

Sexual assault lands man in jail

SANFORD-A Sanford man is in jail for stalking his ex-girlfriend and sexually assaulting a 15-year-old girl related

Sanford Police arrested Adrian Michael Jones, 28, of Persimmon Avenue in Sanford, on Aug. 2, and charged him with stalking his ex-girlfriend, whose name has not been released due to the nature of the crime. Four days after his arrest he returned

Assault occurs four days after arrest for stalking girl's relative

to the apartment and sexually assaulted a relative of the woman. Police spokesperson Cleo Cohen would not confirm or deny whether the 15-yearold victim was the ex-girlfriend's daughter or another relative.

"We will only say that he had been arrested for stalking a family member of the victim," Cohen said.

But, when Jones was arrested for stalking, the reporting officer wrote that the victim stated "that she also fears for the well being of her kids." Jones' ex girlfriend told police that

Jones had lived with her for 11 months and that for the past three weeks he had left several threatening messages on her phone.

According to the report, the woman said that earlier that day on Aug. 2, Jones was watching her while she was washing her clothes. When she saw him she ran into her apartment, only to notice that he had been inside. The

State checks auto repair shops

SANFORD — At least one foreman appeared happy that the state conducted a sweep of Seminole County auto repair shops this week.

Walt Kahrs, shop foreman at McConnell Motors, said an inspector showed up early at their Sanford Avenue address. Kahrs

said the inspections are necessary. "It has to be any more because

of all the places ripping people off," he said. If one shop cheats people, that hurts all auto shops, ne added.

Inspectors will visit all 492 registered auto repair shops in Seminole County. They will also check any unregistered facilities they run across.

State Consumer Services

inspectors are checking auto shops for proper registration and to ensure that businesses are complying with regulations regarding estimates and invoices for repair work.

Under Florida law, motor vehicle repair shops must be registered with the Florida Department of Agriculture and

Commission approved a conditional use request after Lanza was cited by code enforcement for illegal use of the property without a site plan. 



Lanza said that the city changed the set of rules on him. He said that first the Planning and Zoning Commission told him he had to have a 5-foot landscape barries, and then they told him he needed a 15-foot landscape barrier. He also said that at one point he was able to use rock in lieu of paving to control the water flow, but then that was changed to having to construct a storm water storage pond on his property. The city staff said that particular change was due to the planning and zoning mistakenly waiving the need for Department of Environmental Protection mandated storm water storage.

Lanza said, however, that he already rocked the site and he had made a 5-foot landscape barrier.

"So, I'm confused about what to do," Lanza said. "As soon as I know what the correct thing to do is, I'll do it."

Mayor Linda Kuhn criticized Lanza and questioned a March 3 letter in which he referred to the area as "the ghetto". She asked if he would like to explain his use of the word gnetto. He said that was purely out of frustration.

"Perhaps you may want to consider relocating your business," Kuhn told him.

Lanza said he couldn't afford to relocate or do anything else with this property. He claimed he has attempted to fix the problems and do what was needed, but that with the amount of changes, he was simply waiting to see what exactly he was supposed to do. He also said the three hurricanes last year were also somewhat of a factor.

Lanza's wife, Rene, spoke to the commission. She stated she was the one who typed the letter referring to "the ghetto".

"I typed the letter out of frustration. We went out and spent \$12,000 on rock, then they said they wanted cement," Rene Lanza said. "We never really knew what was expected."

In fact, once District 2 Commissioner Velma Williams made a motion to deny the appeal by Lanza and approve the Planning and Zoning Commission's decision to deny the Conditional Use request to allow outdoor storage, Mayor Kuhn had to pass the gavel to Williams in order to second the motion. Consumer Services. Those that do not face initial fines of up to \$300.

The law also requires that customers, at their request, be provided a written estimate for any repair that exceeds \$100 and a complete invoice listing all charges after a repair has been performed.

Inspector Paul Pagano works out of Jacksonville, and Seminole County lies in his jurisdiction. He said auto repair shops should know that they are subject to inspections at any time.

As he arrived at Rick's Auto Repair on Sanford Avenue at 10:30 a.m., a worker locked the gate. According to Pagano, the man said he was going to return a car to someone.

Pagano did not find a registration. In fact, he thought he was going to Expert Auto at that location, but found Rick's instead.

"Rick's got seven days to get registered," Pagano said after leaving the facility. He explained that if a business has no state license, the business has a week to comply.

Pagano had 42 Sanford area auto shops on his assignment list. He said he concentrates on the estimate invoice forms.

