PHILADELPHIA (UPI) - A team of federal inspectors will investigate "human factors" behind the collision Tuesday of four Philadelphia-bound commuter trains in which 443 passengers were injured, 12 seriously. ## Deputies Sought In Drunk Driver Battle Local Con Artists Painting Sad Picture

Flimflam or confidence artists are busily working the Sanford area. In the last several weeks three separate Sanford women have been "conned" (short for confidence game) out of a total

Sanford police reported these three incidents: -Last Tuesday a 70-year-old woman was swindled out of \$300 after another woman asked her how to withdraw and deposit

money for a bank account. According to the police report, the Sanford woman was trying to help a 28-year-old woman find a place to stay. They were joined by a 35-year-old second woman who told the other two she had just received insurance money but did not know how to deposit or withdraw it from a bank. She asked the Sanford victim to show her how the bank system worked.

The report said the three drove to a bank where the victim withdrew \$300 from her account. The money was placed in a bandanna after it was withdrawn, but it was switched during the drive back to let the Sanford victim off. She only found cut-up newspaper when she opened the bandanna.

-Last Friday, a 75-year-old Sanford woman was told she could help a local bank catch an employee who was stealing from the bank. She was told — by someone impersonating a bank employee - if she withdrew all her money, the bank could watch an employee handling the withdrawal. A police officer, "Lieutenant Carter," was to come by and get the withdrawal for evidence. The woman withdrew the money and phony officer arrived and disappeared. The Sanford woman lost \$5,500 in savings.

### **Press Conference** Spells Out Issues

The public has been deprived of little information under President Carter's decision to hold fewer televised press conferences with the Washington

hews people.

The wide range of questions the president fielded recently left little time for response in depth even if he were so inclined.

But the 30-minute session — the first in 10 weeks — did provide a sharp picture of the issues that concern the press, and the press reflects the con-

cerns of the American people.

Not surprisingly, inflation continues to dominate the list of problems that trouble the nation. As the cost-of-living advances steadily at a rate hovering at 10 percent or more annually, the president chose to defend administration policies. He cited labor-management contracts within his guidelines as evidence that restraints are taking hold. He expressed confidence that the decision of the Federal Reserve Board to boost its interest rate to a record 2 percent would prove effective.

But the president also conceded that some fac-tors contributing to the price spiral are beyond his

And that focused on another priority national concern — the cost of energy and the uncertainty of

energy sources.

Without the series of price increases initiated by the Organization of Petroleum Countries, the president said, inflation would be escalating at a rate no higher than last year or the year before —

Facing challenges to his renomination within his own party and a stiff contest from a Republican contender later next year, the president's chances for a second term rest heavily on an improved

He looks forward to the political tests, he told reporters at the press conference "with anticipation and confidence." We must assume that be is equally confident about the economy.

But the people expect more detailed reasons that he was able to offer within the limitations of his
