Fighting two battles

Longwood man struggles to keep business afloat while he serves in Iraq

After doing his duties as an American reserve officer in Kuwait, a Longwood man is anxious to tend to his struggling local busi-

ness. Kyle Repp opened his franchise, 1-800-Got-Junk?, in Longwood on Jan. 1. The Vancouver-based company removes garbage and chemical waste that regular garbage disposal services won't take.

"I knew being called up was a risk," Repp said.
"But last fall when I started preparing to open, it wasn't a very high risk." During the last week of

February, Repp received five days notice that his unit would be heading to Kuwait. On his last day in Florida, he said, he received an e-mail instructing him to catch a flight that would leave in four hours, making for an en tional departure from his wife and two children.

Repp, 46, is the Maintenance and Supply Officer for an Army Reserve Combat Support Hospital, a semi-mobile facility that treats soldiers (friendly and enemy) and

civilians in the field. Previously, Repp had eight years of active Army service and joined the Reserves in August 1990, and was ed in Operation Desert Storm. He has received numerous accolades for his military service, including four Army Commendation medals and the Expert Field Medical

Badge. While Repp has been away, his wife and teenage son and two employees have managed to keep the franchise running part-

"It's very hard because [Kyle's] away and he's not able to grow his business - it's more like going down than making money," said Repp's wife, Michiko, who has been supervising the business and keeping the books in her husband's absence.

Without Repp's training

and marketing skills, the franchise has been unable to hold onto the momen-tum it picked up originally. Repp is also running out of his original capital and is meet. The company, Repp said, has been "very under-standing" and sent a representative to help prepare the business for survival.

Editor's note: Staff Sergeant Charlie C. Carlson III, son of Sanford Historian Charlie C. Carlson II, is currently deployed in Baghdad, Iraq as part of the 549th Military Police Company.

Carlson has provided a continuing journal of his experiences in Iraq, which the Herald will publish over the next several weeks.

May 9, 2003 We made it to the Baghdad International Airport [BIAP]. We hear that the 3rd MP Company is leaving in three days. That will make us the only Fort Stewart M.P. company left behind here. We are going to be left high and dry. Now we are hoping to leave with another division. They keep extending everybody. Seems like they get us pumped up about going

think we will ever get out of here. They said "the way home is Baghdad" but it looks like the only

ones that are going home are the navy and noncombat troops who never heard a shot fired. Those

who have fought the war are still stuck here with no light at the end of the tunnel. Needless to say, morale is not good. We have made a decision not to sing the "Dog Face Soldier Song" of the division since it seems that we have been forgotten. Why in

the world they are saying the war is over is beyond me, we are taking casualties every day. The war is not over by a long shot.

We have been told that we will not be staying at the Baghdad airport. I figured that would be the case since it is pretty nice here compared to the way we've been living for the past two months. We are now heading to one of Saddam Hussein's palaces in the city.

When we got to the palace compound, we were told by the Battalion Sergeant-Major that we would be leaving in the morning and would be living in - get this - a bombedout "Iraqi cigarette factory!"

May 10, 2003 I slept on top of the Humvee last night at the palace compound, which was not too bad.

There was some shooting last night about 0300, it sounded like AK-47 fire and I could see tracers cutting the night sky. Some of them went over our heads. We got up this morning about 0540 and ate breakfast which consisted of nothing more than rusty T-rations with those brown egg omelet things and the gravy in those rations tastes like cleaning fluid.

We headed out into the heart of Baghdad. People were waving at us but there were no incidents. Looks like every civilian has a weapon or a rock. I found out that the other M.P. units are living at the airport or in one of the palace compounds. We talked with another platoon and they

Continued from Page 1 told us about a recent ambush they were in but took no casualties on their part. I knew this platoon from when I was at Fort

irwin and lonew SPC Brown, he was a sight for sore eyes. With eigarette in hand, he nervously told me about the ambush.

Today we moved through the deep part of Beghdad, a real ghetto section. We made it to the cigarette factory which will be our home. We will be living here with the 2nd Armored Cavalry Regiment out of Fort Polic, Louisiana. They have already claimed all the decent living areas so we got stuck living in a large machine shop.

The food service section claimed the factory cafeteria for their operation and is busy cleaning that place up. It won't do much good if we can't get class A rations. We haven't had real food in two months, just MREs or old Trations. The floors in the machine shop, where we will be living, are really dirty, gressy and saturated

with oil. It reminds me of those abandoned buildings down in Panema. That is about the best way I can describe it without seeing it

for yourself. May 12, 2003 This is my birthday, I hope to have many more, but I never expected to spend it in a Iraqi cigarette factory. Somehow, we've made a home here in this hell hole. The place is dark with only a few rooms with light. It is

huge, but rasty.
I got four letters from home last night. I also got another box from you with the battery lantern. I used the lantern to explore the deep, dark recesses of this factory. I found a room loaded with boxes of partially manufactured cigarettes.

The smell is musty.

