Downtown lighting deal tabled

SANFORD — After three months of discussion, City Commissioner Art Woodruff said it was time to settle the downtown lighting dispute.

At the close of Tuesday's Sanford Commission meeting, Woodruff sprung a new Downtown Business Association deal on his fellow commissioners. Although dramatically different from its predecessor, Commissioner Whitey Eckstein tabled any vote, in part because he said the issue should have been on the agenda.

The proposed agreement would allow the city to use the rooftop electrical system

needed for providing nightly pedestrian and event lighting from Sanford Avenue to Oak Avenue. The three-year agreement would cost the city \$20,000. That's almost \$100,000 less than DBA's original combination offer, which included the city supporting four to six events a year.

If approved, the city would be able to connect 10 or more lights to the system and pay an additional \$530 a light and \$1,500 annually in estimated electrical bills. The rooftop system was installed by DBA for the

recent Christmas parade, and Woodruff said the organization should be compensated for its work. Trying to circumvent what they have already done may cause ill will with the downtown businesses, he added.

As part of the agreement, DBA must obtain each downtown building owner's written consent. If the commission wanted to proceed with the DBA deal, terms of the contract would have to address city liability concerns, City Manager Tony VanDerworp said. The city has already started the process

of drafting the proper legal document.

Interrupting the commissioners' brief discussion on the new agreement was DBA's Sara Jacobson. She strode to the podium asking "Commissioner Woodruff, may I help you with this?" She told commissioners that seven of the nine property owners had already agreed to a contract.

Shortly after the motion to table the agreement unanimously passed, Commissioner Randy Jones openly asked "What exactly is the \$20,000 for?" No reply was given.

"First of all, I can't be getting things five after eight and expected to make a decision 10 after eight," Jones said after the meeting.

Layer possible name for school

SANFORD — It's been done before, and he means so much to the county.

That's just two of the dozens of reasons Sanford City Commission outlined in a resolution passed Tuesday suggesting the School Board name a facility after the ailing Bud Layer.

The former schools superintendent is fighting his second battle with cancer, and several government leaders would like to give him one last sign of appreciation before it may be too late.

Sanford's recent motion is part of a joint resolution with Seminole County. The idea was initiated by Sanford Commissioner Whitey Eckstein as the county and city met together several weeks ago to discuss the proposed lakefront hotel and conference center. The county is planning to vote on a similar resolution at a March 12 board meeting.

"It's quite a honor. I'm not really for having schools named after people. I think they should be named after the community they serve," Layer modestly said.

Naming a school after an individual is not unheard of in Seminole. Oviedo's Chiles Elementary School bears the surname of the legendary Gov. Lawton Chiles. Several area schools, however, honor living local greats, such as Partin Elementary School, which is named after Oviedo principal Marguerite Partin.

"It's not unusual," county commissioner and fellow educator Carlton Henley said about naming a building after someone that is still alive.

Henley and Eckstein's relationship with Layer goes way back. Henley gave Layer his first crack at school administration. Eckstein remembers his fiery leadership that dramatically improved the county's schools.

"He was a great leader,"

Israeli instructors help Sanford police officers learn anti-terrorist maneuvers

Israeli knowledge gained from combating terrorists for decades could prove to be a valuable resource for local law enforcement agencies.

The Sanford Police Department is learning firsthand of its possible benefits.

The department hosted a six-day anti-terrorism training session at the Geneva gun range last week that included guests from the U.S. military and undisclosed Canadian authorities.

Their instructor, Avi Leshem, is a

Officials consider ball field partnership

SANFORD — Lake Mary and Sanford governments may work together in the future to provide additional baseball fields for the area's increasing youth population.

Although not officially on Monday's joint work session agenda, city commissioners and staff from both municipalities agreed working together to provide field space

will benefit residents in the two cities. Lake Mary officials requested Monday's meeting in order to discuss development along Rinehart Road — a roadway stretching from Lake Mary Boulevard to State Road 46.

Lake Mary Mayor Thom Greene initiated the ball field discussion following Sanford Director of Engineering and Planning Jay Marder's presentation on current development plans along Rinehart Road. Along with a Wal-Mart Supercenter, Sam's Club and several automobile dealerships, several residential complexes, including condominiums and apartments, may be built on property adjacent to the road.

Lake Mary officials are concerned additional residential complexes will mean more children interested in playing youth baseball and softball. The city's four fields covering about 6 acres at the Sports Complex are currently experiencing almost maximum usage for the youth baseball season.

"Our ball fields are already under existing pressure," Greene said. "As the number of apartments increase, so does the pressure for more leagues. Right now, our sports complex only has room for Little League."

Firefighters prodded all in name of wellness

HEATHROW — Seminole County firefighters from Station 36 spent last Thursday morning being prodded and weighed by Orlando Healthcare personnel.

The screening was the first stage of a new \$42,000 federal grant awarded to Seminole County EMS, Fire and Rescue. The funds will provide for a needed wellness awareness and education program for the 230 uniformed personnel based in 12 stations. According to department officials, the No. 1 cause on-duty deaths to firefighters is heart attacks.

"We want to do everything we

can to protect the health of our firefighters so they can, in turn, protect our citizens in emergency situations," said Seminole County Fire Chief Terry Schenk.

The screening will help determine firefighters' body fat percentage and target heart rate. This spring, the information gathered from the screening will be given to the firefighters, and department wide statistics will also be compiled.

They will then use those statistics to prepare for an educational seminar "Fueling a Firefighter." The class will help educate firefighters about the demands they place on their bodies during work and the importance of proper

nutrition and exercise.

