Friend: Cop and dealer were lovers

**Sanford Police Officer
Darlene Ladoczky's
'best friend' testifies
against her**

ORLANDO — Wiping away tears, Darlene Ladoczky's best friend testified Monday she warned the Sanford police

officer to break off a relationship with convicted cocaine dealer Antonio Holley.

Ladoczky, 34, a 12-year veteran of the Sanford Police Department, is accused of providing Holley, 26, with sex, drugs, and confidential police information.

Kelly Wells, a community service officer for the Sanford police, who describes Ladoczky as her "best friend," was the final witness for the prosecution on Monday. She said Ladoczky and Holley were "lovers"

while Ladoczky lived in Wells' home. Assistant US Attorney Matt Perry closed his case Monday. The defense will call witnesses today, including Darlene and Robert Ladoczky. Defense attorney Charles Greene said he expects make closing statements today.

Between April and October 1998, Wells testified Ladoczky lived in her Sanford home while separated from her husband, Longwood Police Officer Robert Ladoczky. Wells said Ladoczky confided she was dating Holley. Ladoczky also said she had sex with

Holley, and was in love with him, Wells testified.

"She asked me whether I thought a criminal, a drug dealer, could change and become a good person," Wells said.

Wells said she responded by warning Ladoczky she is compromising herself and her career.

"She told me it was her life, she's a big girl, and she was going to live it exactly as she wanted to," Wells said.

On one occasion during an afternoon in mid-1999, Wells said she saw Ladoczky and Holley together in Ladoczky's patrol car.

"Darlene was in her patrol car, and Tony was leaning over in the passenger side," Wells said.

Wells testified she recognized Ladoczky's handwriting on a police business card found in Holley's car. **See Lovers, Page 4A**

Personnel issues slow budget plan

LONGWOOD — Longwood city commissioners met in a five-hour marathon Monday night, piecing together the initial framework for the city's Fiscal Year 2000/2001 spending plan. Shortly before midnight their answers to requests by various division heads for additional personnel this year was met with "yes, no and maybe."

By a vote of 3-2 the board approved a request by Police Chief Tom Jackson for the addition of two additional police officers with a promise "maybe" to consider two more prior to final budget adoption. The board agreed unanimously with City Administrator John Drago's recommendation of "no" to any new hires in the

City Clerk's office and Public Works Division.

Commissioners also gave a unanimous "maybe" to Fire Chief Charlie Chapman's request for three additional paramedics to ease what he termed a critical shortage in staffing for the city's ambulance crews. The Fire Division is expected to have a new ambulance, approved in last year's budget, operational and on the road in less than a month.

"If city staff can't convince the city administrator of the need for additional people, then we shouldn't be looking over his shoulder."

Personnel decisions led to lengthy debates among commissioners and signaled split priorities among board members. In a department-by-department breakdown, Drago initially recommended no new hires to the city's payroll for the next year, drawing support from

