






Tight Money May Change U.S. Life

Associated Press Writer

Contractor John Mixon of Trimble, Mo., usually builds about 30 new houses a year. Right now, he doesn't have a single home under construction.

Mixon is caught in the tight money squeeze that has hit buyers. builders and bankers and caused some industry sources to forecast that Americans will have to change their way of life. The Commerce Department reported recently that the number of new houses started in July was the smallest in more than four years. At the same time, the government raised the maximum dewable rate on federally insured home loans to a record 9.5 per

An Associated Press survey showed that mortgage rates vary from area to area, depending on state laws. The amount of money needed for a down payment also varies, up to 40 per cent in some regions. Throughout the country, however, available houses are more expensive and loans are harder to get.

"There's not much point in even giving a prospect a price tried wouldn't give them a mortgage, "They wouldn't even estimate on a house he wants to build unless he's got the financing pretty well lined up," he said.

Bankers say they don't have money to loan. They say deposits are down because investors can get more interest by putting their money in things like treasury notes than they can from savings James T. Lynn, secretary of Housing and Urban Development,



We're Ignoring **Energy Reality**

The 55 mile-per-hour speed limit signs dotting the highways are about the only reminders we have left of the energy crisis the nation endured last winter and early spring.

Almost everything else is back to normal. Automobiles and trucks clog the roads. If anyone is turning off unnecessary lights, it is more likely to save money than to conserve power plant fuel. Car pools are rare again, and the one-occupant car is taken for granted. Service stations, urged by their suppliers to sell more gasoline, are remaining open later into the night and often on Sundays.

Dispelling any doubts that the "good old days" have returned, gasoline price wars are being predicted. Refiners' inventories continue to grow at a time when summer driving normally would be drawing down supplies.

Is this return to "normalcy" really good for Americans? Should the shortages of a few months ago be forgotten? Indeed not. Whatever the surpluses of the moment, the worldwide supply of petroleum-our chief source of energy-continues to be depleted at a rate we know to have ominous implications for our future.

Each day we ignore the reality that crude oil is a finite resource that will someday run dry. Each day, by our behavior we hasten the arrival of the moment when the oil is all gone. So there really it no surplus of petroleum at all-only an excess of current production. In these terms there is no justification for price wars, no justification for a return to higher speed limits or other steps that encourage consumption of oil and gasoline.

Furthermore, continued dependence on high oil production abroad runs counter to the goal of making the United States self-sufficient in energy supplies and thus less vulnerable to another Arab

Foreign oil is costing the United States and other oil importing nations a king's ransom. Global trade balances, monetary stability and even the solvency of entire nations are endangered because foreign crude oil prices have quadrupled in less


Energy conservation, which we were quite ready to accept as imperative last winter, has come up against a phenomenon of the marketplace. Oversupply is creating pressure for lower prices. This is certainly a boon for the consumer's pocketbook, but as far as the long-range fuel picture is concerned, the blessing is decidedly mixed

Legal Aid

The increasing complications involved in muddling along in today's regulated society have come near to placing demand for a family lawyer at the same level as that for the family doctor. And the need for legal assistance is greatest, perhaps, among the segment of the population that can least afford it. The federal program of legal services for the poor has been

the acknowledged salvation of low-income individuals in cutting through the tangle of red tape to win government benefits to which they are entitled and in protecting them from unscrupulous operators who prey on the financially desperate. But the program has also been the target of justifiable criticism for the tendency of poverty lawyers to exploit causes.

The independent government corporation proposed in egislation approved in the House and Senate would be administered by 11 presidentially appointed directors, who would enforce stricty rules against politicking and lobbying.

According to Electronics magazine, a Danish bulldozer operator once cut the line near Copenhagen, a farmer in Finland plowed it up and a fire in a Baltimore manhole put it out of

To eliminate the potential danger of the landbased communications system being out of commission during some global emergency, the U.S. and U.S.S.R. will inaugurate a new hookup later this year utilizing satellites. The original target date for the new Hot Line

was supposed to have been President Nixon's visit to Moscow in June, but that had to be pushed back because of delays in setting up the Soviet earth station some 10 miles from Moscow. The U.S. ground terminal is already operational at Ft. Detrick, Md.

Ironically, says the magazine, despite all the technology and expertise designed into the system, it won't get much use. While ordinary communications between the Kremlin and Washington will continue to travel back and forth via closed-circuit Telex machine, the Hot Line is reserved for top priority communications between the two governments during crises such as last October's Middle East war. 



I am a psychotherapist who has counseled college students since 1942, and the bizarre situation they describe is common. Coed living is creating severe emotional problems for college men and women. Impotence in college men is now a common symptom - the result of a culture that pushes sexual performance. Some girls panic because of sexual pressure; others become overly aggressive.

