Lessard: Put conference center on hold Sanford mayor says time is not right to

move forward with downtown project

SANFORD - Mayor Brady Lessard will ask city commissioners Monday to delay, possible for a year or more, plans to build a downtown conference center.

The move by Lessard comes as city officials search for revenue sources to fund the project after Seminole County Commissioners pulled their support for the project ast month.

"I want to make sure that what-ever product the city ends up with — and it will end up with a conference center eventually — is the best product it can be," he said. "By waiting, this will allow for the product to develop better."

The proposed project, which has been in the works for several

months, is a collaboration between the city of Sanford and the private developer, Suncor Properties Inc. It would included a multi-level, off-site hotel; renovations and additions to the existing Sanford Civic Center; retail space; an outdoor amphitheater; and a surface parking area.

"If putting it [conference center] on hold wasn't the best thing for the city we wouldn't be putting it on hold," said Lessard. "The citizens of Sanford, in a referendum several years ago and all the way to this point, have trusted the city commis-sion and myself to do what is right. I think city commission will agree with me on Monday night to step back and take a breath."




Pay attention driving through busy intersections during the week leading to Labor Day as there's a good chance a fire fighter will be waiting there for you.

Iraqi Diary: UN compound blasted

Editor's note: Staff Sergeant Charlie C. Carlson III has provided the Seminole Herald a daily journal of his experiences in Baghdad, Iraq as part of the 549th Military Police company attached to the 2nd Calvary Regiment. Today's journal entry is from earlier this usek just after the United Nations headquarters bombing. Because of the significance of this incident, the Herald is publishing this entry today. The newspaper will revert back to chronological order in Wednesday's issue.

20 AUG 2003 I guess you heard about the UN headquarters blowing up. I was laying on my cot in the machine shop of the cigarette factory where we live and all of the sudden it sounded like the whole world exploded. The whole place shook and there was a oud "BOOOM." It was about 1530 in the afternoon.

One of our day shift patrols was already out there, and we were notified by Enforcer-6 [the company commander] to immediately respond. I wasn't sure about what was going on, but was told to meet him over at the UN building

about five miles away. On the way we passed several M-1 Abrams tanks blocking off the highway. Upon arriving I could see that the whole left side of the UN building was

blown away. I had my trucks move on past to where Enforcer-6 was at. We immediately started moving people back. I was right next to the UN building, there was debris all

over the place, people with blood all over them, some walking and some obviously dead or injured so bad they couldn't move. Rescue workers were talking to people still trapped inside.

I was busy keeping people back and one of them was Mr. Paul Bremer (U.S. civilian administrator of Iraq). I said "Sorry sir, let me get these people behind you out of here." He looked kinda stunned, but said "No, it's okay, let me get out of your way." I saw one of Bremer's security guys that was a friend of mine, we had gone to CID agents



our trucks [Armored Humvees with two at one end and one at the other. We were there with the psyops [psychological operations] truck in case we needed to broadcast to the public that the area was closed

Dust still filled the air, it was a mess, victims being hauled out on litters, some dead, body parts mixed with chunks of concrete tangled with wires and pipes. I heard a rumor that the Assistant Secretary General of the UN was killed. They were talking to him through the rubble, but they didn't hear anything further. It was a noisy, nasty sight that I do not wish

Underwater band shell: Old time Sanford folks fondly recall the lakefront band shell that was situated on the small, man-made peninsula at the northern most end of Park Avenue. It was torn down in the 1960s.

Occasionally a citizen will suggest that city leaders rebuild a band shell on the same location. If the city does undertake such a project, maybe they could piece together the old band shell. They certainly would not have to go far to get it.

Riverwalk update: Speaking of the seawall, most of it has been replaced. Smith said Friday crews have about 600 more feet of seawall to install around the Memorial Park peninsula. The project now moves into the above-ground improvements, better known as the **Riverwalk**.

Smith said the project is on schedule to finish in February 2004. Crews have already begun rebuilding Seminole Boulevard near Mellonville Avenue, and Smith said the improvements will become much more visible in the coming months.

Coffee buzz: Rumors have been circulating for a couple of weeks that the java giant Starbucks Caffee was evelog downtown Sanford as its must spot for expansion. That's true, sort of.