"Nobody is telling them they have to meet a certain requirement, but we're hoping this can help them achieve a healthier lifestyle," said Battalion Chief Leeanna Mims.

In addition to the screening and seminar, the grant funds will be used to purchase treadmills for almost all of the fire stations. Although the grant is only for one year, Mims said the department is looking for alternative funding sources to continue the program and purchase additional exercise equipment.

Firefighters need a strong exer-

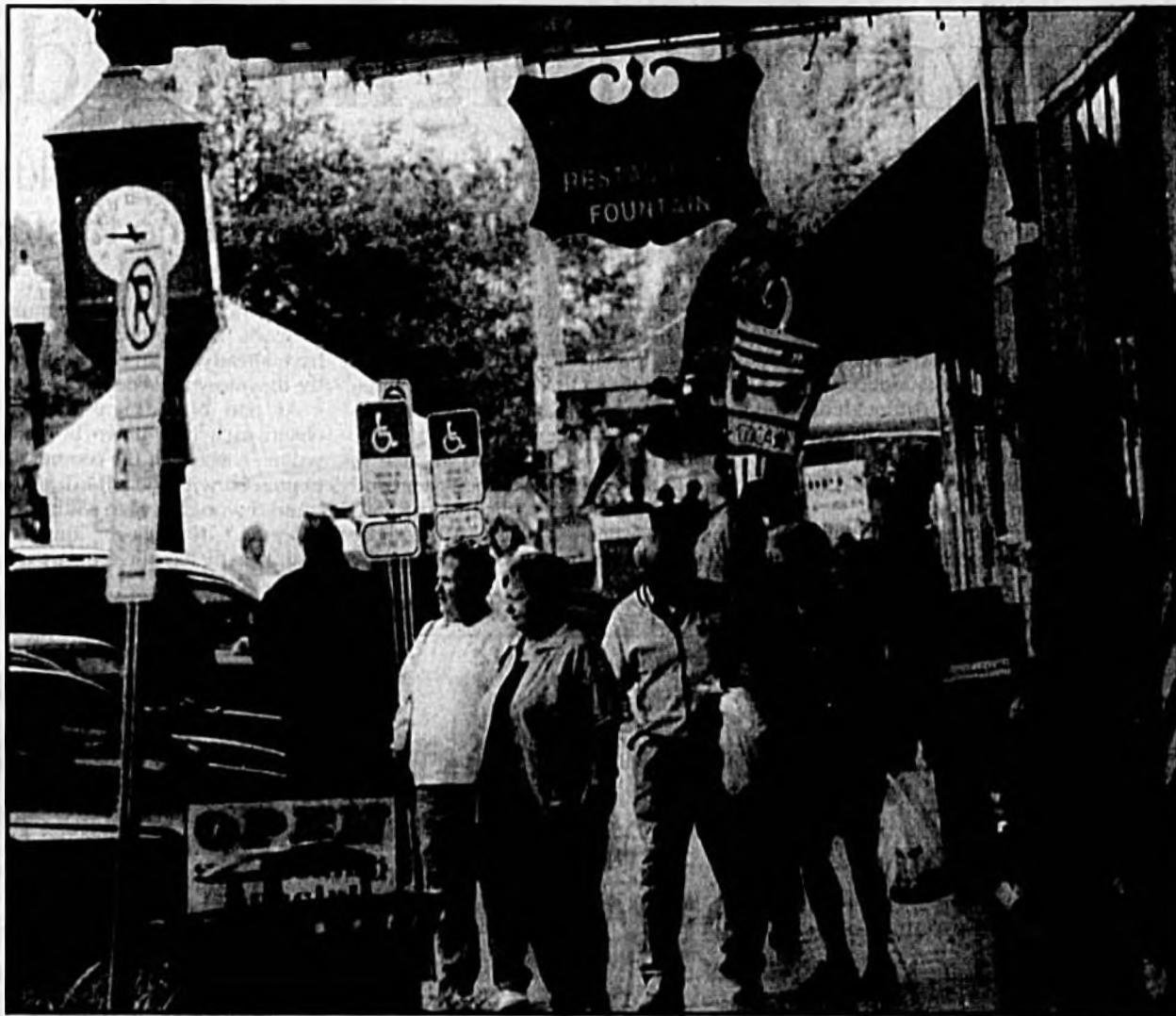

Generator in final phase of repowering construction

Florida Power and Light Co. announced that one of two generators being repowered at its DeBary site is entering its final phase of construction. It is also undergoing testing on the combustion and steam functions, which may be noticeable to passers-by and neighbors.

"From now through the end of March, our neighbors will occasionally see a steam plume above the site and may hear an audible noise caused by steam being blown through the new equipment in preparation for putting Unit 5 in service this summer," Plant Manager Roxane Kennedy said.

According to FPL, the second generating unit at the site (Unit 4) that is undergoing repowering will remain in-service throughout the summer, then come out-of-service to complete its final phase of

construction and testing by June 2003.

FPL first announced plans in 1998 to repower its Sanford facility, along with another plant in Fort Myers, in order to meet the increasing demand for electricity in the region. Once the project is complete in mid-2003, output will increase by about 1,200 megawatts, from 933 megawatts to 2,100 megawatts, and the site will serve about 486,000 homes and businesses rather than the 217,000 it is able to currently serve.

Repowering basically means adding new technology to the Sanford site that uses clean natural gas instead of oil. The Sanford repowering project will involve the installation of electric generating technology known as combined-cycle, replacing the traditional electricity generating process where fuel is burned in a large boiler.

