**Petitions Due Against Annex At Casselberry**

Carl King, of King Brothers Construction Company, a Coconino firm that proposes to construct and operate an 84-unit apartment complex on the 40-acre site of the Casselberry, attempted to convince a gathering of residents in the area during a recent meeting that the project would be beneficial to property values in that area.

But today, one of the residents, Julia Stutzman, said petitions would be circulated among city and county residents surrounding Lake Kathryn for presentation to the Casselberry Planning Board as well as the Casselberry City Council.

"The petition," said Stutzman, spokesman for the group, "will not prevent the annexation of the property into the City of Casselberry but will object to any efforts on the part of King Brothers or any other group to change the zoning from R-1 to R-2 to permit the construction of multiple dwellings."

King told Lake Kathryn residents the complex would be composed of 84 units in quadrangles. Fifty-two would be one-bedroom units and 32 would have two bedrooms. The cost of construction would run about \$7,500 per unit or approximately \$630,000 for the entire project. King said he had already received a firm commitment of \$100,000 from the President Mutual Life Insurance Co., Philadelphia. "This," he said, "represents about 15 percent of the estimated value of the project." King added that all units would be air conditioned and that the complex would have street lighting, paved streets, fire plugs and sewerage pits and police and fire protection.

King told the Lake Kathryn residents that he had been advised by Robert Brown, head of the County Zoning office, to make an effort to get the property annexed into Casselberry in order to have police and fire protection. King said he purchased the property for \$250,000. "If I am not able to build apartments," he stated, "we have an alternative of utilizing the seven acres for the construction of 38 homes with FHA financing."

When questioned about FHA financing the loan for the apartment complex, King said that information which had indicated the FHA would insure his loan from President Mutual through General Guaranty of Orlando was erroneous. "This," he stressed "is strictly a conventional type loan. But if I build houses I will be forced to get FHA backing."

The Lake Kathryn residents, however, for the most part opposed the project on the grounds that it would create unnecessary congestion on the lake. Stutzman said that the 48-acre lake presently is surrounded by some 30 homes. There is a potential of about 80 homes. "I believe," Stutzman explained, "that residents are taking every opportunity to present his case in an effort to ward off the opposition which is brewing. However, it's my opinion that he was not successful. We are preparing petitions which will be circulated very shortly to try to stop the annexation and the rezoning of this property. We cannot see where such a project will do anything to enhance the Lake Kathryn community and, therefore, since it was some 2 1/2 miles from the zoning to be amended."

**Public Education Costs Third Of State's Income**

TALLAHASSEE (UPI) — Public school education in Florida last year cost the state about one-third of its total income.

The schools cost more than the state collected from the three per cent sales tax, the primary source of the state's money.

The state comptroller's annual report of county finances released today said it cost the state \$264,978,275 to operate the schools in 1965. At the same time the state collected \$260,524,474 from the sales tax.

Florida's total revenue in 1965 from the major sources, came to \$648,404,477. The schools, including junior colleges but not universities, got about one-third of this.

Dade county, the biggest county, was the biggest spender of the state's money in 1965. Dade got \$40,875,847 for its schools. Duval, second largest county, got \$20,000,000. Hillsborough was third with \$18,416,022. Broward got \$16,489,484 and Pinellas was fifth with \$16,377,133.

The 67 counties spent \$253,162,076 of their own money on the schools, the report said.

The comptroller's report also said the counties received more than \$7 million from these federal school programs.

This included \$4,687,766 for the school lunch program, \$1,547,196 for the school milk program and \$2,111,074 from the National Defense Education Act.

Total expenditures for the schools in 1965 was \$502,278,221.

**Jet Set Buzzes: Jackie To Wed!**

SEVILLE, Spain (UPI) — Two of America's most famous beauties—Mrs. John F. Kennedy and Princess Grace of Monaco—slept the show at the international Fiesta de Sevilla debutante ball last night, but had little chance to socialize with each other.

Thousands of guests danced into the wee hours of the morning, but Mrs. Kennedy left the party at the casino for Spain—hour of 2:30 a. m. Princess said she was very tired after having hopped from Argentina to New York and off again to Spain in three days.

She also may have been troubled by reports buzzing through Europe saying she planned to announce her engagement to Spanish diplomat Don Antonio Carrizosa y Diaz Casabate, 42.

The rumors were emphatically denied by close friends of the former First Lady and by her mother, Mrs. Hugh Auchincloss, Garrigues, formerly Spanish ambassador to Washington, has long been friendly with the Kennedy family. He is now the Spanish ambassador to the Holy See.

In Rome, Garrigues declined to comment on the romance reports, saying, "It is the duty of a gentleman not to reply to such questions."