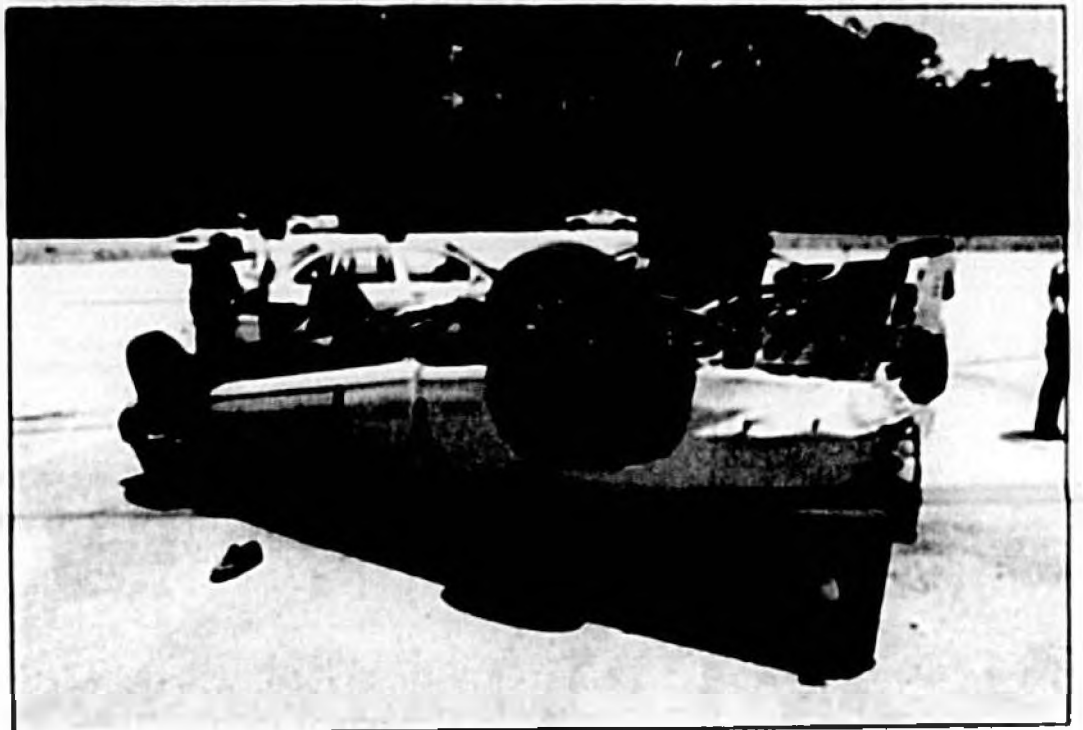

I-4 ramp will be closed again

The experimental closure of the eastbound Interstate-4 ramp, where U.S. Highway 17-92 crosses I-4, west of Sanford, didn't do what was hoped. While the closure did take place Wednesday, June 14, from noon until 8 p.m., the Florida Department of Transportation says it "did not provide an accurate comparison of traffic conditions on eastbound I-4

during the afternoon rush hour."

The reasons given included heavy rains that fell in certain areas just prior to the peak afternoon traffic hours, and a vehicular accident on the Volusia County side of the St. Johns River, which also delayed traffic in the area.

DOT spokesman Steve Homan says the experiment will now have to be rescheduled for a future Wednesday. Wednesday has been selected as

a baseline of traffic counts, established prior to the original experimental closure.

The DOT will issue a further directive on the closure rescheduling as soon as it is established.

The 17-92 ramp is extremely short for motorists entering the Interstate in an eastbound direction just before the bridge, and has been determined as the cause of many traffic accidents, especially during peak traffic hours.

Bravo courting second term

SANFORD — During a court session on Monday, Judge Carmine Bravo showed considerable empathy to a 18-year-old who was accompanied by his grandmother.

The judge told the young man to obey and honor the grandmother.

And, he sent them off for a better tomorrow.

"There are lots of grandmas who are taking care of kids," said Bravo, who is completing his first 4-year term as a County Court judge. "I believe there are times when a judge has to be tough, stern. There are times, too, to be sympathetic. It's called old-fashioned justice."

Judge Bravo has raised six children and has two grandchildren. Seeking a second term (which will be for six years) he qualified to be on the ballot by turning in 1,869 verified signatures on Friday.

Sandra Goard, the County Elections Supervisor, said that

Bravo is the first county judge to qualify by collecting signatures. Those running for a judicial seat can either pay the qual-