The Sanford Planning and Zoning Commission approved a plan Thursday night for Suncor Properties Inc. to build a trailhead building on Seminole Boulevard at Palmetto Avenue. The facility would provide restrooms and shelter from the weather for those using the Riverwalk and was originally going to be built by the city. The cost of the overall Riverwalk project was more expensive than the city's budget and the trailhead building got the ax. Suncor officials approached the city about building the trailhead facility at no cost to the taxpayers. In return the Suncor wants to lease space to two national tenants, one a coffee shop, the other an ice cream shop. Suncor's president, Bob Horian, said he's trying to secure either Starbucks, Barnie's Coffee & Tea Company or Seattle Coffee Co. for the 1,550-square-foot portion of the facility, and either Dairy Queen or a Nestle soft-serve ice cream shop for remaining 990-square-foot retail space. Of course, there is already a coffee shop downtown, two actually. Our House Books and Coffee on Commercial Street, and Cool Beans at Magnolia Square. I've drank gallons of Starbucks coffee, but both of these local shops have two advantages. First, both are locally owned and as an employee of a community newspaper, I try to shop local first. Second, both Our House and Cool Beans sell coffee in small, medium and large cup sizes. At Starbucks it's tall, grande and venti. I'm not hip enough to determine which size is which and usually just point to the cup size I want.

Visitors aren't always snowbirds Rainy season brings reptiles slithering into backyards

Depending on where you live, you may have some unwanted visitors these days. With the unusually heavy rain and flooding, you may find yourself in the same neighbor-



hood as alligators and snakes. There are two old-wives tales that go along with this concept. First of all, in high water periods (such as what we have now), they say the alligators and snakes will find more wetlands in which to exist and hunt for food. If a pond springs up in your back yard because of

heavy rains, alligators may visit you, and perhaps make a meal out of your dog - something they would find difficult to do in normal habitats. Snakes, which like wetter territory, will have a bigger area in which to slither and may also find their way into your yard.

Then, there's the other side. Those who say alligators and snakes are more apt to come out into residential areas during times of unusually light rainfall or droughts. They are traveling the area looking for water, which is becoming difficult to find because of the drought.

So, no matter which way we look at it, you should tell yourself that you are possibly in danger. Alligators have been known to travel in drainage ditches, a wet alley behind houses, and at times, even down the middle of a street. Small dogs are one of their choice entrees, as are small children.

So, keep your children away from wet land on your property, keep your dog on a leash, and keep your eyes on both - ALL the time.

Day after day we hear about some area where a small child was attacked by an alligator. In most cases, we hear that no one thought there was a gator nearby or none was seen prior to the attack.

Standing down on the shore of Lake Monroe, (if it's possible these days with the construction underway), or any other lake in the area, you can easily see the gators swimming around, just skinning the surface. Tourists find them interesting and in order to bring the gators closer to shore for a better look, they'll toss out some food - a piece of bread or maybe leftover French fries or a burger. Yes, that will generally bring the gator closer — but it will also tell the gator that man is a great food source, and whenever you see one, come running. New school will officially be named next

A groundbreaking ceremony for Elementary "J" School, which will receive its official name in September, was held Tuesday in Chuluota.

Construction on the facility, located at 3101 Snow Hill Road in Chuluota, began immediately following the ceremony. The \$8.4 million project is scheduled for com-pletion in July 2004, just in time for the first day of school on Aug. 2.

The 114,000 square foot educational center will be identical to Highlands and Bentley elementary schools.

The two-story, brick building will feature 38 classrooms, several resource rooms, a computer lab, art and music suites, a media center with a television studio and a multipurpose cafeteria with a stage. The building, being constructed by Clancy and Theys Construction Company with architecture by SchenkelShultz Architecture, will also feature a covered, outdoor physical education pavilion.

The school will accommodate a student population of 800, which will significantly cut down on the overpopulation problem at local schools in the surrounding areas.

"Subdivisions are going up all around that area," said Richard Wells, director of community involvement and public information and interim transportation direc-tor of Seminole County Public Schools. "We needed a new school to handle the number of students.

