The Pledge of Allegiance
How many civilians know the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag? How many people, other than school children, know what they are supposed to do when giving this pledge? From casual observation of such formalities we are afraid not many do.

And so the following communication from Mrs. H. J. Lehman, who has long taken an active part in local D.A.R. circles, is particularly appreciated and should be read with interest by every patriotic citizen:

"This year the Pledge of Allegiance and its accompanying gestures as prescribed at the second National Flag Code Conference, was adopted in its entirety by the Congress of the United States. The joint resolution, introduced by the Hon. Sam Hobbs of Alabama at the instance of the American Legion—together with amendments suggested by the U.S. Flag association—was approved June 22.

"The instructions are as follows: Standing with right hand over the heart, repeat the following pledge: 'I pledge allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.'

"At the words, 'to the Flag' the right hand is extended, palm upward, toward the Flag and this position is held until the words 'one Nation, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all' drop to the side.

"The Pledge was written by Mr. Francis Bellamy, a member on the staff of 'The Youth's Companion' and was first read in 1892. Exactly 50 years later, 1942, it received official recognition by the Government of the United States, and is to be used by civilians, schools and all other groups other than military who use their own form of salute."

Lost Italian Empire
The United Nations' gains in Tunisia must worry the Italians in Tripoli. Once Tunisia is gone, their own fate cannot be long delayed. If they do lose Tripoli, it will be a case of justice done.

Tripoli has not been Italian more than 30 years. Italy had long begrudged the French their possession of Tunisia. When the news of the spectacular landing on the wounded national self-esteem, Tripoli appeared to offer just that. Turkey, its owner, was trying to recover from the shock of the Italian withdrawal and the military aid of Abdul Hamid by a government of so-called Young Turks, ambitious men with training in Western Europe. Turkish institutions were in collapse, and needed time for reorganizing. Time was just what Italy was determined not to give. So she made war on Turkey, and had a fairly easy time of it with that country, but a good deal of trouble from the British.

The country had not begun to repay its cost in money and blood. But it added to the area of Italian territory on the coast of the Red Sea, which had been described to me as a vivacious look like an African empire. Ethiopia and the rest of Red Sea Italy have been lost for some time, and the prospects are that Tripoli will follow.

GAINESVILLE, Dec. 10. (Special)—Misfortune struck the Florida Gator basketball team Wednesday as Head Coach Spurgeon Cherry announced that three of his regular cage performers would be unable to leave with the squad today on a six-game spree with Southern conference opponents in Alabama and Mississippi.

Two first string centers, senior Jetterman Eugene Lee of Elberton, Ga., and freshman Ray Jamison of Bradenton and Harry Platt, junior reserve guard from a last minute pickup at Jacksonville, are the players affected by a university ruling allowing varsity athletes nine days leave from school during the year.

Each one of these Gators had seven days leave on football trips last Fall and will now have to confine their cage activity for the rest of the season to home games or a short trip that will not exceed their two day limit.

This loss leaves Coach Cherry with just three letterman, Forward Doyle Carlton, Tampa; Guard Jack Hagar, Orlando, and Forward Phil Craig, Jacksonville. Cherry intimated the possibility of using freshman Dean Price, regular Plant high caker last year, at the center position or converting Forward Phil Craig who has never played the center spot before.

With the traveling list in such a state, the Gator basketball team will have a

group of some 10 men picked just before they leave tomorrow morning and this group will no doubt include several freshmen and other green material.

Van Nuys Challenges Censorship Of Mail

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10. (AP)—Chairman Van Nuys (D-Ind) of the Senate Judiciary Committee challenged Wednesday the legal authority of Byrow Price, director of the Office of Censorship, to censor mail between the United States and its territories and possessions.

Van Nuys expressed his stand at a press conference after Price had testified for three hours behind closed committee doors. The censorship director himself, talking to reporters before Van Nuys' conference, said he had no doubt that it was Congress' intention in passing the first war powers act last year to "protect the security of communications in and out of the country."

Van Nuys said he thought the censorship of mail, except that going to foreign countries, "has all been illegal up to date."

Yarkee Football Players May Help Rebels Win Bowl Games

NASHVILLE, Tenn., Dec. 10.—A crop of Yankee footballers, who have migrated year down south to Dixie, may help the Johnny Rebs win four bowl games on New Year's day.

Lead, as a matter of course, by the boys who rolled them "Y" with an up-borth twang, will be seen playing for Georgia in the Rose Bowl, for Tennessee in the Sugar Bowl, for Georgia Tech in the Cotton Bowl and for Alabama in the Orange Bowl.