Combined-cycle technology is 40 percent more efficient than traditional

power plant generation because it delivers more electricity per unit of fuel consumed, Kennedy said. The repowered Units 4 and 5 will be more efficient and economical and are expected to run twice as much.

The smaller Unit 3, continuing to use the traditional electricity generating process of oil and natural gas, will run less often and be used primarily to meet summer and occasional winter peak demand periods.

Kennedy is excited about the new technology planned for the Sanford plant. However, she is more excited about what it means for the environment.

"The most exciting thing is that we will produce all the additional megawatts at a significantly cleaner rate than we've ever done," Kennedy said. "Anything that cleans up the environment is a benefit."

According to Kennedy, the Sanford plant currently produces on average 39,000 tons of megapollutants, including sulfur dioxide, a year. Once the repowering project is complete, the average will be 8,000 tons of megapollutants a year.

The look of the Sanford site, which was originally established in 1925, will also dramatically change once the repowering project is complete. The two large red and white striped smokestacks and the large blue structures that house the boilers for Units 4 and 5 will be replaced with eight shorter stacks and newer, smaller combined-cycle units.

"I think some people are sad about the dismantling of the stacks," Kennedy said. "Some see them as gates to the community."

"But, I think most people are happy about the project," she said. "We've met with the community on numerous occasions, and people are really excited."

27-year veteran of the Israeli secret service.

"It's in your mind all the time; you're used to it," the 51-year-old Israeli said about the threat of terrorism.

The material Leshem teaches must be approved by the Israeli Ministry of Defense before the training begins and the training session is restricted to law enforcement and military personnel only.

"Terrorist threats are different from criminal threats in that you have to respond differently. A criminal doesn't want to die, whereas dying is often an integral part of the terrorist's mission," said Marcie-Golden, owner of Golden Security Services. "In Israel, unfortunately, they have a lot of experience with terrorists."

Golden met Leshem while doing a project for the History Channel in Israel. She said Sept. 11 changed her plans in that instead of bringing trainees to Israel, she helped coordinate Avi coming to the states.

The unique training session addressed a gamut of concerns about terrorists and who they are. It also introduced North American authorities to two radically different combat techniques.

Instructors helped law enforcement officers learn how to shoot quickly and accurately with the Israeli method. Additionally, the trainees learned an Israeli form of hand-to-hand combat.

"It's more reactive shooting," Sanford Sgt. Marc Kovacs said about the Israeli method. "It's amazing how accurate you can be with the Israeli system."

In a terrorism event, speed of police response is critical. The Israeli shooting method and Israeli fighting style helps neutralize the threat before more damage is done, Kovacs said. The Israeli self-defense fighting system, Krav Maga, was developed in the 1950s for the Israeli army. The base philosophy is to attack as aggressively as you can while protecting yourself. The Krav Maga was taught by Israeli expert Amnon Darsa.

"It's really simple," Kovacs said. "Krav Maga deals more with natural movement and body reflexes."

Although many of the techniques will not be applied to everyday police work, Kovacs said it will provide building blocks to developing a better response to terrorism events.

Avi Leshem agrees, stating his training only provides "more tools" for a law enforcement officer's toolbox.

"The trainees are here to understand what they can adapt, but not what they can copy," he said. "They are (American police) very sophisticated. They come to see, to study and they're doing very well."

Leshem specializes in aviation security, as he was once a former air marshal for Israeli commercial liner El Al. It is regarded to be one of the most secure airliners in the world. Additionally, he served as the former senior trainer in the Academy of Anti-Terror.

The training class eventually moved to the Sanford Orlando International Airport for further instruction on airport security. This was one of the main reasons Sanford police hosted the class, said police spokeswoman Cleo Cohen.

No word on the training methods at the airport were shared, as that information is highly classified, said instructors.

He said he's not so sure the company that donated the downtown electrical equipment didn't necessarily intend DBA to make profits off the city. Waiting until First Street's drainage and streetscape project is complete may be another option, Jones said. The city is to begin on the project a year from this summer.

Woodruff said the three-year deal would be a "temporary measure" until the downtown redevelopment is finished.

"They've put the time in getting it together when the city or anyone else hasn't managed to do anything," he said.

Two alternative city plans, which include metal poles and overhead wires, are less attractive to commissioners as a quick fix

because the cost of removing them for the upcoming redevelopment project is almost more than their price tag.

Lights attached to the DBA rooftop system will be easier to install and remove, Woodruff said.

In other business, commissioners, unanimously approved to continue negotiations to bring a hydroplane event to Lake Monroe in May 2003. An Unlimited Hydroplane and Formula One Race Event was tentatively scheduled for May 2002, but Mayor Brady Lessard said a lack of sponsors would have hindered Sanford's first Excitement Entertainment event.

"They were still going to be able to do it this year, but with half the boats," he said.

"There might not be a need for it today, but it is coming," Lake Mary City Manager John Litton added.

Sanford, however, isn't feeling the same amount of pressure as Lake Mary. Last year, four new fields opened at Chase Youth Sports Complex.

Nevertheless, Sanford officials agreed the additional playing space will probably be needed in the future.

A possible area for additional fields is county land adjacent to

Sanford's Derby Park. Past discussions have included the county giving the land to Sanford for future use.

"I think it is something that could be shared," said Sanford City Commissioner Whitey Eckstein. "If the acreage is out there and it is environmentally sound, it could be possible."

Eckstein asked city staff to research the property, and both cities' officials agreed to continue working together on a possible partnership regarding additional playing fields.