When an auto shop registers with the state, it has to forward the form employees will use in making estimates. Pagano and his colleagues are checking that shops still use the forms.

He found one place that had the correct forms, but was not using them. After the sweep, violations will be public record, he added.

A completed estimate form must accompany any repair more than \$100, Pagano said. "It's like a work order," he said. The forms have to include the company's registration number, its statement about guarantees and the mileage on the vehicle.

If the company has the correct forms, Pagano will ask to see a couple that have been filled out.

One of the four businesses he checked Monday morning had the forms on file, but they weren't using them. That business — OSO Discount Tires at Sanford Avenue and Airport

Boulevard — will receive a fine, Pagano said.

'It's just a matter of going to the print shop, and then disciplining yourself to use the forms," Pagano said. The forms protect the consumer as well as the business, he explained.

For the business, the form shows that it has been up front with the customer.

For the customer, they have a record of the estimate, although the law does allow a business to exceed the original estimate but not more than \$50, Pagano said.

If the work is going to be more than the original estimate, shops can call the customer, inform them of the additional costs, and receive verbal approval.

Consumers may not know that if a business says they have to pay more than the estimate, they can bond the vehicle out for the price listed on the invoice. They should contact the **Division of Consumer Services** at 1-800-435-7352.

Businesses then have 60 days

to explain why extra money is owed to them. A court makes the final decision, he said.

Some people contact his office before even talking with the auto shop itself. He suggests talking with the repair shop first to see if anything can be worked out

This week's sweep will be the fifth such county effort by the state Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. Only Duval, Palm Beach, Orange and Hillsborough counties have had such inspections. Across Florida, there are 22,000 auto repair shops registered with the state.

report did not say how she knew he had been inside, but that she was very afraid of what he might do.

The officer attempted to make contact with Jones at his grandmother's house on Persimmon Avenue, where he was staying at the time. Jones was not there, and about an hour later, the victim notified the police again. She stated that Jones was at her apartment and threatened to kill her. Once the officer made contact with Jones, he admitted that he had been calling his ex girlfriend and that he made the threats because he was mad at her.

He also said that he had been watching as his ex girlfriend gave the officer the report earlier. At that time he was placed under arrest for domestic stalking, and the victim said she planned on getting a protection order against Jones.

Four days later, Jones allegedly entered the victim's apartment without permission. He entered the bedroom of the 15-year-old relative and her 2-year-old sister, and according to statements given by the victim, sexually abused and assaulted her.

According to the arrest report, the victim fought back, but Jones threatened to rape her if she continued to struggle. At one point, the victim said, Jones put a pillow over her face but she was able to remove it, the report said.

Allegedly, he kept asking if the victim was going to tell anybody. The victim told police that she told Jones she would not tell because Jones told her if she did there tragic and violent situation. would be trouble. During this time, the two-year-old sister woke up and sat up in bed, witnessing some of these events, according to

reports.

On Saturday, Aug. 20, 2005 Jones was taken into custody by the Sanford Police Department and arrested for burglary with assault or battery, cruelty toward a child-aggravated and sexual abuse, assault/sexual battery on a victim over 12 with physical force. Jones is being held at the John E. Polk Correctional Facility, as of Tuesday afternoon.

Sanford Police arrested Jones in 1998, also. He was charged with assault and battery on a law enforcement officer and resisting an officer without violence after he allegedly threw a bicycle at an officer.

SANFORD — Seminole County Commissioner Brenda Carey joined 21 volunteers Sunday for the third "Adopt-A-Spot" clean-up program on the St. Johns sponsored by the Seminole County Soil and Water Conservation District.

Eco-Action of Orlando cosponsored the event.

The cleanup, which took place just downstream of Lake Monroe, resulted in several hundred pounds of trash being recovered from the St. Johns. The haul included a large rusty metal bed frame, a propane tank, loose styrofoam-filled construction barriers, and countless bottles, cans, fishing poles, lures, line and scrap metal.

"We all live upstream from someone else in this watershed - so what we do with our trash is going to affect others," said SSWCD Executive Director Michelle Thatcher. "Out of sight is not out of mind."

Frequent rains have helped raise the river by several feet so that volunteers were able to paddle into the normally inaccessible swamp of bald cypress along the northern shore where a lot of the trash was recovered.

Carey, who grew up on the St. Johns, expressed satisfaction in the work of the volunteers, and was impressed with the amount of trash taken from the river.

"It's really gratifying to see all of these people give up their Sunday afternoons to be out here" she said.