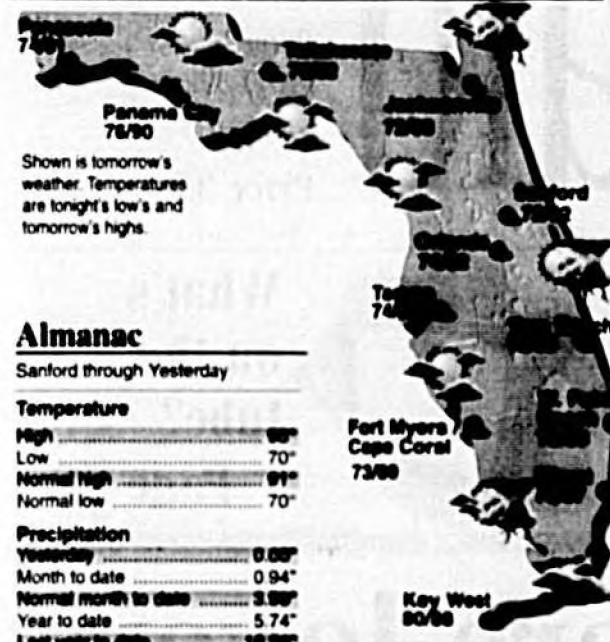
ifying fee (one fourth their salary) or collect petitions.

Ike was the most enthusiastic golfer who ever lived in the White House. He had his own putting green, and guess who putted on it a couple of times. That's right. I've still got one of Ike's balls. Ike "Mr. President" written on it.

My goal was to shoot a sub 90 round. A legitimate sub 90. No winter rules, gimmies or mulligans. I

succeeded at the Army Navy Country Club in Arlington, Va., where I produced an 84. Actually, it was an 88 but my memory isn't what it used to be.

I aced a hole once — sadly, it was the fifth hole. That wasn't the hole I was playing. My drive from the third tee had a mind and proceeded to the sixth tee, of course.

Jack Nicklaus and I are the same age. You probably heard of him. Poor guy is no Tiger Woods either. He's just about finished. He's had hip replacement and they say the U.S. Open at Pebble Beach was probably his last. Old Jack is out of Open exemptions. Me, too.

You may be wondering why I gave up golf as a 17-year-old with such a bright future in the sport. Well, for one thing I was too noisy. Whenever I came up with a double bogey or a triple on a par-5, I used to yell out, "Whoopee." There would only be a couple "Whoopees" per round. It wasn't like I was celebrating every other hole.

On Saturday, marveling at the play of Tiger Woods, I was able to "whoop" for him like I wasn't allowed to "whoop" for me. Every hole he played was a "Whoopee." Except for the one he hit the ball into the Pacific Ocean. Tiger said enough for both of us when that happened.

Bravo and Judge Donald Marblestone are seeking re-election this year. Judge Frederick Hitt is retiring, however. Bravo and Marblestone are unopposed. Jeff Dean and Mark Herr and vying for Hitt's position.

"When I'm asked who's running in that race, I tell them him and Herr," Bravo said, laughing. With his white hair a sign of wisdom and quick sense of humor, Bravo is not at all intimidating — but that's before he puts on his judicial robe and

enters the court room. His business is administering justice. You get what you deserve from Carmine M. Bravo.

The judge, a native of Rome, N.Y., graduated from the University of Miami in 1966 and from Suffolk University Law School in 1969. He practiced as an attorney, arbitrator and mediator for more than 25 years before becoming a judge. He has been a member of the Florida Bar since 1969. He has served as chairman of the Community Initiative for

Prevention of Domestic Violence Education Committee.

Bravo said that many who are victims of domestic violence are so terrified by those who are abusing them that they are compelled to lie when being asked questions by a judge.

"They are more afraid of their abuser than they are of those trying to help them," Bravo said. "A woman came in recently — she was in a wheelchair after being beaten — and she told me she had lied in court. That she was that afraid."

"She told me, 'He beat me up again.' The guy was arrested again. This time, he got what was coming to him."

"I want them to be sure they are safe and secure," Bravo said.

possession, containing her home phone number and Holley's pager number.

She also testified she was present "multiple times" when Ladoczky and Holley spoke on the phone. She described the calls as "basically boyfriend-girlfriend type conversations," adding that Ladoczky called Holley "her honey." She estimated Holley stood up Ladoczky six to eight times at restaurants and clubs.

During cross examination by defense attorney Charles Greene, Wells said she never saw Ladoczky with crack cocaine. She also said she never saw Ladoczky commit a crime.