I went back in there with some of the other guys and busted into a tool room and got some tools that we can use. I then went back with Sgt. Johnson to explore some more. He gets spooked in dark areas and thinks I'm nuts for going in places where something could get

me. I told him "That's no problem because what would something want with me." I built myself a desk from some things I found in this place, that is what I'm writing this letter on. May 14, 2003 I heard this

morning that some of the 2nd ACR guards shot and wounded an Iraqi and confiscated several weapons.

I found some uncut cigarettes in this place they are about a foot long. Talk about weird. The first sergeant won't let us explore these buildings anymore, at least until we have been here for awhile.

Now they say that we may be here until October or later. "The Way Home Is Through Baghdad," well don't tell that to us, it might make good news in the states but I don't think the whole truth is being told about this deployment. What you see on the TV news is not what we see here.

completely unable to contact his family or his company. Even while his unit was still making preparations at Ft. Stewart, Ga., the 20- to 22-hour workdays and lack of phone or Internet access left him virtually cut off. Over the past six weeks, Repp has been able to use the Internet and

call the US more regularly. "But you can't run a business from halfway around the world, [even] under the best of circumstances," Repp said. Repp said the govern-

ment provides no protection or compensation for private entrepreneurs. Servicemen who are employees of a company are guaranteed their jobs when they return from their military duties. However, those who own their own businesses, franchises or even medical practices are on their own.

When Repp returns, he will be almost out of capital and won't qualify for unemployment benefits.

The stress has been very

high for me, not just the inherent personal dangers you can well imagine, but lased the impact of this separation on my business," Repp said. "Every day, I see money going out and not enough coming in to cover

my costs." Still, Repp believes he will succeed with the help of the company's home

Cameron Herold, Vice President of Operations and Business Development at 1-800-Got-Junk? said his company looks forward to working with Repp fulltime again.

"He's proud of building a new business for himself," said Herold. "The only thing I do know is he does not want to be over-

seas any longer."
Repp thinks he might get home by Christman, if he a lucky. Lately, he said, it's been hard for many troops to get home.

Some units have been told many times they are leaving, but have had dates pushed back, even though they are not performing a specific mission anymore, Repp said.







Seminole's Schenk earns Fire Chief of the Year award

Terry L. Schenk has been the Seminole County Fire Chief since June 27, 1993. Through his ten years of service, Chief Schenk has seen the department through some major changes.

Under his leadership, Seminale County Fire Department took on the ambulance transport in 1997, winning the right to provide emergency ambulance transport as part of the services provided by the Fire Department. Over the years the department has forged agreements with other fire departments in the area to provide mutual assistance or "mutual aid" when help is needed. These agreements help provide the citizens of Central Florida with the quick emergency services regardless of jurisdictional boundaries.

The Seminole County Fire Department recently agreed to operate fire and emergency medical services for the City of Altamonte Springs. This was an ultimate merger of the Altamonte Springs City Fire Department with the Seminole County Fire Department, making Seminole County Fire Department the second largest fire department in Central Florida.

In addition to his local duties, Chief Schenk leads the Florida Fire Chief,s Association * Emergency Deployment Team and the Task Force for the Central Florida Urban Search and Rescue Team.



Eliminating government waste

During my first six months working in Washington, the need for federal spending reform has become blatantly obvious. Several freshman colleagues and I decided to take action by forming "Washington Waste Watchers," a group dedicated to the elimination of waste in government spending. Although the group is mainly comprised of Congressional newcomers, we have a combined amenal of experience in combating government waste, fraud, and abuse. Ronald Reagan once

defined the American taxpayer as somebody who worked for the federal govemment, but did not take Unfortunately, that is all too

often true. In Florida, the average taxpayer works until July 6 to pay his or her share of spending and regu-latory burdens imposed by federal, state, and local governments. I, along with several of my colleagues, think this is ludicrous. Americans should not spend more than half the year working for the government.

By tackling this issue, we'll reduce this burden and return more money to its rightful owners - the American people. Sounds easy enough, right? Unfortunately it isn't. Given the federal government's \$2.14 trillion size, billions of lost, stolen and wasted dollars go unnoticed

every year.
Some tax dollars simply disappear or wind up in the wrong pockets. Two years ago \$17 billion dollars of

federal agency expenditures went unaccounted. During 2002, oversights in allocations amounted to \$35 billion in overpayments. Medicare alone overpaid \$13 billion while 35% of unemployment benefits distributed by the Department of Labor were paid to inellgible recipients. Meanwhile, the national

debt grows. Fraudulent activities by criminals and federal employees shock the conscience. \$1.9 million of Impact Aid funds that should have gone to a school in South Dakota were diverted and used to buy real estate, a Lincoln

Navigator, and a Cadillac Escalade. Improper use of government purchasing cards totals \$97 million annually. Additionally, the USDA estimates that over a

three year period food stamp fraud costs taxpayers approximately \$660 million.
During the past six years,
storeowners who ignore federal regulations have incurred \$73 million in fines, although 87% have gone uncollected. Crimes of this nature must be met with serious consequences and those consequences need to be actively enforced.

