Soviet Rescue Freighter Has No Nuke Contamination

TOKYO (UPI) - A Soviet freighter that came to the rescue of a crippled Russian atomic submarine has been declared free of radioactive contamination, Japanese officials said today.

Japanese experts boarded the 4,374-ton ship, the Meridian, immediately after it docked at Kobe port, about 300 miles west of Tokyo Monday morning. An hour-long examination of the freighter produced no sign of radioactivity, said officials from Japan's Science and Technology agency.

The Meridian and its crew of 57 were the first to the rescue of the 4,600-ton Echo-1 submarine which caught fire west of the Pacific Island of Okinawa Thursday. The blaze killed nine crewmen and injured three. The Meridian took on 55 survivors and proceeded to Kobe after turning the survivors over to a Soviet supply ship that arrived at the scene Thursday after-

Trailed by Japanese ships and aircraft checking for radioactivity, a Soviet tug towed the submarine through the East China Sea west of Japan's southernmost main island of Kyushu this morning, Japan's

Maritime Safety officials said. A Soviet missile cruiser, destroyer, and submarine tender escorted the sub as it headed in the direction of its base on the Siberian coast of the Japan Sea, MSA

The Seminole County branch of the People's Transit Organization will picket the Seminole County courthouse Tuesday due to the county commission's "indifference toward mass transit," said Linda Goddard, spokesman for the

During the county's budget hearings, Goddard said, the commission turned down every proposal made by the People's

"And they continue to divert monies into more and wider roads," she said. "It's more efficient to put 70 people in one bus than to put 70 autos on the road.".

Goddard said the picketing will take place Tuesday af-ternoon by about 20 People's Transit members. The organization had asked the commission to fund eminole County's share of an area-wide bus system expansion which would involve the purchase of five large buses and five small buses, weekend and night service on the South Seminole run, \$5,000 for advertising and devoting more county staff time to mass transit planning. Goddard said the county gave all such suggestions the cold shoulder.

But County Commission Chairman Bill Kirchhoff said the commission did listen to the group's suggestions. He said the county lacks sufficient population to make a large mass transit program economically feasible. "In the big northern cities where mass transportation works, the population density is vertical, "Kirchhoff said."

Sunday, trapping and killing Stigall and five of his His body was found atop his 15-month old daughter Samantha in the second floor of the home that his neighbors call a firetrap.

Two other daughters, one of them seven months pregnant, escaped the blaze in a south Chicago suburb. The pregnant daughter, Ila, 17, was pushed from a second-floor window by a neighbor and landed on an awning that broke her fall.

Fire Capt. Robert Bearlund identified the dead a Stigall, 57, and his daughters, Sheila, 13, Mary, 12 Emma Jean, 8, Bonnie, 3, and Samantha. Firefighters traced the blaze to a faulty appliance cord in a bathroom at the rear of the home.

Fourteen years later he contaced a Finnish businessman in Hangi and told him he wanted to return to America. When Garwood arrived in the United States in March 1979, several survivors of tiny jungle POW camps said Garwood had become a "white Vietnamese." They have claimed that Garwood joined the communist army and helped interrogate, indoctrinate and stand

Boats Slip Past Blockade

MIAMI (UPI) - Since President Carter ordered a halt to the sealift of Cuban refugees from Mariel to Key West May 15, the Coast Guard has spent more than \$70 million blockading the Florida Straits.

And since Carter issued that order, some 75,000 Cubans have reached Key West.

According to the Coast Guard's figures, the blockade is the most expensive peacetime operation since its founding in 1790. It is costing \$700,000 a day.

But like most recent days, more Cuban refugees reached Key West Sunday.



Soviet Threat Unseen By Iran

One of the enduring mysteries of the Iranian revolution is the failure of its leaders to perceive the full measure of the threat Soviet expansionism ROBERT WAGMAN poses to their country's independence.

Notwithstanding occasional references to "satanic Russia," it is clear that the Ayatollah Khomeini and his apostles are obsessed not with the Soviet Union but with the United States.