Phone records presented Monday by the prosecution indicate there were 308 calls from Ladoczky's cell phone to Holley's cell phone from August 1998 to November 1999. In addition, the records show there were 276 calls

from Holley's cell phone to Ladoczky during the same period.

However, under defense cross examination, DEA special agent Lee Madream admitted some calls may have been counted twice. On Holley's cell phone records, there is no way to tell whether he placed the call or Ladoczky placed the call. There is no record of phone calls between Holley and Ladoczky before August 1998.

On Feb. 16, the federal Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) conducted a briefing at the Sanford Police Department, in a room designed as a test for Ladoczky, according to testimony by Madream.

During the briefing, federal agents told four Sanford police officers, including Ladoczky, that search warrants were being issued for Holley's associate Corey Johnson and his girlfriend

Wanda Grooms. Ladoczky approached Madream 20 minutes after the briefing. She did not call Johnson or Grooms to warn them, Madream said.

She admitted she had one previous conversation with Grooms. However, Madream said the DEA had conducted three previous taped phone calls between Grooms and Ladoczky on Jan. 28, Jan. 29 and Feb. 11.

Madream said Ladoczky admitted going on two dates with Holley, but denied giving him an ounce of crack cocaine. She also denied telling Grooms that police vehicles were following her during a phone conversation on Feb. 28.

Madream testified Ladoczky told him she "would have done whatever he (Holley) wanted her to do," and admitted disclosing police information. However, she denied having a sexual relationship with Holley.

Judge bars Wimberly's testimony

ORLANDO — The testimony of a second drug dealer who says he had sex and received confidential information from Sanford Police Officer Darlene Ladoczky was not permitted on Monday.

Julian Wimberly, 24, who has been arrested 17 times since graduating from Lyman High School, testified during a hearing Monday — without the 12-member jury present — he had sex with Ladoczky in her Sanford home, and received tips from her on police investigations.

Following the hour-long hearing, US District Judge Patricia Fawcett ruled against allowing the prosecution to present Wimberly's allegations. However, Fawcett left the door open for prosecution to request that Wimberly testify in the future.

"The witness (Wimberly) doesn't go to (the charges)," Fawcett said. "The witness just goes to 'I had sex with her.'"

Ladoczky is charged with one count of conspiracy to possess with intent to distribute crack cocaine, two counts of lying to federal agents, and carrying a firearm during a drug trafficking

offense. If convicted, she could serve 15 years to life in federal prison.

This is not the first time Wimberly has gained notoriety for discussing a sexual relationship. He previously appeared on an episode of *Richi Lake* entitled "My sister is sleeping with my girlfriend."

Defense attorney Charles Greene argued that allowing Wimberly to testify would make the jury biased against Ladoczky.

"This has nothing to do with the issues in the case," Greene said. "But, if the jury hears this, it's going to be highly inflammatory. It's going to push them over the edge."

Assistant US Attorney Matt Perry countered that Wimberly's allegations demonstrate Ladoczky's willingness to assist a drug dealer in criminal activities.

"She knew he was a drug dealer," Perry said. "She was having sexual relations with him. She was offering him protection, the same way she was protecting Mr. Holley."

Meanwhile, Wimberly denied an allegation that convicted cocaine dealer Armando Holley, 26, has tried to influence him to lie in the case. Holley has accused Ladoczky of providing him with sex, confidential police information, and an ounce of crack cocaine which he claims he sold for \$1,000.

Greene, Ladoczky's defense attorney, said he received an anonymous phone call Thursday night and was told Holley called Wimberly's friend Kim Conti, asking her to have Wimberly lie.

The caller claimed Holley asked Conti to talk with Wimberly's grandmother, Jennifer Demps, and have her influence Wimberly to lie, Greene said.

Conti testified she did not receive such a phone call from Holley.

Defense attorney Charles Greene said Wimberly placed threatening phone calls, including bomb threats, to the Sanford home of Darlene Ladoczky and her husband, Longwood Police Officer Robert Ladoczky. He denied that Ladoczky and Wimberly had a relationship.