According to Wells, schools such as Stenstrom Elementary are currently serving 30 more students than it was built for. Other facilities such as Partin, Carillon and Evans elementary schools have 136, 188 and 200 more students, respectively, than intended.





Nandina: The heavenly and sacred bamboo

Nandina, known as the Heavenly Bamboo or Sacred Bamboo, is an evergreen shrub from the Barberry plant family introduced to the United States as an ornamental plant in 1804. Native to central China and Japan

and west to India, it pro-duces a bluish-green foliage which often turns red to reddish purple in fall and winter. In late spring or early summer, panicles of creamy flow-ers appear, followed by spectacular clusters of red berries that persist through the winter. It has become naturalized in some wooded in north Florida and is considered

o be invasive.


The plant: Nandina is a multi-stemmed plant, with bamboo-like canes, growing about 2 to 8 feet tall. The ever-green, femilike, horizontal, compound leaves, measure 12 to 20 inches long and have elliptic, leathery leaflets to 2 inches in length, reddish when young and turning red or purple in autumn.

Leaves have bulbous swellings present along rachis. In the spring, it produces small white flowers that are borne in upright, terminal panicles up to one foot long. Individual flowers are bisexual, petals pinkish white and with prominent yellow anthers. The fruits are round, bright red berries, contain two seeds per fruit and measure about quarter of an inch wide. Fruits are poisonous.

Culture: This plant grows best in the northerner part of the state on hardiness zones six-nine. This shrub has been grown in southern Florida but is short-lived there. It is not heat tolerant. Nandina grows best in moist acid loarn soils, but it tolerates a wide range of other soll types and withstands drought.

Grows best in full sun but tolerates partial shade. Winter sun helps redden foliage. Nandina should be planted in groups to improve the formation of berries. If left unpruned, it becomes leggy. Remove old canes or cut canes to various lengths to create a dense plant.

To reduce height on a large plant, prune tallest one-third of stems back to 6 inches long each year. Canes cannot be forced to branch. Nandina is considered a plant with little or no pest problems. Scale insects may affect this plant occasionally and root rot induced by soil-inhabiting fungl can cause some damage in wet soils.

The Lake Mary Police Department recently welcomed a new officer to the force. The rookie enjoys Scooby Snacks rather than doughnuts during his breaks, can run through the streets without being reprimand-ed and sometimes drools after a successful capture of a suspect. The officer in question is a 2-

year-old German Shepherd named Joker. The purebred is a full-service police dog, the first in 14 years for the Lake Mary Police Department. Joker is a wonderful addition

to the police department," said Lake Mary Police Chief Richard M. Beary. "He has a great personality."

Once it was determined Joker had the personality to become a police dog - play and prey drives, social skills and courage - he was partnered with Officer Kevin Pratt of the Special Operations K9 Unit, who received a transfer from the investigations division. The two immediately began attending a K9 training academy hosted by the Apopka Police Department. Since March, Pratt and Joker

have logged more than 510 training hours, plus 140 hours of specialty training in drug sruffing. Joker, who was trained using positive reinforcements such as toys, treats and playtime, will continue a rigorous training schedule to maintain his level of accuracy.

"He is a wonderful partner,"

said Pratt. "We live together and go to work together. He's absolutely great. He is very bal-anced — he is a well-mannered dog at home, but knows the difference between his off time and work time."

As a member of the police department, Joker is responsible for several aspects of police work, including patrols. With his keen sense of smell, Joker is able to track lost people or suspects who have committed crimes, and conduct building and area searches.

'He can search a building more thoroughly with his nose to pick up human scents to help narrow our search down," said Pratt, who began his career as a police officer in Lake Mary nearly five years ago. "It would take several officers a long time to do what he can do in a few minutes.

"it's his senses and agility that make him invaluable," he added.

Joker is trained not only to track, but also to apprehend suspects, specifically those who aren't compliant. Joker is also trained to "sniff out" six types of drugs.


Our role is to back up and assist other officers in high profile cases and drug calls," explained Pratt.

In order to help spread the word about the Lake Mary Police Department's K9 unit, Joker and Pratt will conduct demonstrations at community events throughout Lake Mary and Seminole County, including at the Lake Mary-Heathrow Art Festival, and various schools and churches.