Granted, it was Washington, not Moscow, that supported and sustained the shah for 37 years. So, it was to be expected that an Islamic movement that saw the shah as the personification of evil would direct its fury first at the shah's chief ally. But that is history. The shah is dead, his dreams

of a Westernized Persian empire interred with his bones. His supporters in Iran are either dead, imprisoned, or frightened into impotent silence. As for the ayatollah's chief bogeyman, the United States, its influence in Iran is, quite obviously, nil. President Carter is reduced to praying for the release of American hostages in Iran even as the

Soviet Union dispatches an army to impose its will on Iran's Islamic neighbor, Afghanistan. Iran, as the ayatollah must have noticed, shares a 1,000-kilometer border with the Soviet Union. At present, a dozen Soviet army divisions are stationed within a day's drive of that border with nothing between them and Tehran but the

disorganized fragments of Iran's disintegrating The Russians are said to have intervened in Afghanistan partly to forestall the establishment on their southern border of a fundamentalist Islamic regime that might incite the Soviet Union's own ethnic Moslems. Why shouldn't that

same logic, or excuse, apply to Iran as well? Moreover, if the Soviets are willing to expend considerable blood, treasure and political capital to subjugate poor, barren Afghanistan, what would they give to inherit the oil wealth and

Surely the ayatollah is aware of Moscow's control over Iran's Tudeh Communist Party. And he cannot be ignorant of the evidence of Soviet involvement in the radical leftist groups that recently challenged the ayatollah's supporters in the streets of Tehran.

None of this, it seems, is sufficient warning to persuade Khomeini, his revolutionary council, the new Iranian parliament, or anybody else with a commanding voice in Tehran to see the wisdom of releasing the hostages and patching up relations with the one country that just might be able to deter a Soviet takeover in Iran.

Should the Iranian revolution end on the bayonets of a Soviet army of occupation, Iranians will have cause to curse the ayatollah's destructive statecraft with the same venom they now apparently reserve for the memory of the

Eerie Echoes

It has happened again, for the third time in no more than three months, and still nobody knows

By "it" we mean a resurgence of neo-Nazism, this time as represented by a Republican white supremacist named Gerald Carlson, who won his party's nomination to Michigan's 15th Congressional District. As usual, party leaders are at a loss to explain how such a thing could have happened in a supposedly respectable place like Lansing, Mich.

They were at a similar loss for words three months ago when a Nazi named Harold Covington got 56,000 votes in a North Carolina primary and very nearly won the Republican nomination for state attorney general.

The excuse that voters "just didn't know who they were voting for" didn't hold up a month later. however, when a Nazi-like racist won the Democratic congressional nomination in California's 43rd House district.



Central America Volcano

El Salvador is almost mile for mile the size of Massachusetts with an equivalent

But there all resemblance ends. Rather than enjoying the moderately recessionclouded peace and security of New England El Salvador, the volcano-studded heartland of an increasingly turbulent Central America, is in the first phases of a revolution.

Things at the moment aren't going so well for the revolutionaries. A general strike designed to bring commercial activity throughout the nation to a halt has fizzled. A similar demonstration in April by the

But this time the authorities were prepared. A campaign of repressive countermeasures throughout the country effectively turned the strike effort into a non-event, at the cost of several hundred lives.

That does not mean that all is now quiet, however. The way things are going in that inhappy country, there appears little hope of that in the foreseeable future.

El Salvador has one of the most dismal good news. A tiny - less than five percent of the population— but vastly wealthy landowning elite has run the country for its own benefit since Spanish colonial days. It relies upon the assistance of a military establishment whose primary purpose, as in most Latin countries, is not the defense of the country against foreign foes but the protection of the priviliged from their own countrymen, in El Salvador's case povertystricken and largely Indian peasants who work the great estates as virtual serfs.

It is a situation made for revolution and El Salvador saw a bloody one in 1932, crushed with a death toll in the hundreds of thousands that neither rulers or ruled have forgotten.

Tampa showed unexpected offensive power and surprised the Bengals and the fans by going into the shotgun



NEWPORT, R.I. (UPI) - Two of the four yachts vying to challenge for the America's Cup were considering a possible challenge to extend the deadline in their semifinal

The Australian and British Cup syndicates Sunday night argued that the spirit of the competition would be violated since two yachts are likely to advance to final series having won less than the prescribed four out of seven races.

Racing for the foreign challengers was canceled Sunday because of slight winds and the French and Swedes asked for lay days for today. According to the race conditions, a winner must be decided by Tuesday. Sweden and Australia are tied 2-2 in their series while France has three victories to Britain's two.