During the regular schedules, the transplanted Yankees made Dixie football history in leading the Southeastern conference to its greatest seasons in years.

Sinkwich, Georgia's "one-man gang" was the stand-out of the northers but the conference was well-heeled with other Yankee stars.

Alabama and Tennessee, for instance, can field complete—and powerful—teams, each member of which came from above the Mason and Dixon line. There were just eight Tennesseans on the Vol squad.

Counting the great Sinky, there were three Ohioans in the regular Georgia lineup (Coach Paul Brown of Ohio State probably heard that one before.) Sinkwich and George Poschner, the Bull dog's star end, came from Youngtown and Dick McPherson, hard-running fullback, hailed from Canfield.

Eleven "foreigners" seven of them starters, were listed on Alabama's first team from Varsity. Included Capt. Joe Dannanovich of South Bend, Ind., center and bulwark of "Bama's" big line; Mitchell Olenki, junior tackle from Varsity; N. Y.; Russ Craft of Beach Bottom, W. Va., the team's offensive star, and Don Balls, starting fullback from White Plains, N. Y.

By way of contrast, Alabama's

other Southeastern conference school, Auburn, went to the other extreme. The team's first 22 players were all from the deep south. And Vanderbilt listed just one northerner on its first team, Quarterback Art Rebrovich of Chatham, Minn.

The Tennessee roster was crammed with northers. They included, to name a few, Walter Slater, Providence, R. I.; James Gaffney, Cumberland, Md.; William Hillman, Kane, Pa.; Albert Sabato, Cincinnati; William Gold, Brockton, Mass.; Capt. Al Hust, Cleveland, O.; Royal Price, Johnstown, Pa.; Joe Fisher, Bluefield, W. Va.; Dick Huffman, Charleston, W. Va.; O. C. Lloyd, Charleston, W. Va.; and James Myers, Madison, W. Va.

With a few exceptions, Georgia Tech, too, was strictly a home-grown product. The exceptions included Eddie Prokop of Cleveland, O., flash sophomore fullback; Wilbur Stielin, first-string blocking back from Elizabeth, N. J.; Tom Anderson, senior tackle from Mt. Hope, W. Va.; and Jimmy W. Lee, alternate first-string blocking back from East Bleckley, W. Va.

A couple of Pennsylvania boys, Fullback Walter Gerinski of Pleasant and Joe Glamp of Mt. Pleasant, made L. S. U. football history. Injured slowed Gerinski this season, but last year the big fellow netted more yardage than any other Tice.

Eighthomore Glamp, according to Coach Walter Moore, was "as good as anything I had." The team's No. 1 back, however, sophomore Alvin Dark, was a Louisianian.

Sports Delegates To Vote Against Ban On Athletics

NEW ORLEANS, Dec. 10.—The Louisiana delegation leaving for the Southeastern conference meeting in Knoxville, Tenn., this week-end will present a united front against abandonment of inter-collegiate athletics so long as Uncle Sam wants their continuation, but Tulane and Louisiana State wouldn't mind a little de-emphasis.

The question of continuation of athletics, particularly football, is on the agenda at Knoxville, and seeking a preview of conference opinion. The Associated Press today asked representatives of both schools for an expression.

"Collegiate athletics have contributed considerably to the morale of the civilian population and I believe that unless continuation of athletics should prove too great a strain on the war effort, that they should be continued," Campbell B. Hodges, president of Louisiana State university, said.

"We have to think of the morale of the people on the home front as well as of our fighting forces."

"However we might be more practical about athletics for instance we might play only teams close to home and if need be to complete schedules, to play the same team twice."

Dr. William A. Smith, athletic director of Tulane, said:

"I am strongly in favor of carrying on inter-collegiate athletics as long as the government wants us to carry on such programs. I feel, however, that the program as it is humanly possible the coaches should substitute their interest in winning and losing and concentrate more on simply playing the game as best they can with the material available to them. There should be no laxity in the enforcement of rules for living by the rules is as fundamental now as in normal times."

Dr. T. P. Head of Louisiana State and his school had proposed a good year and that the university planned to go ahead with its full sports program as at ready planned. He said attendance and receipts for the football season were very good.

Commenting on the conference athletic scholarship program, Head said: "I believe that athletic scholarships serve a most important purpose and at present a very real reason for discontinuing them."

"Most of our boys are already in the armed services, and when they are called to active duty we will play the best we have left."