It is totally unfair to pay for a double room in a girls' dorm and then end up sharing it with a girl and her boyfriend. The only way to escape being an observer to the roommate's sexual activities is to find some other place to sleep.

I have had this same picture from male and female students from every coeducational residential college or university that has been represented in my patient load.

The schools are doing harm and injustice not only to the minority, but also to the students whose vote is regarded as an order by the administration. This is one reason psychiatric treatment of college students has increased in volume. The universities need to hear a voice of sanity. Abby, please take a serious look at this widespread problem.



I never realized the tremendous burden of responsibility that is placed on boxing officials until last Tuesday night at the Orlando Sports Stadium. With the passing of the veteran judge Jack De Franco, I was asked to fill his seat by promoter Pete Ashlock's right hand

man, Jim Haves. I have witnessed many bouts in my life, both as a writer and a paying customer. Like many others, I have sat back enjoying the fights while keeping my own scorecard. More often than not I have violently disagreed with the official verdict, saying, "I wonder what fight they were wat-

I can tell you now, when your card is for "keeps," you watch a different fight. You can't afford the luxury of talking to your neighbor, or

catching a glimpse of the blonde that is coming down the aisle. The soft drinks, peanuts, pretzels, and hot dogs all have to wait To be fair and just, your eyes and attention must be rivited on

the action going on in the ring. Anything short of total concentration would be denying the two men all they are asking for, "a proper and impartial decision." How anyone who witnessed their daily labors in the gym could accept the job lightly is beyond me.

And what about their hopes and dreams that I am sure each has? It doesn't matter if he tells them to the world, ala Ali, or keeps it to himself like most of the battlers. I am certain very few are in it just for the payday, but most honestly believe that fame and fortune lies just around the ring-post. A loss can crush the winning spark every fighter must have

if he is to succeed, and an unjust decision is doubly damaging. More than one career has been sunk on the rocks of incompetent judges, or better yet, uncaring judges. It doesn't take a great deal of wisdom to decide who punched the other guy the most. It does take a great deal of con-

entration and the willingness to apply yourself. The next time you are watching a fight, instead of sitting back and enjoying it, try this. Keep a card as if it were the only one that counted. If the referee gets between you and the action, instead of yelling at him to move, quickly make an adjustment in your seat so you can be sure not to miss even a single moment

Even in the slow moving bouts keep your eyes glued to the fighters. Did that punch really land or was it caught on the

Do this for an entire eving and maybe you too will experience some of the pressure each man who agrees to decide the fate of another, must feel. I am certain you will get to see more of the action you paid your money to witness and possibly come up with the same decision the officials do.



2 Cons Caught; 1 Killed

TEPHENVILLE, Tex. (AP) - "The dogs barked. We threw the light at them and we saw the silhouettes. We hollered for them to stop. They did not and then started running and we started firing.'

That's how Jim Ellmore, a Mineral Wells policeman, described the cornering Monday night of three escaped convicts who had terrorized the ranch country of central and west Texas for four days

One of the three convicts, Richard Mangum, 22, was killed in the gunfire as law enforcement officers moved in to end the bloody rampage that had left two dead and five wounded and had chased frightened residents from their homes Jerry Ulmer, 22, a convicted murderer and Dalton Williams, 29, the third escapee, were arrested.

Police said the convicts did not return the hail of gunfire.

and body, police said. They said Ulmer sprained his ankle as officers arrested the pair. An ambulance driver said that Ulmer was taken to the Stephenville police station, where he joined Williams The three escaped from the Colorado State Prison at Canon City last Thursday They headed at once across New Mexico and into Texas to seek revenge against

Those killed in Texas had testified against two of the convicts at separate trials. Officers said the convicts had mentioned the victims to other inmates as objects of revenge before escaping from Canon City.

The victims were Rotan rancherfarmer T.L. Baker, 65, who had testified against Williams in a robbery case, and Mrs. Ray Ott, a resident of a community near here, who had testified against Ulmer. They were shot Saturday at their

Erath County Dist. Atty. Bob Glasgow said Ulmer and Williams would be charged with murdering Mrs. Ott. He said other charges would be filed later. Two girls they kidnaped in New Mexico were raped and released in Texas.

The five others were wounded by the convicts as they stole cars and fired indiscriminately at groups of people while being chased up and down farm

Authorities mounted a massive manhunt in the rugged ranchland for the three, but the convicts eluded the nearly 200 pursuing officers for two days. Monday morning, a policeman spotted them through binoculars as they walked along a creek.

But it was not until Il p.m. CDT that Ellmore and two other Mineral Wells policemen, Fred McDonald and Larry Brandenberg, cornered the men.
