MIAMI BEACH, Fla., Feb. 25.—(INS)—A little blonde haired kid of 15, boys' tennis champion of the United States, met the Olympic double champions, Francis Hunter and Vincent Richards here on the Flamingo courts yesterday afternoon and paired with William Tilden and, won through to a victory in the most interesting exhibition match of the winter season.
