Shortage Of Teachers In State Cited

TALLAHASSEE (AP) — A shortage of teachers may face Florida public schools with the start of the fall term only two weeks away, the State Department of Education reported today.

More than 68,000 teachers—2,000 more than last year—are needed by the schools. But the education department said at last count in July 1, 1965 vacancies were 42,000.

On the average, teachers will be better paid this year than last. The average salary for an instructional personnel last year was \$6,000.

Many of the teachers who have been hired start a week of preparation for the start of school this week with pre-school conferences and workshops.

Women Are Important In This Man's Army

About 23,000 women are in the five U.S. armed forces today.

They hold the same ranks, draw the same base pay and often have the same assignments as the men, but do not go into combat arms operations.

The ratio of women to men in service is lower now than in World War II, but that is due, in part, to the callings on strength fixed by the Defense Department.

There are about 10,000 in the Women's Army Corps (WAC); 6,500 in the Women's Army Medical Center (WAMC); 1,800 Women Marines; 6,700 in the Air Force (WAF) and about 350 in the Coast Guard.

Especially, the official answer given as to why women, who are in no danger of being drafted, volunteer is: the desire to serve, patients and the wounded.

When the women themselves are asked, other reasons appear.

A recent survey of WAC enlisted women indicated that 25 per cent joined the army because they believed there were advantages for individual training in various skills, 24 per cent because of opportunity for additional formal education, 19 per cent because they could get to travel. The balance included those who gave independence and security as among their reasons.

Some of the services think the Viet Nam war has influenced women to join up, but other services discount this.

Unlike the other four forces, the Coast Guard does not have a commission women in the regular establishment at this time. Those on active duty are reservists.

MANY ARE CAREERISTS

Do women reenlist or even make the service a career? Generally, reenlistments by enlisted women seem to compare favorably with or exceed those of men, especially after the first one or two tours of active duty.

About getting into service and what you do when there: Although the armed forces draft men without regard to their education the volunteer system for women has a basic requirement—recruits must be high school graduates or have equivalent education.

To enlist a woman must have reached her 18th birthday and, if under 21, have written consent of parents or a guardian. She must not be married nor have dependents. Minimum enlistment for the WACs is two years; three years for the WAVES, WAFs and Women Marines.

Although a woman must not be married upon entering a service, she may marry after completing basic training. If she marries, she may be released from active duty, on her request.

Don't postpone filing for social security after age 65 because you are still working. Recent changes in the law permit benefits to be refigured automatically once a year to determine whether the addition of earnings will increase your benefit. 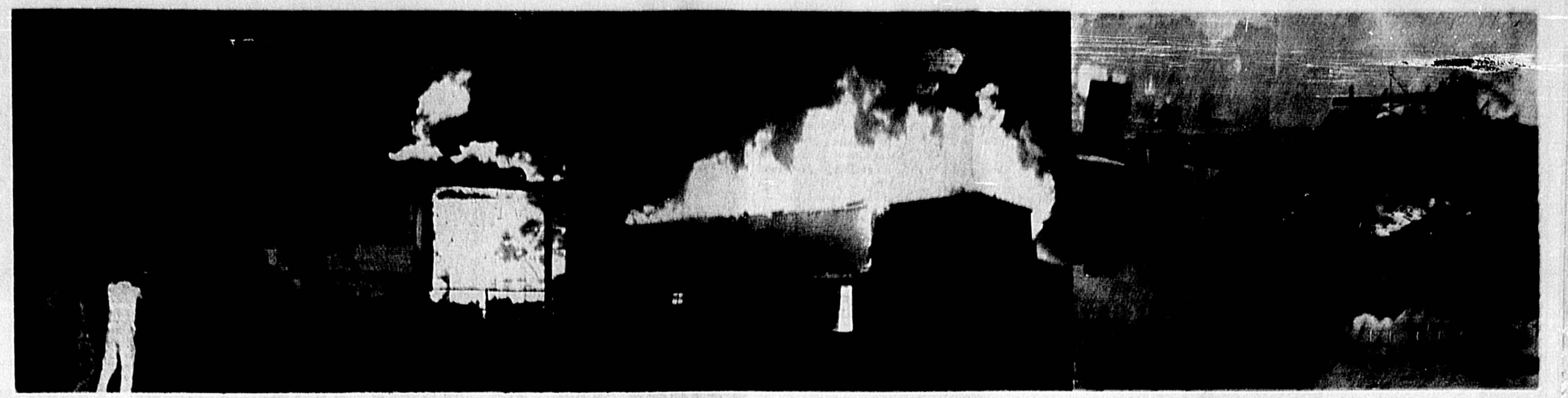

