first evident as unsightly white to brown discoloration of the turf one to two days after mowing. The damaged tissue also provides an avenue through which pathogens may infect the grass. When a disease is active on a particular area of turfgrass, increase the mowing interval and collect clippings to avoid spreading the disease to other areas.

**Irrigation**  
 Irrigating early in the morning allows the grass to dry thor-

oughly before evening. This irrigation schedule reduces the time moisture is present on the leaves. Never water plants late in the afternoon, this will keep moisture on the plants for the longest period of time and will contribute to the development of diseases.

Turfgrass that enters the night period moist from irrigation is more inclined to become diseased.

Do not water turf-grasses lightly on a daily basis, wait until the turf begins to show signs of wilt before irrigating.

**Fertilization**  
 The susceptibility of turf-grasses to disease is also affected by nutrition. Properly fertilized grass is more resistant to disease and recovers faster if it should become diseased. In general, moderate fertilization and use of slow-release fertilizers should be practiced.

**Chemical Control**  
 Turfgrass diseases can be chemically controlled with proper use of fungicides. A uniform application over the entire planting is usually necessary and will be most effective if done early in disease development.

Most fungicides are effective for a relatively short time, often not more than 14 days. Sunlight, rain, irrigation water, and mowing affect the rate at which the protective chemical is broken down and removed from the plant. Repeat applications are often necessary to control a disease during periods when weather conditions favor disease.

Fungicides should always be used in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions on the product label. Information on the label includes the diseases for which the fungicide is effective, proper rates, cautions with respect to mixing with other chemicals, frequency of application, and safety precautions.

Some of the fungicides are effective only for control of specific diseases so it is important to obtain an accurate diagnosis in order to select an appropriate fungicide. Fungicides should be applied as needed for disease control as soon as possible after diagnosis.

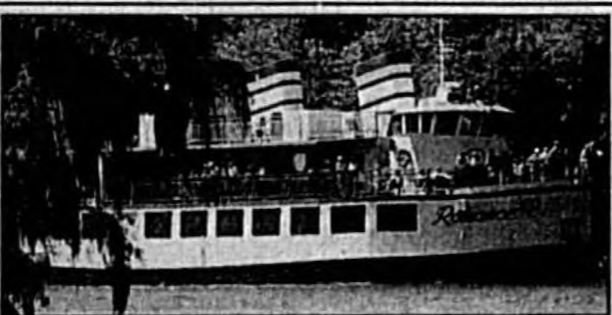

Craig, 23, of Orlando "leaning on the passenger door with his arms across his chest" in a 1988 Chevy Celebrity on the side of the road.

According to Klein, she observed Craig reach into his pants pockets, while she also noticed an unknown object in his pocket. Becoming alarmed for her safety, she ordered the suspect out

of the car. A subsequent search of Craig produced a fully-loaded silver handgun with a round in the chamber at his waist and extra ammunition in his pocket.

Also found in Craig's pockets were two cell phones and a large amount of cash totaling \$1,516. In a black backpack in the rear of the car, deputies found 272 grams of cocaine split into two large bags and 18 and a half pills of Ecstasy

in another bag.

Craig was charged with trafficking 200 or more grams of cocaine, possession with intent to distribute a controlled substance and carrying a concealed weapon.

"We're going to look into this guy's involvement in possible drug enterprise," said SCSO Public Information Officer Steve Olson. "A lot of times crimes are solved when criminals make mistakes. Certainly this guy passing out behind the wheel led to something interesting."

Ford and Sanford until they reached the dead end at Marker Street.

According to the police report, Merriman fled at the dead end, but not before deputies could catch him and his "green wool hat made into a mask (two eye holes cut out) and a freshly painted toy gun inside the mask."

Merriman was charged with robbery, resisting officer, fleeing, aggravated assault and public order crimes (wearing a hood or mask on the street). Edwards was charged with fleeing police and caused property damage to

several vehicles during the pursuit, according to police.

Search of the car and Merriman, produced several pieces of evidence including several crumpled up bills and fresh paint on Merriman's right hand "similar to the paint on the gun."

According to Nikki, the was the first robbery for the Altamonte Springs restaurant in 23 years of business. However, Nikki said several items had come up missing in the past sev-

eral weeks from the restaurant and also family owned Jones Trucking. The missing items she said were cases of ribs, change from the register, a computer and an air compressor.

"We don't know if it was him, but someone told us he was trying to sell him a computer and air compressor," Nikki said.

County's history. "You can't tell history without both sides," Batman said.

Each year, County Commission allocates funds for four historical markers within the county, Batman said. Last month, the Historical Commission dedicated two other markers, including Belair and Forest City.

The placement of a historical marker is decided by the Historical Commission, which prioritizes requests and locations, Historical Commission Vice Chairman John Bistline said. Markers can commemorate historical towns, cities, people, businesses or other items of historical significance.

Each marker costs between \$1,300 and \$1,400, Bistline said.

The Commission also has to get permission from a property owner before it can be placed.

"We try to choose a location where people can see them," he said. "The first ones we had were mostly of battlefields, and they were kind of out of the way."

Today, historical markers can be found in every corner of Seminole County. The Commission's goal is to tell Seminole's story to local residents and visitors.

"We hope to inspire people to know Seminole County's heritage," Bistline said. "We want to get people involved and hopefully educate them."

The Bass Tracker boats will be rented through Turkey Lake Park as part of the FISH ORLANDO! boat loaner program co-sponsored by the City of Orlando, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) and Bass Pro Shops in Orlando.

The first day the boats will be available for use by the general public is June 30. The cost is \$5 per boat per day, and normal operating hours will be Thursday through Sunday, one hour before first light until 11 a.m. To make a reservation using a credit card, call 407-299-1248.

"This is the only program of its kind that I know of in Florida where people can rent a fishing boat for only \$5. 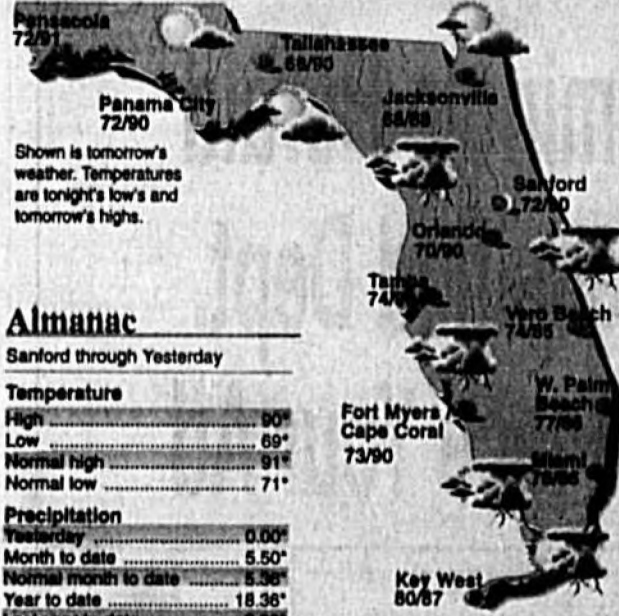

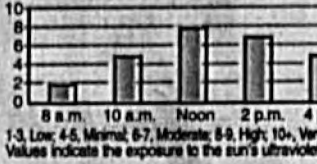
