

### Lewis Is Favored Over Nova In Bout Tonight

NEW YORK, Sept. 22.—(AP)—Louis, the 17-year-old champion, a slouch who is believed to be slipping.

Their scheduled 15-round encounter may prove a throw-back to the historic Dempsey-Firpo bout, which was staged at the same Polo Grounds in 1934. Both champion and challenger are good punchers but careless on defense, men who can rise from the canvas and continue slugging.

Accorded, with heavy fighting in prospect, more than 60,000 fans will be in the Giants' ball park when the field lights fade and the triple Gong sounds the welcome. This will be the world's largest fight crowd since 70,000 attended the second Louis-Schmeling bout in '38. Promotor Mike Jacobs expects the gate to approximate \$700,000, even if threatened rain forces a postponement.

Despite Nova's apparent prowess at 28 and his assists from the comic and the yodel, he will show in the betting, with Louis favored around 3-1. Louis is favored naturally, because of his great record.

### Sophomores Will Get Chances On Miami Grid Team

CORAL GABLES, Sept. 22.—(Special)—Sophomores are going to get their chance when the University of Miami football squad takes the field Oct. 3 against Elon College.

Coach Jack Harding of the Hurricanes has enough veterans to make up one full team—except for fullback. However, he has split his veterans this Fall and made up two teams, filling out each eleven with the better sophomores and from all indications, will use the two team system, at least at the start of the season.

One eleven, with two light backbacks operating behind a two pound line finds Joe Krutulis, end, Capt. Tom Kearns, tackle, Paul Carifeo, center and Dutch Trulliger and Russell Cotes, backs, as veterans, while sophomores Gene Jupina, end; George Gaspari, tackle, Pat Petroski and Al Adler, guards and Bob Douglas and Bob McDougal, backs are working with them.

On the other team, the veterans are Roy Robinson and Ray Gorman, ends; William Wunder, tackle; Nick Broker, guard and Red Tobin, back with the sophomores recruits Andy Munnah, tackle; Tuffy Sapp, guard, Harvey James, center and Ray Dunn, Howard Plasman and Al Kasulin, backs.

With a tough 10-game schedule, the Hurricanes will need all of the seasoned men if can get but with only 14 of the 1940 squad returning, it looks as though the seasoning will have to be done from week to week this Fall. By using teams made up half of veterans and half of sophomores in the early games, Coach Harding expects to develop enough men to put up worth while battles against Florida, Alabama, South Carolina and V. M. I. in November.