N. Orlando Police Chief Quits Post

North Orlando Village Council will meet in special session at 7:30 p.m. Friday to act upon resignations of Police Chief Lawrence Phillips and Councilman Jack Hipp and to fill by appointment at least two vacancies on the zoning board.

Phillips, who took over the job as police chief the first week in July, told The Herald today that "although I realize today that the salary (\$200 per month) was when I accepted the office, I have found it inadequate to meet today's high costs of living and feel council has not done the job for this amount of money unless he has part time work elsewhere."

He said he "realizes council is working on a most limited budget but do feel that with re-examination, the salary could possibly be raised to \$300 per month if a co-operative attitude is received from the people."

Phillips, who as yet has not been invited to attend Friday night's meeting, said, however, he will "stand if invited, to explain my situation and views to council and the public if they will listen with an open mind."

He stated that he is offered only in a constructive manner with no intention of adding to the troubles of a council which already has a thankless job.

He also approved tentative approval to the raising of refuse rates from \$1 to \$1.50 monthly on residential pickups and from \$3 to \$4 on commercial rates. This could produce about \$27,800 in additional revenue.

They also approved tentatively an estimate of land value revisions in the city, under the current market value assessment level to produce another \$45,000. It was noted that no buildings or personal property are being considered under the new assessment.

The present proposed budget expenditures are \$204,000 over estimated income. The two increases being considered would bring in a total of \$72,800 additional income.

This addition, plus about \$2,000 worth of slashes would leave about \$113,000 more to either be found or cut out.

Next budget session is set for Aug. 29. Regular commission meeting is Aug. 22.

Charred ruins of what had been the Navy Exchange building at Sanford Naval Air Station were being examined today to determine what caused the blaze which destroyed the structure housing the dining room and cafeteria, post office, dry cleaning shop, theater and exchange (department stores).

Flames discovered at five minutes after midnight this morning razed the building, with an estimated loss of \$175,000 to the contents, all covered by insurance. There was no estimate as to the dollar loss of the building.

Memphis officials were awaiting word from Washington, D. C., whether the exchange building will be replaced, in view of the proposed deactivation two years hence. There was some conjecture that, instead of rebuilding, the fire may speed up deactivation.

Two sailors on their way for some night fishing, AMEL H. C. Doster and AMES J. Wentz, saw smoke coming from vents of the cafeteria kitchen and sounded the alarm at 12:05 a.m.

The station fire department responded, and then called in the station fire and crash department (for airplane disasters). With the blaze out of control at 1 a.m., calls were sent out for help to the Sanford fire department, Glendeville and Longwood volunteer fire departments and they responded.

Three firemen suffered minor injuries in fighting the blaze.

Cash and other valuables were removed from safes at about 1:30 a.m. and ammunition for sale from the exchange section at 2 a.m.

There was some fear the high winds would spread the blaze to the adjacent dispensary but firemen prevented this. Paints and other garden supplies were removed at 3 a.m.

The ruins were still smoldering at 5 a.m.

It was ironical that the blaze occurred on the final day of duty here for the exchange officer, Lt. Robert Gahn, who was relieved today by Lt. (jg) James Hurlbutt.

It also was ironical that the fire occurred only two weeks before the departure of the base commanding officer, Capt. C. W. Swanson, due to be relieved Aug. 31 for another assignment after two years here.
