

### Housewives Urged To Take Advantage Of Tomato Crops

JACKSONVILLE, May 18.—Recent reports of a directors' meeting of the New Jersey-Pennsylvania Tomato Growers Association in which a recommendation was made for a general transfer to other crops because of low prices offered for canning tomatoes, lead me to urge that housewives take advantage of Florida's splendid tomato crop now being harvested. Families, with a little effort and forethought, may be filled with sufficient canned tomatoes to carry the family through the year," said William L. Wilson, Director of State Markets. "This applies also to other fresh vegetables, all of which should aid in holding down the high cost of living and in keeping up the best in nutrition for Florida families," said Wilson. Reports from the various State Farmers' Markets indicate the spring to a close in some sections of the State.

### Oil Men Plan Conservation Of U. S. Natural Gas Pools In The Southwest

TULSA, Okla., May 18.—(AP)—If you want to burn natural gas, you supply may have to come from your own part of the country, under a plan for conserving the nation's great natural gas pool in the Southwest.

Explaining the proposed restrictions, a report circulated here today, made by Joseph Ross, of Dallas, Tex., to the Dallas Bar Association.

"Natural gas," he says, "is the Southwest's only low cost industrial fuel. Without it, most of the other resources are worthless, for without natural gas these resources cannot be used."

"Not to regulate natural gas is to discriminate against the whole economic structure of the Southwest. Lack of regulation affords unequal protection to the Southwestern manufacturer, who has no other competitive fuel available, and so unequal protection to the masses of the laboring people, who would have potentially additional sources of employment."

"The chief use of natural gas piped out of this area is for heat and fuel. But these other regions have one thousand times the fuel value in their coal reserves that the Southwest has in its natural gas."

"When the choice," he says "is between giving one region the opportunity of solving its economic problems, or permitting those problems to become a burden upon the rest of the country, then it seems to me that the broad national interest requires that we adopt a policy of conservation."

He cites a federal power commission ruling in 1945 in the case of the Northern Natural Gas Company that gas may not be piped into an area for boiler fuel, where ample supplies of coal are available for the same purpose.

State OK's Forest Service Funds In Spite Of Opposition

TALLAHASSEE May 19 (AP)—Against opposition of Governor Caldwell, the cabinet today approved release of \$26,700 to the State Forest Service to be spent on buildings, vehicles and equipment.