"I know where you live, what your husband does, and I'm going to get you," Greene said. Wimberly told the couple in the phone calls.

Wimberly testified during the hearing wearing a Seminole County jail uniform. He is jailed for violation of probation, and was chained at the ankles. He denied making threats against Ladoczky.

He claimed he met Darlene Ladoczky in April 1996 after he was arrested for sale and delivery of crack cocaine. She was his case agent, and he said on Ladoczky's advice he pleaded guilty.

Wimberly was working on the first floor of Sanford City Hall at the time, while Ladoczky, 34, was also stationed there as part of the police department's Special I.

Sanford Police Community Service Officer Kelly Wells, who described Ladoczky as her "best friend," testified during the hearing she saw Ladoczky and Wimberly in an intimate embrace in 1996 at a Winn-Dixie shopping plaza on 15th Street in Sanford.

"She leaned up against her vehicle, and he leaned up against her," Wells said.

Failure to timely file a petition shall constitute a waiver of any right to request an administrative proceeding as a petitioner under Sections 120.569 and 120.57, F.S. If a petition is filed, the purpose of the administrative hearing will be to present evidence and testimony and forward a recommended order to the Department. If no petition is filed, this Notice of Intent shall become final agency action.

If a petition is filed, other affected persons may petition for leave to intervene in the proceeding. A petition for intervention must be filed at least twenty (20) days before the final hearing and must include all of the information and contents described in Uniform Rule 28-106-201, F.A.C. The petition leave to intervene shall be filed at the Division of Administrative Hearings, Department of Management Services, 1230 Apalachee Parkway, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-1550. Louise Nixon, a three-year resident of Stanford Centre in Altamonte Springs, will celebrate her 100th birthday in June. Nixon was born in Clinton, Md., where she lived with her husband, Victor, and their three daughters. She came to Florida to retire and became prominent in the Orlando community. She served as president of the city's garden club and was a member of the Orlando Chamber of Commerce for many years.

Technology is advancing very rapidly and the Internet is becoming part of our daily life. It is not surprising that University of Florida specialists are using a new system that utilizes digital cameras and the World Wide Web to send photographs of insects and diseased plants from the field to the lab for rapid diagnosis and identification.

The Beginning

The DDIS started with a strange plant in a Monticello homeowner's backyard. When a person had an allergic reaction to some vines he was trimming, he called Jefferson County Extension Office to verify if the vines could cause him to swell up.

The agent, unable to find the information, sent a digital picture of the plant to the herbarium at the University of Florida. When, only 40 minutes later, he got a positive identification back from the herbarium, the agent knew he was onto something.

The Next Step

E-mailing digital images is definite a revolutionary way to

diagnose problems in the field. To take it to the next level, University of Florida scientists realized that a more effective way of developing a diagnostic system based on digital images would be to move it to the Web.

The e-mail-based system requires a large amount of time and memory to send and store images over e-mail. The Web-based DDIS program compresses the images even further than e-mail and sends them in about half the time.

The DDIS

Researchers, extension agents and software developers with UF's Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences developed the Distance Diagnostics and Identification System, or DDIS, to speed up identification of plants, pests and physiological disorders. Until now, reliable diagnosis meant mailing plant material to UF labs, which often caused costly delays.

Ordinarily, it takes at least two days to a week to get a response back on a sample that's been mailed out for

diagnosis. Using DDIS, the turnaround time can be reduced from a matter of days to a matter of minutes.

While the DDIS may not rule out the necessity of sending physical samples in every case, its archive eventually will become a powerful educational tool for extension agents. The benefits will reach from consumers and homeowners all the way to commercial growers, where pests and diseases can cost tens of thousands of dollars.

The Archives

With the motto "If you can take a picture of it, you can send it to the archive," UF specialist developed a program around an object-searchable database, which makes it possible to store images in a centralized archive shared by UF extension agents and specialists. The archive will give agents a wealth of knowledge that can eventually be used to diagnose a problem on-site.

