More surprising to most Seminole County political observers than the overwhelming vote by which Senator Charles O. Andrews carried this county was the large vote polled by Charles Francis Coe, a newcomer to Florida politics, who ran second ahead of such well-known veterans as the Townsend sponsored Jerry Carter and Gov. Fred P. Coe.

Bernard MacFadden, famous publisher of Liberty and other magazines, who came to Sanford recently by airplane to make his only appearance here during the campaign, also ran well in this county.

In the county-wide contest for Governor, Francis F. Whitehair and Spessard Holland carried the county with 1787 votes to 1546 for Whitehair. In the two city precincts Whitehair had a total of 1917 to 897 for Holland while in the county-at-large contest Whitehair carried 112 votes to 109 for Holland.

With the City complete, and with all County precincts in order, Andrews had 2349 votes, Coe 664, Hagan 548, and MacFadden 548. In the same way Whitehair had 1787 votes, Holland 1546, Warren 538, Babson 331, Whitehair 1787, and 1741 for Coe. In the county-wide contest Whitehair carried 112 votes while Mr. Coe carried 109.

Runoffs were seen as necessary in the prosecutor's race between E. J. Nelson and G. A. Speer, Jr., in the sheriff's race between George Gray and C. M. Hand, in the County Commission race between O. J. Pope and D. L. Thrasher, in the justice of the peace race between S. J. Nix and W. E. Watson and in the constable race between C. E. Cherpinski and Bob Moye.

Mr. Emma Abbott Lyman appeared an almost certain winner for congressional committee work as she amassed a total vote of 324 against 178 for Mrs. Newell Merrill with only three precincts, Monroe, Oviedo and Osceola missing.

The race between S. A. E. Wilkinson and George Wilmer was still undecided with the same large spread in the vote standing at 1792 for Wilkinson and 1702 for Wilmer.

In the tax collector's race, Jinkins gained a majority over his two opponents, obviating the necessity of a runoff, with a total of 2578 votes against 818 for E. C. Smith, Mr. Jinkins' vote for the City was 1463 as compared with 528 for Galloway and 1947 for Smith. In the county precincts Jinkins had 1173 votes, Galloway 217, and Smith 401. Mr. Jinkins carried every precinct in the county.

Resignation of Chamberlain Is Seen As Likely

Some Quarters Predict English To "Muddle" Through

By Associated Press An aroused British labor party today demanded the downfall of Chamberlain's government with a "no confidence" motion in Commons as war nerves were frayed over more sharp through southeast Europe.

The Pope voiced fears that the conflict now stalemated on the Silesia-Berlin line, and spitting in Arctic Norway was doomed to spread, while across the Adriatic from Italy, Yugoslavia dived the possibility of a double-barreled onslaught from the Rome-Berlin axis.

In London, Herbert Morrison, labor leader, accused Chamberlain of using the highly popular Churchill as a "shield" for the government's weakness, and of wanting Churchill "in a shop window" to stave off criticism. He said Churchill and his inner circle of ministers lacked courage.

Chamberlain leaped to his feet "welcome" Morrison's challenge, declaring: "We shall see who is with us and who is against us. No government can prosecute the war effectively unless it has public and parliamentary support." Lloyd George, World War prime minister, also demanded Chamberlain's resignation.
