POLLY'S POINTERS

Wealth of Ideas For Paper Tubes

DEAR POLLY-I want to tell Patti that I use tubes from paper towels (her wrapping paper tubes could be cut to the proper length) to wrap up rolled-out pie crust to be ised later. I cover the tube with waxed paper, place the rolled-out crust on a piece of waxed paper or plastic wrap and place another piece on top and then roll the crust on plastic wrap) and wrap it all so it is airtight and then put in the refrigerator. When ready to use, remove from the refrigerator early enough for the crust to be room temperature before being unrolled to put in the pie pan. Often I roll two or three crusts on the same tube and find they keep a week. Saves space and time when you want pie during a busy season.-GRAMS

DEAR POLLY and Patti-Wrapping paper tubes are excellent for storing linens. After ironing, roll them around a tube, store and eliminate any creases. I have also used them for making large Christmas candles to use outdoors. Cover with bright red paper, stick a bit of yellow paper in the top for a wick and perhaps add a bow at the base. An aluminum pie plate makes a good holder, Large paper documents can be kept clean and unfolded if stored in such tubes.—RUTH

DEAR POLLY and Patti-I use the smaller paper tubes for packing trousers or other clothing to keep creases out of the folds. Insert the tube

inside the fold just as it would be on a hanger. Assorted lengths of tubes can be cut to various lengths and jewelry packed in them to prevent wreckage while on a trip. Slit such tubes want to hang an article and prevent a wash-line mark while drying. Do not use

the clothesline when you want to hang an article colored ones for this or they might fade.-EUNICE





Hurry-Up Tanaka Tonic for Japan

If improvement of U.S.-Japanese relations has a better prospect with faster decision-making, then Japan's new rime Minister Kakuei Tanaka may very well be good

He is proving to be much quicker at decisions than the

Japanese people are accustomed to. The leadership habit there is to weigh and consider endlessly until a decision sort of comes into being instead of being made. When economic trouble developed over the wide trade

gap between our two countries, this slowness was a serious handicap to negotiations. Our irritations over it were a factor in the blunt, precipitate action we finally took in mid-1971 to restrict Japanese trade and force cur-

Tanaka's quite different make-up made a good impression on President Nixon in their Hawaii meeting. Realistically, hopes should be a little higher than before that deeper inroads can be made into the sticky trade gap

Word from Tokyo is, too, that Tanaka is having a tonic effect in his own country. The Japanese often have seen decision delayed so long that the time for action went by without any, whereupon people glumly took the loss in-volved, shrugged, and watched their leaders agonize over the next one.

Tanaka's trip to China to establish a diplomatic link with Peking and break off such ties with Taiwan came tone for his regime.

The important thing is that the mood of the Japanese today is evidently a good deal brighter than it has been for more than a year. None of this means a magic solvent suddenly has been introduced into the somewhat stiffened relations between


Japan and the United States. A great deal remains to be accomplished. Anti-Americanism still is running fairly high. The Japanese have not yet forgotten what they regard as the rude shocks of 1971, when we applied trade limits and

Nixon announced his own trip to China. However our heavy troop pullout from Vietnam may be seen elsewhere, to the Japanese it signifies a diminishing American interest and influence in Asia. Consequently, they place less trust than before in our written pledges to come to Japan's defense.

Obviously this makes the question of Japan strengthening its own armed forces a more crucial matter, and it will be hotly debated in the months ahead. Popular feelings against a bigger, tougher army continue to run strong in the aftermath of World War II, and the question will be very difficult.

And, notwithstanding the somewhat euphoric mood ishered in by Tanaka's impressive beginning, so will the U.S.-Japanese trade gap. Tokyo is well aware that its swift offer to buy \$1 billion more U.S. goods was only an opening gesture, however welcome. Tanaka's talents will be taxed heavily to help produce longer range answers in the way of opening up the Japanese market.

Yet, as noted in previous reports, the Japan of late 1972 s also more independent in spirit. And soundings there make it clear Tokyo will go only so far, and expect America to make up additional ground by a much tougher attack on its own problem of lagging productivity.



Used Car Danger: Recall Ignored?

Buying a used car always was a chancy business. It still is, warns Traffic Safety magazine, despite federal regulations governing vehicle safety.

This is because many new car owners who have been receiving recall notices about a possible flaw in their model have not been having the necessary inspection made or the recall-related defect corrected, writes Jim Kielty, road safety supervisor for the National Safety Council, in the organization's publication.

These cars may eventually be sold to private parties or traded in on new cars. Thus unsuspecting used car buyers may be driving cars with possibly defective engine mounts or faulty rear axles or some other potentially dangerous flaw.

More than 30 million cars have been issued recall notices for the inspection and correction of possible safety defects since passage of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act of 1966.