The database is searchable through a broad range of categories such as individual diseases, crops, counties or symptoms. Because the archive is accessible through the Web, the images will be easy to pull off for a wide range of instructional purposes.

Positive Experiences

When we were asked to identify a flowering tree, it became clear that sending a living sample to the UF's herbarium presented some challenging problems.

Instead, digital pictures of the blossoms and leaves were sent to the herbarium. The next day we had an answer confirming the identity of the tree.

In another occasion, a spiny vine was brought to our lab and again we sent a digital picture of the plant to the UF's herbarium. The plant was identified as a tropical leafy cactus.

The Future

The DDIS is now available at extension agencies throughout Florida. Currently, agents in 10 counties are testing the next phase of the project, which will equip county agents with digital cameras, stereoscopes, and microscopes to produce more accurate, detailed images for diagnosis.

FWC stocking Lake Talquin with large-mouth bass

TALLAHASSEE - The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) is conducting an experimental large-mouth bass stocking program on Lake Talquin, a 18,000-acre Shupe man-made reservoir near Tallahassee.

The agency plans to stock 80,000 to 100,000 3- to 4-inch largemouth bass fingerlings this spring to help increase Talquin's bass population between drawdowns.

During April and early May, nearly 70,000 bass had been released into the lake.

Because Talquin's water levels are stabilized, it requires drawdowns every seven to 10 years to mimic high and low water conditions found in natural lakes. Past drawdowns in 1984, 1991 and 1998 have proved beneficial, but short-lived because the lake's vegetation disappears after one year.

"Without abundant vegetation to provide bass cover and food, only a few will survive their first year," said Charlie Measing, a freshwater fisheries biologist with the FWC. "Talquin has limited aquatic vegetation to provide habitat for young bass because of its depth, turbidity

and lack of water fluctuations."

The FWC has experimented with stocking large-mouth bass in the past with no substantial success because its fish hatcheries did not have the technology to produce larger fingerlings.

Recently, however, the agency's hatcheries have developed the technology to raise larger numbers of larger-sized bass.

Measing said the size of the bass fingerlings is important, because the fish must be large enough to feed on shad larvae, the primary forage in Talquin. If they were any smaller, they would not survive due to the lack of vegetation for cover and food.

After bass hatch, they feed on microscopic zooplankton, switch to insects and finally to fish. Producing larger bass in the hatchery allows biologists to bypass the critical stages of feeding on zooplankton and insects.

"Timing is also important because largemouth bass must be large enough at stocking to feed on the shad before the shad grow too large to eat," Measing said. "Generally, the threadfin shad spawn on

O'Neal, Bryant lead rally as Lakers win NBA title

LOS ANGELES - Shaquille O'Neal became only the third person in history to win the Most Valuable Player in the regular season, All-Star Game and NBA Finals and Kobe Bryant hit a big jump shot and four free throws in the final minute as the Los Angeles Lakers rallied from a third quarter deficit to defeat the Indiana Pacers, 116-111, and win the NBA Championship at the Staples Center Monday night.

Taking over in an exciting fourth quarter that ended Larry Bird's coaching career, O'Neal and Bryant led the Lakers over the Pacers in Game 6 of the NBA Finals for the franchise's first title since 1988.

The victory gave Lakers coach Phil Jackson his seventh coaching title — his first without Michael Jordan — and ninth overall (he also won twice as a player) in just his first season coaching a team that had been ousted from the playoffs in each of the first three seasons since O'Neal and Bryant arrived.

O'Neal scored 41 points, marking the third time he scored 40 or more in this series.

Bryant had 26 including four free throws that clinched it in the final 13 seconds.

Even though they trailed for most of the first three quarters and were down by five points entering the fourth quarter, against a better shooting, more experienced opponent, the Lakers were the superior team down the stretch.

Indiana tied the game at 103-103 on a three-pointer by Jalen Rose with 5:04 left, but that was the beginning of the end.

Robert Horry, who won his third career title, hit a leaver from the lane, and Ron Harper, who won his fourth, stole the ball on the Pacers' next possession.