Eckstein said. "He's a no nonsense, smoking mirrors kind of guy. He fought for what he believed in and he acted on it."

Layer's education career began at Seminole High School in 1955. He was a biology teacher and the head baseball coach and assistant basketball coach. From there, he moved to Sanford Junior High School — currently known as Sanford Middle School.

Henley named Layer assistant principal at Lyman High School in 1967. He stayed there until 1970. Over the next two years, Layer moved from Milwee Middle School to Teague Middle School. He finally was elected as superintendent of schools in 1972. He stayed at the position until 1981. After a brief six-month principal position, Layer retired in 1981.

"He's contributed a lot to state education as well as Seminole

County," said Henley who lost in a run-off to Layer for the 1970 superintendent election. "Bud was a political power in this county for a long time."

Layer's techniques as superintendent set him apart from his peers. He believed in more school based management rather than centralized control, and he strongly supported his teachers, Henley said.

His legend as an educator began in the late '60s when teachers statewide walked out of the classrooms in protest of the state level of funding for education.

"It was pretty easy because I was the leader of the teacher walk-out," Layer said. "We had just had a meeting before the strike and I told them we were all in this together."

Only a couple years later, bringing the schools and teachers back together was one of Layer's tasks as new superintendent.

"Bud did an awful lot in the '70s to right the ship," Henley said.

"We probably did that better than an other county in the state," Layer said.

Layer regards his greatest accomplishments as superintendent as carpeting and air conditioning all the classrooms in the county. In addition, 11 new schools were built and several major renovations were made to existing schools during his term.

Other efforts to continue Layer's legacy include a golf tournament to set-up a perpetual scholarship in his name. Henley, Lake Mary High School's first principal Don Reynolds and former Seminole Judge Wally Hall are sponsoring the event scheduled for April 1 at Sanford's Mayfair Country Club.

Sponsors are still needed for the event, and it is tax deductible, as the Seminole County Education Association will administer the scholarship funds.

Nine SAC wrestlers in top six at states

LAKELAND — Led by undefeated freshman Jason Robbins, the Seminole Athletic Conference had nine wrestlers place in the Top 6 at the 2002 FHSAA Florida Wrestling Finals at The Lakeland Center this past weekend.

Robbins, from Oviedo, improved to 49-0 with a 7-4 victory over Robert Hagin of Valrico-Bloomdale in the 112-pound finale.

Winter Springs (76 points) just missed winning the state championship in Class 3A, finishing third behind champion St. Cloud (78 points) and runner-up Miami-Southridge (77.5 points).

The Bears did get a first-ever state champion in wrestling when Joe Curry (29-2) claimed the 140-pound class with a 34-second pin of St. Cloud's Travis Maughan in the final match. Maughan was the highest placing grappler for the Bulldogs.

Winter Springs would have won the title if Eric Parent could have pulled off a major upset of defending state champion Carols West in the 189-pound finale.

But West, from Southridge, was up to the test and won a 13-3 major decision. Parent did succeed, however, in keeping Southridge from winning its third title in four years by not getting pinned or losing by a technical fall.

Also finishing in the top five for the Bears were Johnny Walker (sixth at 119-pounds) and Clint Walt (fifth at 135-pounds).

The Lions wound up in eighth place as Robbins was joined in the top six by Justin Fraga (third place at 119-pounds) and Steve Hewitt (fifth place at 103-pounds).

Seminole wound up 38th after Brett Martin finished fourth at 103-pounds.

Lake Brantley (47th) and Lake Mary (tie for 58th) also sent wrestlers to the meet.

Lyman finished 33rd behind defending champion Brandon in Class 2A. Brandon has won 13 state titles since 1977.

Leading the way for the Greyhounds was Andrew Popeck, who finished sixth in the 140-pound class.