The rules say that if no yacht has won four races after Tuesday's racing, the winner will be determined by the most races won. In case of a tie, a deciding race would be held Wednesday

But a British manager said, "There's no precedent for the rules. That's why we're looking at them ... to see if they

The two syndicates were considering a formal protest t be heard before a panel of U.S. yachting experts, if discussions with the race committee failed. The challengers have lost several days of racing in their semifinal series because of heavy winds. Meanwhile, in final trials for American defenders Russell Long's Clipper beat Ted Turner's Courageous in two straight races Sunday after winds on Rhode Island Sound picked up. Long posted victory margins of 46 seconds



NEW YORK (UPI) - Herb Schmertz did not shoot J.R., but he'd like to shoot down the image of the American businessman J.R. Ewing represents. "If they ever find out who shot J.R., I bet they don't even

prosecute him," Schmertz predicted. It isn't surprising the picture of J.R. as a malevolent, unscrupulous, downright villainous oilman on CBS's "Dallas" might disturb Schmertz, who happens to be vice president for public affairs of the Mobil Oil Corp. Schmertz and his multinational corporation have been

outspoken in criticizing television in the past for the way it has presented energy and oil industry news and for refusing to accept Mobil's position paper-style commercials. Now he has taken aim at the anti-business stereotypes he believes television entertainment programs are projecting to

the American public. And he doesn't limit his target to J.R. - NBC's "Quincy," he said in an interview, has an almost weekly diatribe against business built into its scripts, and other shows also project an anti-business bias.

It's this entertainment end of the business with its almost subliminal message that most disturbs Schmertz. "The news department presents a different kind problem," he said. "The structure of network news makes it almost impossible for the electronic journalist to pursue his

craft in the areas of economics, business or energy stories. He is just not given enough time." "I'm looking for accuracy," he said, instead of what he considers "the present, distorted view." The problem is, television "tends to generalize from the particular," he said, so that instead of a single bad guy who

happens to be a businessman, business as a group turns into the bad guys in the black raincoats. "It's just as harmful to malign business as it is an ethnic group," he said. "After all, business is the backbone of a free

NOTICE OF ELECTION WHEREAS, The Legislature under the Constitution of the State of Florida, passed Joint Resolutions proposing amendments to the Constitution of the State of Fiorida, and they did determine and direct that the said Joint Resolutions be submitted to the electors of the State of Florida, at the Special Election to be held on November 4, 1980.

NOW THEREFORE, I, GEORGE FIRESTONE, Secretary of State of the State of Florida, do hereby give notice that a Special Election will be held in each County in Florida, on November 4, 1980, for the ratification or rejection of the Joint Resolutions proposing amendments to the Constitution of the State of Florida; viz:

(1) Article XII, Section 9, Subsection (d) of this constitution, amended, (which, by reference, adopted Article XII, Section 18, of the Constitution of 1885, as amended) as the same existed immediately before the effective date of this amendment is adopted by this reference as part for the purpose of providing that after the effective date of this amendment the first proceeds of the revenues derived from the licensing of motor vehicles as referred to therein shall be distributed annually among the several counties in the ratio of the number of instruction units in each county, the same being coterminus with the school district of each county as provided in Article IX, Section 4, Subsection (a) of this constitution, in each year computed as provided therein to the extent necessary to comply with all obligations to or for the benefit holders of bonds or motor vehicle tax anticipation certificates issued before the effective date of this amendment or any refundings thereof which are secured by any portion of such revenues derived from the

(2) No funds anticipated to be distributed annually among the several counties under the formula stated in Article XII, Section 9, Subsection (d) of this constitution, as amended, as the same existed immediately before the effective date of this amendment shall be pledged as security for any obligations hereafter issued or entered into, except that any outstanding obligations previously issued pledging such funds may be refunded at a lower net average interest cost rate by the issuance of refunding bonds maturing not later than the obligations refunded, secured by the same revenues and any other security authorized in paragraph (13)

(3) Subject to the requirements of paragraph (1) of this subsection (d) beginning July 1, 1973 and for thirty-five years thereafter, the first proceeds of the revenues derived from the licensing of motor vehicles to the extent necessary to comply with the provisions amendment, shall, as collected, be placed monthly in the school district and junior college district capital outlay and debt service fund in the state treasury and used only as provided in this amendment.
