"Negative" Press

Howard K. Smith, who should know better, has said regarding l'affaire Agnew that American journalism does indeed have a "negative" tradition and that it does not tell enough about "what is right about the country."

This is a familiar enough complaint, but is It true? And if it is true, just how true is it? It is true that journalism in America is essentially negative in its mission, but this is true of almost everywhere except where there exists a government-controlled press guaranteed to accentuate the positive for so long as a particular government is in power.

But is the American press more negative than that, say, of France, whose journalistic history has been shaped in large measure by its party press? Howard K. Smith, who is widely traveled, should, as we say, know better. it once was because it is less of a party pres

than it once was. The country has no real tradition of mass circulation newspapers financed and published by political parties, as they have in France and to a lesser degree in England. However, most American newspapers started business as advocates of one party, faction or cause, and have evolved through the years, whatever their mastheads still may say, into

essentially non-partisan organs. And true party organs, be it remembered. while they may contain much "positive" material, a great deal of it fraudulent, are at their best (and best read) only when they are flaying the sins real and imaginary of the political enemy. It is the nature not just of writers and editors but of readers as well. - Little Rock (Ark.) Arkansas Gazette