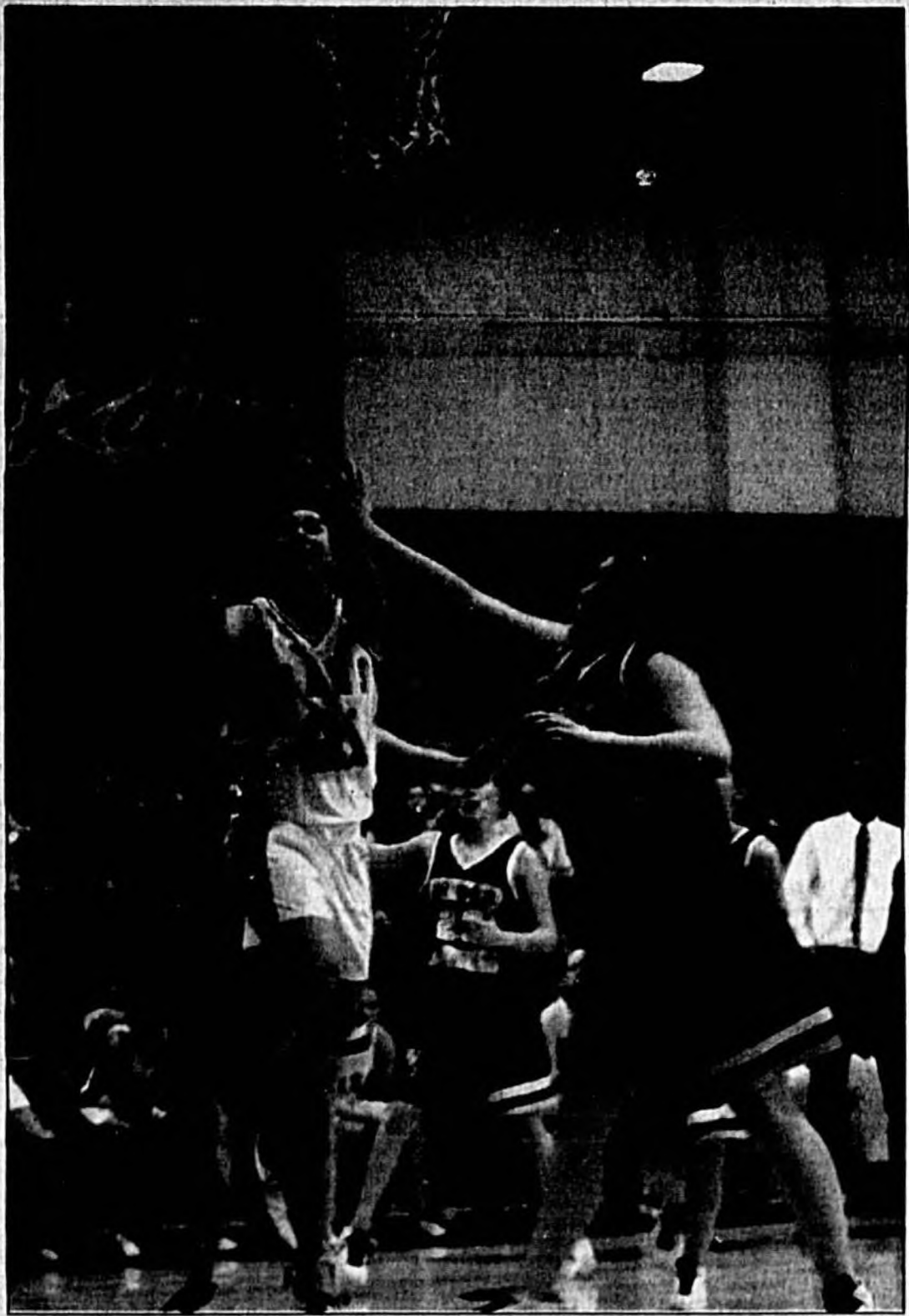
If Lake Mary is to win the crown, it will have to defeat some pretty impressive competition.

Winter Springs in semi's tonight

LAKELAND — The Lakeland Center must be like a home away from home for the Winter Springs girls' basketball team.

Tonight, the Bears of coach Betsy Register go after their fourth straight appearance in a state championship game when they take on Clearwater High School (32-1) in the Semifinals of the 2002 FHSAA Class 5A Girls Basketball Championships.

Winter Springs (28-4), which won State Championships in 1999 and 2000 before finishing second last year, will be taking on a Tornadoes squad that has been ranked No. 2 in the state for much of the season and is making its third straight Final Four appearance and fifth in six years.

The Vikings missed the final four last year, but FWB won the Class 6A crown in 1999 and the Class 5A title in 1994.

The Bears won their fourth straight Regional Championship with a 68-50 romp over Mainland in Daytona Beach Saturday night.

The Buccaneers (24-4) never led, but kept the game close until Winter Springs went on an 8-0 run to open the third quarter.

The Bears were up 19-14 after the first quarter and 29-23 at halftime before Stetson signee Missy Guadagnino, who only scored seven points in the game, keyed the opening run by scoring five of the eight points. The outburst gave Winter Springs a 37-23 lead and Mainland never got closer than 13 points the rest of the way.

University of South Alabama signee Jen Forst led the way for Bears despite missing the end of the game after getting a knee to the ribs, scoring 30 points on

Another heartbreak ends SCC men's season

OCALA — The first round of the Mid-Florida Conference Tournament ended up being a microcosm of Seminole Community College's season.

Playing at the White House on the campus of Central Florida Community College in Ocala, the Raiders men of coach Stan Cromartie played a great game, only to see it slip away in the final minutes, as the host Patriots prevailed, 89-83, in overtime.

It was another in a long line of losses by less than five points for SCC, which finishes

the season 15-16.

The Raiders had earned the shot at CFCC by defeating St. Johns River Community College in Palatka on Saturday.

The Patriots were to have taken on to-seeded Florida Community College in Jacksonville for the MFC's second spot in next week's state tournament. Daytona Beach Community College won the regular season conference championship.

Freshman Kelly Ortiz hit a three-pointer with 90-seconds left in overtime to break an 81-81 tie and starting a 7-0 run in overtime for CFCC (19-10).

SCC had tied the game at 81 with a three-

pointer from the wing by Jonathan Sterling with two minutes left, but would score only two more points the rest of the way.

"We're an athlete away from Gene's (veteran CFCC head coach Gene Smithson) kids," Cromartie said. "Gene's kids played their hearts out. The last 48 seconds his kids made a couple plays and ours' didn't. That was the difference in the ball game."

The Raiders played strong defense in overtime, but the Patriots were able to score on every overtime possession.

CFCC led by nine points late in the first half and by seven late in the second half,

McIntosh, the lone senior starter for the Rams, hit Zabel with a perfect corner kick right in front of the net.

That score looked like it would be enough as Lake Mary outshot the Patriots 16-3.

But American's Monique Davis rolled a shot past a diving Haerens to tie the score with under four minutes remaining, setting the stage for Zabel's heroics.

The goal was the first allowed by the Rams in the playoffs

since Seminole scored in a 5-1 loss to Lake Mary in the first game of the district tournament.

Head coach Bill Elseele now has an overall record of 349-125-56 and three state championships in 19 years with the Rams.