Automakers estimate that about 90 per cent of the owners of new cars bring in their vehicles for the necessary, serious repairs. But with cars four or five years old, the figure falls to about 50 per cent.

Kielty suggests that: (1) All used car dealers should make sure the necessary recall-type maintenance work has been performed on all the cars they sell. Dealer associations should require this. A more drastic method would be to make it a legal re-

(2) Insurance coverage might be refused to those vehicles that have not had possible defects corrected. This system could easily include those cars sold by one private



PHILADELPHIA - This is the city where I sat at the butcher's block eating prime beef filet with my fingers, off a piece of wrapping paper.

I was in the City of Brotherly Love to cover a national food editor's conference and the marathon of meetings had finally driven me out for fresh air. I'd heard about the Reading Terminal Market, there 80

produce in from the rolling Pennsylvania countryside for sale. Now it more resembles a huge covered warehouse, crowded with stalls of produce and snack bars where you can buy a many layered ham and cheese sandwich and a glass of thick, ice-cold buttermilk for 55 cents. (The sign proclaims "Drink buttermilk and live forever!")

There are markets specializing in fat Polish sausages and German bratwurst, huge wooden barrels of dill pickles, and bakeries stacked high with fragrant breads and pastries. Tubs of pungent saurekraut and Pennsylvania Dutch chowchow are all there for sale."

I wandered through the din of a busy morning at the market. The Reading Terminal is located nearly on top of the market, and the building shakes and rumbles with the arrival and departure of trains

I came across Pierce and Schurr's meat market, settled beneath lazy ceiling fans for the past 40 years in the same spot. The walls are festooned with photographs of presidents and royalty, movie stars and business leaders. "Prime Black Angus Beef" proclaims the banner across the enormous meat case. And that it is, along with milk-fed veal, thick French-style lamb chops, corn-fed pork. All the best, the most carefully chosen, an answer to carnivorous man's

Behind the counter stood Morris Pierce, slightly rotund n his starchy white apron, confident that nobody had better steaks to sell than be.

"I'll tell ya, lady," he shouted above the noise, "I've

I have customers who ask me to fly meat to them in California, I've got 23 customers at the Waldorf Towers who pick up their orders at the Greyhound bus depot, people here on vacation carry a few roasts home on their laps on the plane. But it's all retail,

wrapping, joking with his customers. Then it was nearly noon and Morry suddenly asked "Had lunch yet?" and in the same breath, "How about a steak?" Since I couldn't imagine cooking a steak over a candle in my hotel room, I declined, but then Morry whipped out a portable electric broiler, cut two filets from the whole, and with a flourish whipped a piece of heavy waxed wrapping paper onto the wooden butcher's block. The steak sizzled briefly and was then presented to me with a small sharp knife for cutting and spearing. I was sitting on a high stool Morry had

"Whaddaya think?" he asked as I took the first bite. It was superb. It didn't taste like steak, it tasted like steak is supposed to taste, tender and buttery, rich and pink inside, crusty outside. No tenderizers, no seasonings, no anything, just carefully aged beef, cooked quickly.

"That's quality, lady, just quality. Nobody rushed this beef into the case. It's been aging for two weeks and it's been cut and trimmed as it's ordered. That's all there is to it."

Just for the record, since few of us will call Pierce and Schurr for our weekly meat order, here are a few of the prices: T-bone sells for \$2.89 a pound, as does porterhouse. Sirloin is \$2.29 and French lamb chops are \$1.99. Huge short ribs run 79 cents as does hamburger. New York cuts sell at \$2.99 and veal cutlets, \$4.20. Pork chops cost \$1.69 and a whole






PLANS A, B and C FEATURE FRONT GARAGE

but there have been a few successes with the experiments, enough to encourage us to continue our research," the admiral noted in an interview. The quest for a decay-fighting vaccine has spread overseas as well. Turner recalls that in 1969 British dental researchers used six monkeys in vaccine experiments and later

reported some success. Research involves testing the effectiveness of chemicals such as antibiotics and combinations of fluorides to combat plaques - tiny mucus films harboring bacteria on tooth enamel and one of the chief causes of de-

To achieve success with a preventive vaccine, Turner explains, it would be necessary also to eliminate all microorganisms or bacteria from the mouth. Thus the search for a vaccine is part of a two-edged project, he emphasizes. For the elderly, the fight i directed against other types of

bacteria which attack the lower part of teeth and expose the roots, Turner explains. The admiral says no one yet can predict a timetable for the tooth decay vaccine breakthrough. But he believes the persistence of Navy dentists and medical scientists, coupled with efforts of civilian re-

searchers, eventually will achieve an effective vaccine Meanwhile a long-term Navy

analysis of dental health among recruits has produced new evidence that fluoridated water is a potent foe of cavities. The study, one of those aimed at development of the antide-

cay vaccine, was conducted several years by the Great Lakes Research Institute. It found that naval recruits eporting for duty at the Trainng Center there have healthier eeth and gums than recruits of a few years ago. The report credits water fluoridation in arge eastern cities with helping to improve dental health

and combat cavities. The study showed that from 960 to 1969 the average prevalence of cavity-free Great Lakes recruits had been two men per 1,000. The figure varied between 1.5 and 3 per 1,000 over the 10-year period.