Stetson's Corner: 'Send the kids to the woods'

Our recent trip to North Carolina found us in the Pisgah National Forest at the Cradle of Forestry - where forestry as a science began in America. If you are ever anywhere near this place, you need to visit. There is much all of us can learn from those who love and care for the land.

Prior to that trip, I attended the Little Big Econ State Forest Management Plan Advisory Group public hearing held at the Geneva Community Center. This meeting, a chance for the public to give input into the now 10-year plan for the 5,048 acres off Snowhill Road in Geneva, helped citizens understand what the Florida Division of Forestry (DOF) envisions for this parcel and how they interact with other agencies to ensure harmony in all areas of concern.



 To ensure the long term viability of populations and species considered rare, endangered, threatened or of special concern.

Scoles To integrate human use through a total resource con-

cept, not emphasizing any particular use over the others or over restoration, maintenance and protection of native ecosystems.

ropagation: bird such as mockingbirds, cedar waxwings, cardinals and robins are attracted to the red fruits and help disperse the seeds.

Squirrels and opossums and raccoons also contribute to the dispersal of the seeds. Seeds may take many months or two seasons to germinate and are difficult to germinate under artificial conditions. The plant produces rhizomes that can be used to propagate this plant by division. Valuable specimens have been propagated using tissue-culture ychniques.

Landscape uses: This plant with such beautiful colors and low maintenance requirements certainly has a place in any landscape. It can be used as a groundcover, shrub, hedge, screen, border, specimen, container or planter, for mass planting or accent. It is splendid as a foundation plant if kept below 5 feet.

Varieties: Alba has dull white berries; Compacta is a dwarf form growing about three feet high and pro-ducing little quantities of berries; Harbor Dwarf, another dwarf form under 2 feet, with a pinkish-bronze spring color and red-bronze fall color; Atropurpurea Nana, a dwarf form growing under 2 feet tall, with foliage tinged reddish purple year round and leaves somewhat cupped. Dwarf culti-vars with some red fall color and little amounts of fruits are becoming popular. The varieties Harbor Dwarf and Firepower do not produce seeds in nursery environments.

Ecological problems: Nandina has invaded and become naturalized in woodlands of three counties in North Carolina. It has also invaded woodlands in northern Florida, Georgia and Alabama, displacing native vegetation. It has been found forming dense groves in habitats of Florida Caverns State Park affecting the native flora. It has been reported as an invasive plant in Jackson, Gadsden, Leon, Wakulla and Citrus counties.



anyone to ever have to see. Later that night, about 2300, traffic had dwindled down and they had brought in portable lights and generators. We, the 2nd Cav, and CNN were the only ones left there, along with some workers. By midnight the only sound was the hum of generators running the lights. We stood guard while the workers continued working through the night.

workers continued working through the night. A CNN guy, named Willie, from Scotland, gave us some cookies and sodas. There was a footbridge between my two locations, and we and CNN were the only ones in that area. The media cameramen used the footbridge to shoot their footage from. Willie let me and my soldiers use his satellite phone to call home,

I guess CNN picked up the tab. I cycled all my soldiers through using the phone, then I got to talk with my wife and my boys from the scene.

Joyce said she had been watching on CNN and she and some of the other wives had identified our vehicles on TV by the bumper numbers and some of their husbands.

Before I started using the phone, I had walked down to the CNN truck and heard shots ring out real close in the neighborhood on the other side of the highway. So I ran to get cover behind the CNN truck, so I was actually talking to Joyce while taking cover behind the truck. Later I stopped and checked a vehicle being driven by one of the ambassadors to the UN. It was one hectic day, you might say it started with a blast, but it was one of the biggest events to happen.

They said it was a cement truck loaded with explosives that blew up in front of the UN. It really doesn't make logical sense to me for the enemy to do that to the UN because it will only bring down an international wrath on them that didn't exist before.

It would seem more logical for the enemy to have done this to the U.S. headquarters and not the UN that hasn't been in total agreement with the U.S. on Iraq. But that's the part that mystifies my detective nature, something doesn't fit the usual pattern on this one. I'm just always suspicious of such things.

Handlebar hints: Area company teaches motorcycle safety

- Is the freedom of the open road calling you?