O'Neal hit a soft 10-footer from the baseline. Rose missed on a drive and Bryant calmly sank a 20-footer with 3:28 left.

The Pacers then went to the Hack-a-Shaq defensive strategy, sending O'Neal to the line four times in a span of 21 seconds. He missed three of them

before Jackson took him out with 2:27 left.

When O'Neal returned with 1:56 left, the Lakers' lead was down to 110-107 and Indiana had the ball. Austin Croshere was fouled with 1 second left on the shot clock and made both to make it a one-point game.

Glenn Rice answered with two free throws. Croshere airballed a turnaround jumper. Bryant missed a drive and Reggie Miller rushed a long three-pointer and missed.

Bryant then was isolated at the top of the key and was hacked on a drive. He calmly made both free throws with 13 seconds left for a 114-109 lead.

Dale Davis dunked for Indiana to make it a three-point game with 5.4 seconds left. But Bryant again went to the line and calmly sank two more to clinch it.

Rice added 16 for the Lakers, who outscored Indiana 37-27 in the fourth quarter.

Heard had 29, Miller 25, Davis 20 and Austin Croshere 16 for the Pacers, whose quest for the franchise's first NBA title came up short.

Talquin occurs during May. Newly hatched ahd are less than 0.4 inches in length and can be easily eaten by 3- to 4-inch bass."

Stocking largemouth bass is only one part of the Lake Talquin management plan. In addition, the FWC is reducing the bass harvest and will evaluate the potential to increase the amount of aquatic vegetation during non-drawdown years.

SHUPE'S SCOOP

Fisheries management is critical for future generations in Florida, and the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission plays a vital role in this process.

FISHING FORECAST

Catch and release snook action is good at Sebastian Inlet with fish to over 20 pounds. Some fish are beginning to show just off the beach area in preparation for spawning. Large live shrimp or small baitfish are top choices. Also expect trout, redfish and a few flounder and tarpon.

River action is steady in spite of the heat. Low water levels make fish easier to locate. River fish tend to group up in deep bends or sections of deeper water that is near a shallow feeding area. Watch blue herons and other wading birds, because they always stage at areas where baitfish are plentiful.

Gamefish will not be far away.

Captain Jack at Port Canaveral reports that offshore fish has been erratic with dolphin. King mackerel can be found on Pelican Flats and 8 A reefs. Tripletail are in the buoy line, while sheepshead and flounder are biting inside the Port. Trout and redfish are rated as fair in the Banana and Indian rivers.

Live or dead shrimp will not last long in the waters of Ponce Inlet. Sheepshead, drum, redfish, jack crevalle and small bluefish are ready and waiting. Trout and redfish are rated as good in Mosquito Lagoon.

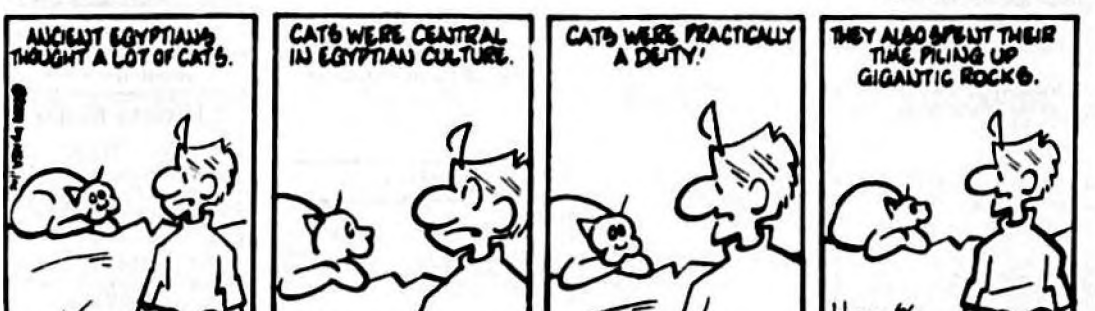