Assisting Elseele were Tammy Scott Campbell, Howard Hawkins, Sarah Canatsey, Nicole Roberts and strength and conditioning coach Steve Slain. The student trainer was John Halsey.

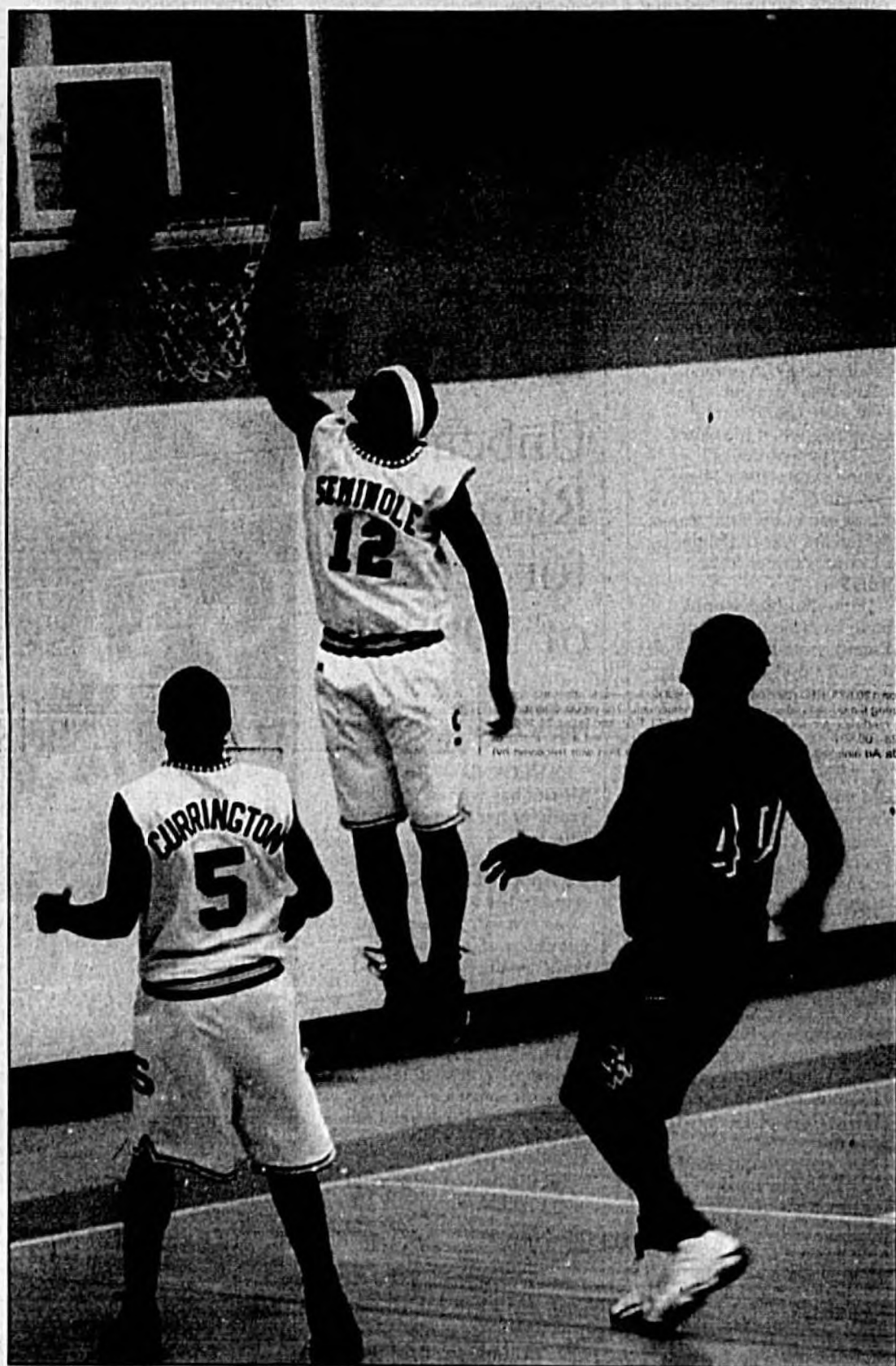

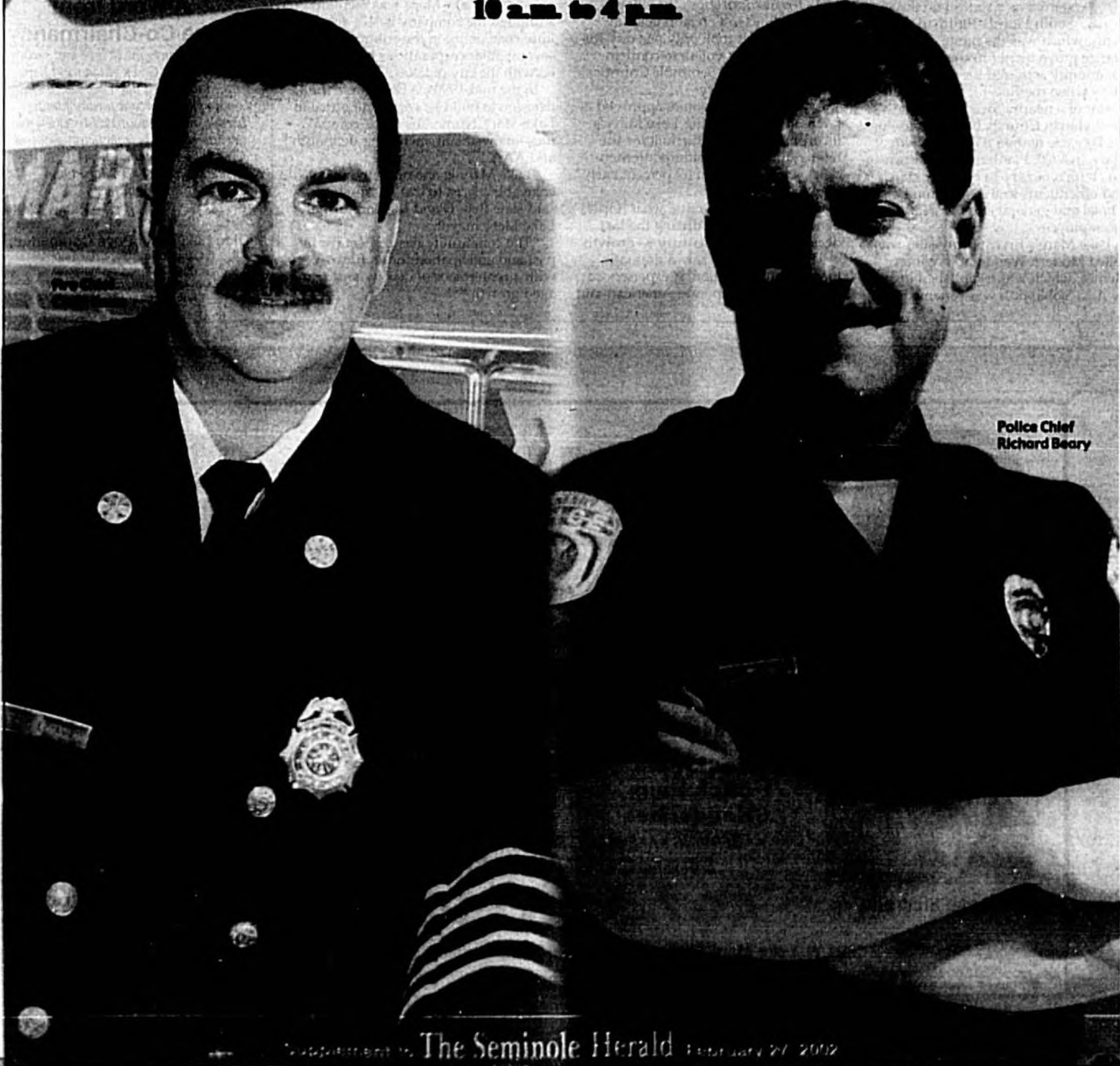

A brief Lake Mary history lesson ...

Although Olde Lake Mary Days is held each year to reflect on the community's past, this year special recognition will be placed on the people serving Lake Mary's residents. Organizers of the event want to thank members of the Lake Mary police and fire departments and everyone else who works to make the community a better and safer place to live.

The Lake Mary community started as a station on the South Florida Railroad called Bents, which was the name of an orange grove owner in the area. The community acquired the name Lake Mary when the Rev. J.F. Sundell, the pastor of a nearby Swedish Presbyterian Church, built a house on the lake. He named it after his wife, Mary. In 1900, Planters Manufacturing Co., built a factory to produce starches and other items in the community, and a hotel and general store were built for its employees.

Lake Mary's first sub-division was called Modern Woodman's Winter Homes, which was established in 1916 by A.A. Sjolom. It was renamed

Crystal Lake Winter Homes four years later.

In the 1960s, when Lake Mary was still unincorporated, the area was considered "one of the most tranquil spots in America." The Seminole County Chamber of Commerce described life in Lake Mary in 1960 as "one long golden day followed by another; It is a place where you wander down to the lake for a quick, cool splash, catch a fish or two, or just sit in blessedly calm and quiet meditation ... an atmosphere which offers, perhaps, the best therapeutic treatment for jangled nerves yet discovered by man."