If so, Ace Motorcycle Safety, Inc., a Seminole County-based company, can help get you on your way to feeling the wind in your hair and the thrill of adventure.

The school, which moved Its 5-year-old company from Maitland to its new location Ronald Reagan 00 Boulevard just outside Lake Mary nearly two months and safe." ago, teaches its students to ride motorcycles and handle unforeseen obstacles that may arise while on a ride.

"This class has saved my life at least three times that 1 know of," said Laura Treadway, founder and owner of Ace. "It's all about the confidence level of the rider. The bike shouldn't intimidate its rider."

Treadway, who took the class in 1996 to prepare for a trip to the annual Sturgis Motorcycle Rally in Sturgis, Mich., decided to open her own company less than two years later in order to better prepare students for riding women, too, especially if

a motorcycle.

The curriculum of the safety course is designed to create a mental attitude that fosters safe riding and enforces proper riding skills in the student.

"Since taking the class, I realize I didn't know what I didn't know," said 43-year-old Gerald Martin of Lake Mary, who has ridden a motorcycle in the past and owns a Harley Davidson. "The class has taught me to go from mechanical while on the bike to natural. It's helped me feel comfortable

According to Floyd Deffinger, the school's manager, more and more individuals - including women - are signing up to learn to ride a motorcycle. He says, as long as students can maintain balance on a bicycle, they can ride a motorcycle.

"It's the feeling of freedom you have when you're riding that attracts students," he said. "You can have a better view of the world because you don't have four walls around you like in a car.

"This class is good for

they are tired of being on the back (of the motorcycle]," he continued. "If something happens to the bike or her husband, the woman can get the bike home or go for help. I taught my wife to ride a motorcycle."

The course is designed for beginner riders and is taught using an interactive learning process. In the classroom, students learn the parts of the bike, and how to keep control of and manipulate the clutch. Then, the range practice prepares students to actually ride the motorcycle.

"I've always wanted to ride - ever since I was 16 years old," said Joseph Jones, 21, an active duty Marine stationed in San Diego, Calif., on leave visiting family in Casselberry. "The hardest part of the class has been getting everything I knew about riding a bike out of my head and learning the right things."

The school furnishes students with a motorcycle from its fleet of Kawasaki Eliminator 125s, Honda Rebel 250s, Suzuki GZ 250s and Ninja 250s. The bikes are strictly for training pur-

poses and are not street legal - they are missing turn signals and mirrors because students often drop the bikes, and break these items, during the learning process. Students are also furnished with helmets and gloves, if they don't own these articles. According to Deffinger, it is mandatory for riders under the age of 21 to complete a motorcycle safety course, but it's also highly recommended for older riders.

"Our priority is student safety and learning," Deffinger said. "My lob is to stop things before they happen so if I see something the student is doing that is a safety hazard I can't pass them until they resolve the problem. "We don't rush students,

they can move at their own pace," he added. "We have things to do to help those who are struggling."

"Although the conference center plan would definitely have worked monetarily with the current deal," said Lessard, "we would like to give the CRA revenues a

year on the civic center and it's a drain on city resources," he said. "While it does provide services on a limited scope, with that building's location we should have someone in there every day."

According to Lessard, Suncor will continue to revisit the conference center plan to develop it further.

"They're keeping us in the dark," said Bob Horian, president of Suncor Properties, Inc., who says he will have to wait until commissioners vote on Monday night to have a final answer. "We're not sure if they want to nix the entire project, milk it down or put it on hold.



take two alligators each. To be eligible for a permit, applicants must be at least 18 years old by Sept. 1 and must not have been con-victed of violating wildlife laws relating to alligator trapping within the past five years nor laws relating to endangered crocodilians within the past 10 years.

"At this date, if you would like to license agents to assist you with your hunt, you should submit the agent license applications with your harvest permit application." Dutton said.

Alligator harvest applications and alligator trapping agent licenses are available at all FWC regional offices and on the Alligator section of the FWC Web site at http://wild-florida.org/gators/. The site also shows

which areas still have permits available. Applicants can check their selection status daily after 5 p.m. on the Web site. People who do not receive a permit through the selection process will have their fees