## Artificial Heart Keeps Man Alive

HOUSTON (UPI)—Famed surgeon Dr. Michael DeBakey today inserted an artificial heart into a human being for the first time in an effort to save his life.

The artificial heart, a pump with tubes that are inserted into the chest to take over the pumping function of an ailing heart, was kept on a standby basis as DeBakey and a team of surgeons exposed the heart of a patient at Methodist Hospital.

Surgery was to replace a medical team from Baylor and Rice Universities in Houston estimated a by-pass pump could help 75 to 90 per cent of all heart attack victims. An estimated 900,000 Americans die every year of heart ailments, which are the nation's No. 1 killer.

A different type bypass was tried at Methodist Hospital several years ago. The patient did not live.

## Insult Added To Injury

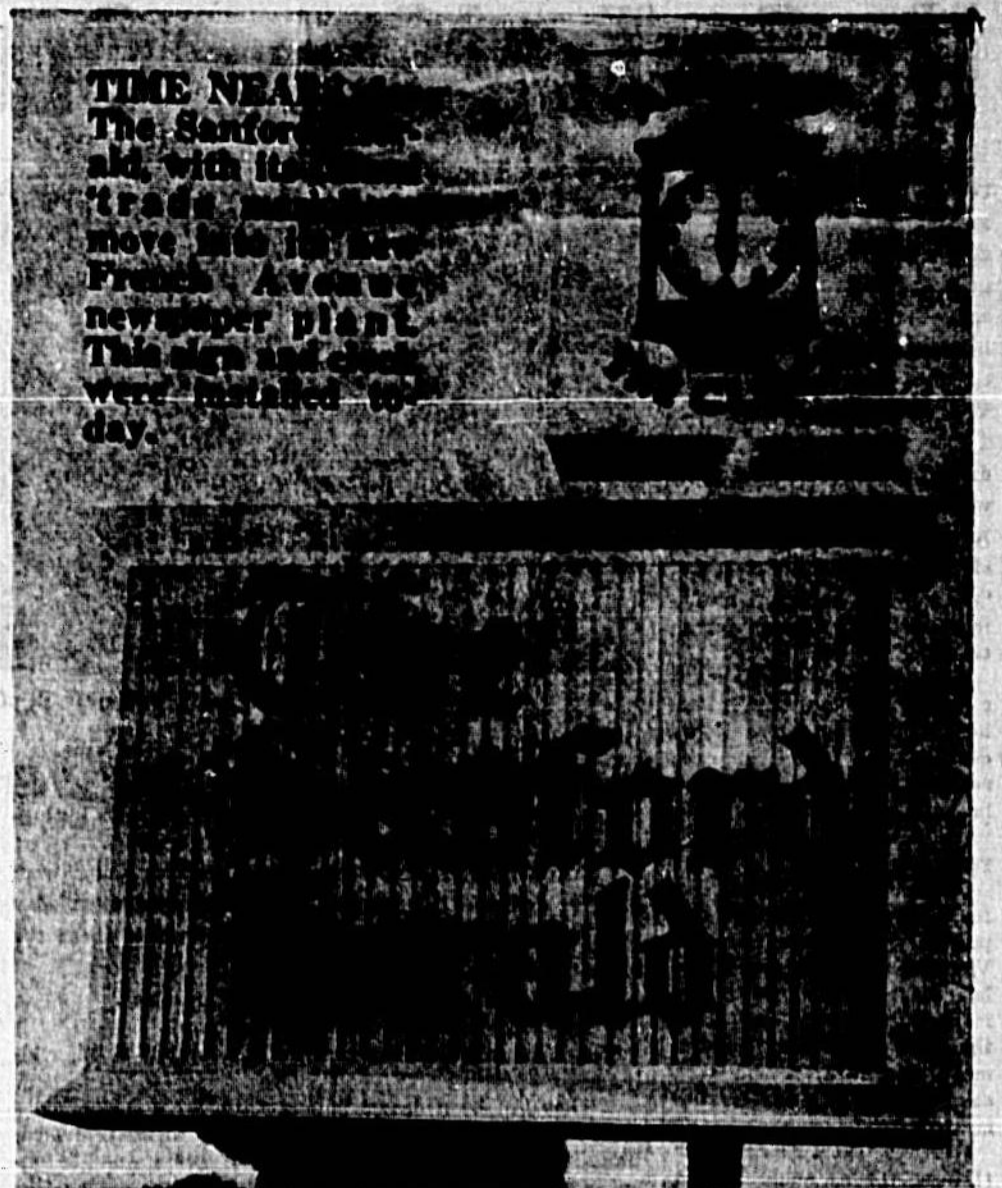
AUXERRE, France (UPI)—Jail officials got a male from a prisoner who escaped last week.