As for incorporation, the city of Lake Mary wasn't created in a day. Nevertheless, it took only one day for the community's voters to confirm they wanted to be Seminole County's seventh municipality.

On Aug. 7, 1973, voters approved a referendum concerning Lake Mary's incorporation. Voter turnout for the referendum was considered tremendous, with more than 67 percent casting votes.

One word can describe what happened to Lake Mary during the last decade of the 20th Century — growth.

The city not only saw a dramatic increase in population, it experienced the benefits of corporate American and

a good economy.

In 1990, the population of Lake Mary was around 5,000. Today, more than 12,000 people call the city home.

During the middle of the decade, the Timacuan Development was completed, which began the movement of people to the city. Since then, numerous other residential sites have been built within Lake Mary's boundaries, resulting in the gradual but steady increase in population.

On the corporate side, Lake Mary's business community has not been immune to growth.

Before the last decade, the main corporation in Lake Mary was Siemens. Although the company is still an important entity in the community, several other corporations have located with the city of lakes.

In the mid-1990s, AT&T made the decision to build its corporate office in Lake Mary. Numerous other companies followed suit, including BellSouth and AAA.

"Lake Mary is one of the most enjoyable places to live and to work," said state Rep. David Mealor, former Lake Mary mayor.

"The community has respect for its past and anticipation for its future with a centerpiece of quality and managed growth."