During 1970, however, the report emphasizes, the ratio began to move up and by last year the number of cavity-free recruits had risen to 9 per 1,000.



Water System Seen To Triple

By DONNA ESTES

OVIEDO - The city's water system is expected to triple its numbers of users in the next year, according to A.M. Jones, superintendent.

The water department sent out just 258 bills in its first month of operation, November, 1968. And last month some 600 bills were sent to subscribers.

With new construction, which has been approved or is scheduled for approval, Jones said, another \$1,000 connections at least can be anticipated before the end of 1973.

The system is pumping close o 500,000 gallons of water daily and the water department is now self-supporting. Originally the water system was financed by a pledge of water revenues with a secondary pledge of cigarette taxes. In this new fiscal year, it is expected the water department because of increased revenues will be able to turn back to the city for general operation expenses the cigarette tax receipts of \$50,000.

Police Dept. Gives Oviedo Protection

By DONNA ESTES

OVIEDO - Twenty-four hour protection seven days weekly can now be given by the City's Police Department with its record budget approved by the City Council.

The department allocation of \$63,892 will permit the employ of an additional full-time patrolman to give the city six full-time officers including Chief Kenneth Triplett.

In addition the force has nine cadets. One is doing office work full time while the other eight handle police dispatching chores from an office set up in the police building.

Also in the police building are two cells able to handle the incarceration of four prisoners. The acquisition of a radar unit for the department during the past few months assists with the apprehension of speeders through the municipal

Money has also been budgeted to provide a second car for the department allowing two to be on the road at all times, when needed.

Chief Triplett said the beefing up of the department was necessary with the population growth of the city from 1,865 in 1970 to 2,450 and with Florida Technological so close to the city's territorial limits.

At the same time, fines and forfeitures levied in municipal court rose from \$4,500 in 1970 to an anticipated \$14,000 this fiscal year

Seminole County is at the cross roads of Central Florida - 32 miles southwest of Daytona Beach; adjacent to Orlando-Orange County: miles from Walt Disney World.

TRANSPORTATION

Truck, Bus, Motor Coach via high-speed Interstate 4 and U.S. 17-92 across the county connecting with U.S. 95, U.S. 1, Sunshine State Parkway and 1-75. 



The Forest City Fire Department received its fifth piece of major equipment in September. A new custom cab Ford Imperial number, costing \$45,000, was purchased and The Forest City-Bear Lake Fire Control District was

formed in 1967 and within a year construction was begun on the fire house. Since that time, three fulltime firemen have been placed on the payroll and, with the 25 volunteers on the roster, adequate manpower is available for any emergency. The firemen in 1971 answered a total of 239 fire calls and through September this year answered more than 200 within

the 26 square miles of the district. Budget approved by the Board of County Commissioners for the district for fiscal 1972-73 was \$71,000. The three paid fireman are Asst. Chief James Walters, Lt. Glen Michael

Millard and Charles Hambley. Governing the fire district are Wayne Westfall, chairAmong the major pieces of equipment, in addition to the

new pumper truck, is an emergency vehicle completely equipped through the efforts of the Firemen's Association. The converted camper was donated by a supporter of the department. Among the equipment in the van is a two-way radio, oxygen, and accessories, a cot and first aid gear. Primary use of the van is for fire emergencies but the

men will respond to other emergencies as well. The firemen's association raises funds through various efforts, the principal ones are the annual circus and Christmas tree sale.



Remedial Reading Pushed

In an effort to best equip Seminole County's secondary students in all content areas, this year's entire compensatory program was devoted to language arts with an emphasis instructional and audio-visual materials were provided which motivated high interest on the part of the more mature student while at the same time offering the basic skills which needed mastering. In-service seminars,

Teaching children to read is the biggest responsibility of schools. Without adequate ability in this skill, the child is often unable to perform in other areas of the total educational program. Despite our many advances we are still a nation who depends a great deal on our ability to get meaning from the printed page.

The schools in Seminole County evaluate their programs from year to year. Administrators and teachers study research. They compare assessments of their own programs as reflected in test scores administered each year. They are interested in keeping abreast of new methods of teaching reading skills in order to assure those they teach that they will be proficient in handling the printed page. Learning to read is not an easy task for some children. Seminole County is fortunate in having several programs which give very special training for those who work better in learning used in most classrooms.


