

Those terms have sometimes become hackneyed and meaningless as applied to real estate which had nothing to justify their use, but as applied to High-land Park, they are of vital significance and indicate the many things which render this development really distinct and different from any other in Sanford, and set it apart in a class by itself.

The name, Highland Park, expresses two of the main features which make it different from all others, for it is indeed Sanford's highlands, water flowing from it in all directions, north, south, east and west, and instead of the conventional checker board street lay out of the ordinary town lot subdivision, its entire surface is landscaped as a park, and within its borders are three areas devoted exclusively to park purposes, all of them actually under development, and one of them

RAINBOW GARDEN AND POOL on Colonial Way, near French Avenue, has been nearly completed at a cost of several thousand dollars. All around this garden has been set a hedge of Hibiscus and Alamanda. Flame Vines have been planted at the feet of the trees growing inside and on the building lots surrounding. An Azelea garden has been planted. Cannas have been set in a five foot bed around one side of the circle. Sweet Peas and Nasturtiums are growing around the other half of the circle. Yellow Jasmine Vines are growing by the rustic summer house. A fountain sorings from an imitation Calla Lilly in the center of the beautiful pool, and all over the water's surface are now blooming white and yellow flowers. Tropical Lillies, white, purple, red, pink, blue and yellow have been planted in the pool. A water sprinkler system is installed all over the area, and the plants alone which have been set in and around this garden cost nearly \$500. They do not make much show now, but in two or three years this pool and the gardens around it will be surpassingly beautiful.

SWAN OVAL, another of the parks, just within the Main Entrance at Elm and Hughey, occupies the most commanding situation in the city for a public park.

A fountain costing nearly \$2,000.00 stands at its northern end.

More than 6,000 flower plants, Phlox and Petunias, have just been set around its borders, a water sprinkler system has been installed, and in a few weeks, if we have no more freeezing weather, it will be among the most beautiful features of this show place of Sanford.

REVONAH PARK covering a full block at the southeastern corner of the property, bounded by Oak and Franklin on the east and south, and Revonah Circle on the north and west, will be for the exclusive use of owners of property in Highland Park. Here will eventually be erected a club house, courts for tennis, roque and croquet, and a swimming pool, a part of the work already having been done on the latter.

MORE THAN A THOUSAND FLOWERING SHRUBS are growing in my nursery rows, and these, with palms and shade trees, will be set out along the drives all over Highland Park. This planting will not be hap-haz-ard, as must always be the case when the planting between the curb and side walk is left to the individual taste, or entire lack of taste or to the whim or caprice of the lot owners along the street, many of whom do not even plant at all; but will be under a single control and will follow a carefully matured design, harmonious, artistic, and as time goes by and Nature carries on her work, an environment will be created that will attract to the two hundred home sites of Highland Park a group of kindred spirits whose beautiful homes and the grounds surrounding them will reflect the ideals of beauty in which this superb development has been conceived and is being carried out.

ALL OF THESE THINGS made Highland Park distinctive, different and in a class by itself, but there are others,

IT IS CLOSE IN, being exactly midway between the northern and southern city limits, and with Sanford growing at its present rate, sure to be right in the center of the built up part of the city very soon.

IT IS FAR REMOVED FROM THE SMOKE and soot and noise and unsightliness of railroad trains. As the population of the state and county grow, the railroads running through the residential part of Sanford will become more and more objectionable. In what other city can one find fine homes built near the railroads?

IT IS AN ADVANTAGE TO HIGHLAND PARK that the new high school is only two blocks away, but it is much better that it is two blocks instead of one.

IT IS AN ADVANTAGE TO HIGHLAND PARK that its winding drives will tend to keep out heavy traffic, which will naturally follow the straight avenues surrounding it, thue tending to seclusion and to keep it apart in a class by itself.

IT IS AN ADVANTAGE TO HIGHLAND PARK that it lies in the center of the broad white belt extend-ing south and over which the city's greatest growth and development must of necessity proceed.

BUILDING RERSTRICTIONS are absolutely essential to any high class residential development. The cost of the houses to be built is one of the restrictions that are designed for your protection but is by no means the most important. Your neighbor can not an noy you with chickens or cows or other live stock. In a word, the restrictions set forth in every deed to lots in Highland Park are for your potection.

The Prices set on lots in Highland Park a year ago were very conservative at the time. They are conservative still. Some day, and that day not very far away, they will sell for two or three times as much, and the prices fixed at first, I expect to maintain until they advance, but this applies to lots that may be bought to hold. If you want to build, that is something else again. The stage is all set for building to begin in Highland Park. All the city utilities are actually in. All the paving is complete or under way. The development is proceeding all along the line, and