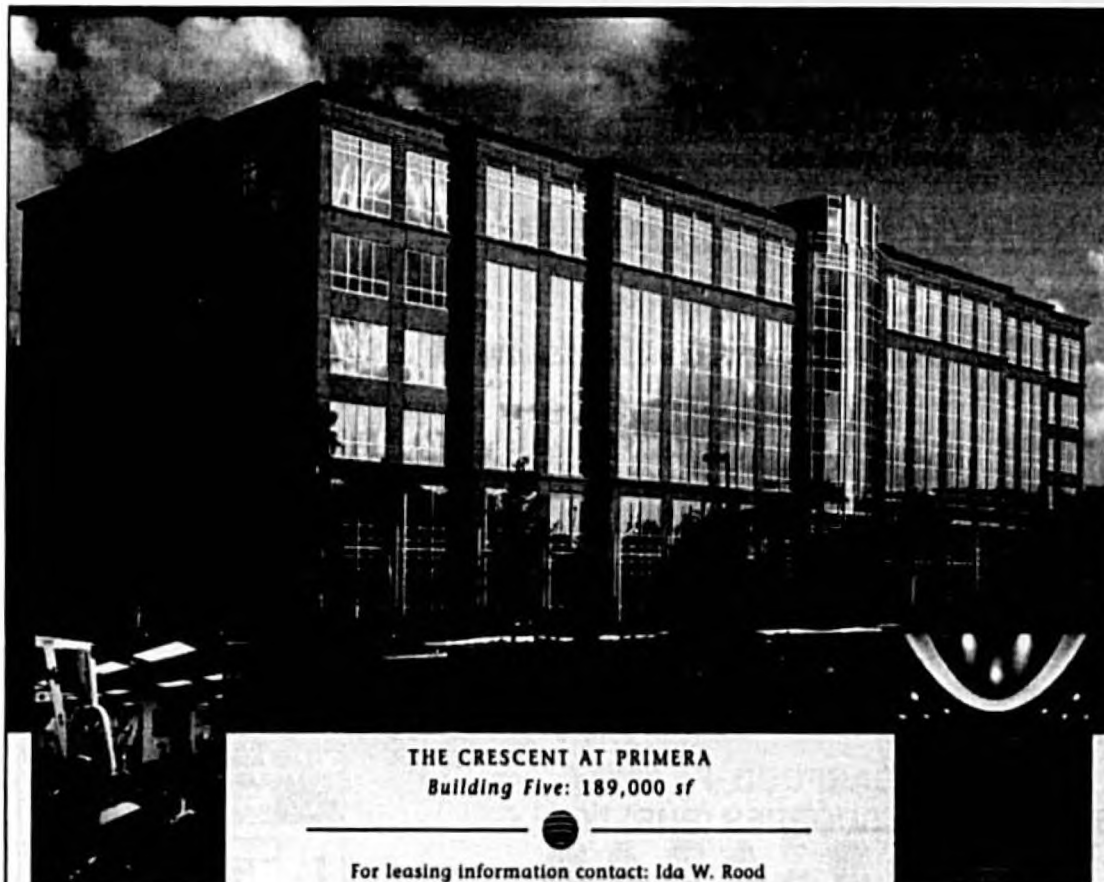
The AARP is an organization for Americans

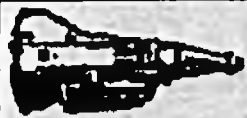

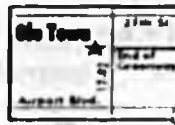

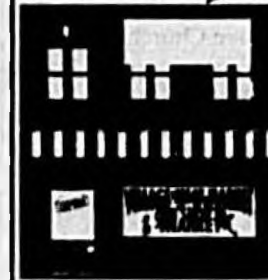

Honorable mention will receive a free booth space for 2003. The Merit Award winner will receive \$50. The Mayor's Award winner (Best of Show) will receive \$100 and free booth space for 2003. The Society is able to sponsor the awards with the money they are raising on the raffle tickets. Members of the Society will also be helping out throughout the day at Olde Lake Mary Days.

The leader for the Society is their new president, Peggy Wolfe. Peggy is also a member of the Commission and Co-Chairman of Olde Lake Mary Days. Peggy and her husband both work part

time as living history demonstrators.

The Society is looking forward to an active year. They will be taking over the sponsorship of Girl Scout Day in the fall. Girl Scout Day is an annual event the Lake Mary Historical Commission has hosted every year for local Girl Scouts. The meetings are held at the Lake Mary Historical Museum.

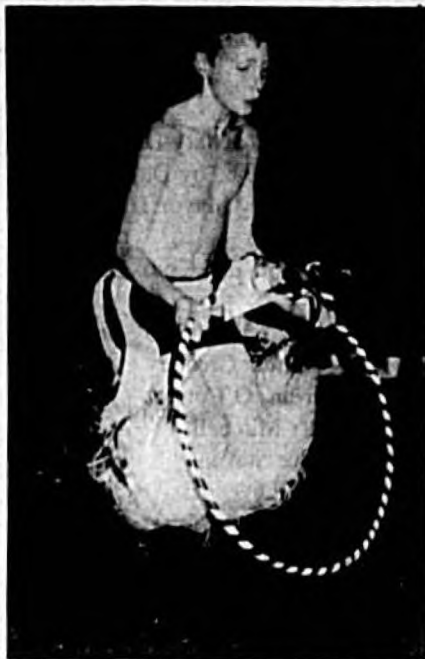

During this time, they have performed more than 1,500 shows for more than 260,000 people. Most of the dancers are young, between the ages of 8 and 18, who are committed to the effort.

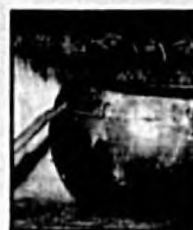
Performances to be given by the group in Lake Mary will include