Washington Waste Watchers will regularly remind those who control and monitor government purse strings that irresponsible spending is inexcus-able. Sunshine is the best disinfectant. We will shine a light on these abuses and demand accountability. I am clated to belong to this group and look forward to reinstating confidence in the federal government.



The war years in Sanford

The \$28 million-Orlanda location celebrated its grand opening ast month, complete with 32 horses, dozens of cast members and seating for 1,000 patrons around a 35,000 square foot arena. i he attraction. Parton s fourth and largest location, joins her fleet of dinner theater restaurants in Branson, Mo., Myrtle Beach, S.C. and Pigeon

Forge, Tenn. As with the other locations, Parton asked Greg Anderson, a.k.a. the Electric Cowboy, to help get the attraction off the ground. Anderson, a cowboy from Australia, and his sidekick Starstruck, a purebred quarter horse, entertain audience during

a pre-show event. "I was there when Starstruck was born," said Anderson, "I think that has a lot to do with the

repertoire we've built

together." Starstruck, who can climb stairs with the greatest of case and walk between narrow rows of people without getting spooked, is only one of the unique animals showgoers will encounter throughout the evening.

"I wanted to recreated the family fun of my childhood, when we'd gather for a friendly competition and enjoy a more-than-filling meal," said Parton, creator of Dicie Stampede. "With the grand entertainment of our horses and performers, along with a delicious meal, Dixie Stampede is

Although the quality of the food is what you would expect from a dinner show, the quantity is enough to feed an army (pun intended). The kicker is, you have to eat like the soldiers - no utensils are allowed. Therefore, I wouldn't suggest this dinner locale for a first date, but it does make for a

Welcome to Stetson's Corner, where weekly we hope to share a bit of what is good about the town of Geneva. This column is dedicated to a man who did the same - Deputy Sheriff Gene "Stetson" Gregory, who was killed in the line of duty July 8. 1998 in the place he was sworn to protect, but which could not protect him. Geneva will never be the same because of Deputy Gregory ... it will be better.

The anniversary of the death of Deputy Sheriff Gene "Stetson" Gregory ... recently came and went, but not without notice. Reader Karen McEnany-Phillips took the time to send us this anippet of remembrance. Said Karen, "Hi Darla, I was thinking about the five year anniversary of Gene's death and remembered that he was at our house that weekend before. Your column is probably full for this week but I took the liberty of sending you a short piece" Thanks, Karen

McEnany-Phillips Walking Tall ... It was 4th of July weekend, 1998-hot and dry-much of the land and air still smoldering from the devastating

June fires that swept through Geneva and surrounding areas. We watched and worried as assorted vehicles gathered at the

edge of Lake Harney, just over our back pasture fence, technically on our property. They probably meant no harm, just looking for a place to party and to watch the stars and fireworks over the holiday weekend. Our concern was that sparklers or a careless ciga-

..... rette might ignite the dry grass, starting the fires all over again. It felt too close for comfort.

the through weekend and so did our anxiety. Shortly after the phone call, a man appeared on the scene who always put your mind at rest-as long as you were on the right side of the law. Deputy Gene Gregory walked up to our door, tall and calm...who knew what he was

really thinking? He listened to our story and our frustrations and from beneath the brim of his hat, looked straight into our eyes. He was so good at

one took comfort in his ability to take control of a situation. After hearing all he needed to

hear, Gene Gregory strode down through our back pasture toward the back fence and the gathering vehicles. His boots walked through cow and horse paddies, underbrush, dry grass and who knows what else. He could have driven down but he chose to walk Walking Tall.

We'll never know just what he said to those folks or how he said it. All we knew was they drove off, without incident and never returned. And Deputy Gene walked back through our pasture, tipped his hat and drove on to his next call. Always listening. Always in control. Always walk-

ing tall. PS from Darla ... I remember that 4th of July as well. Having narrowly escaped the path of the recent fires, we spent the day trimming the trees in our forested yard-wearing bandanas over our faces because of the thick, acrid smoke that still filled the air.

A few days later we spent the day glued to the live new reports as the tragedy on Guy Court

AN OPEN LETTER TO OUR CHURCHES

Dear Friends,

07/27/03

This area is truly blessed to have so many houses of worship, which have played such an important part in the development and continuance of this area's rich religious heritage.

the Rochester Red Wings (the Oriole's former Triple Auffiliate) visited Lynx Stadium


Their game on August 21, 2001 is believed to be the first time a father and son played each other in a professional game.

Fishing with kids is quality time

If you would like to spend some quality time with your kids, take them fishing. I take my 5-year-old son Dylan with me at least once a week. We usually leave the house at 4 a.m. and he is wide awake and

Our first stop is usually at the local Hess station were we load up on snacks and his favorite fishing breakfast, donuts. When you take the little ones it is important to bring plenty of snacks and juice boxes. During the summer months it is also important to make sure they drink plenty of water. Another important thing is to apply sunscreen so that they don't get burned.

The next stop is our favorite bait store in litusville, Skeeter Lagoon's, Redfish Rich, the owner, is the hardest working bait man in town. When the shrimp are not rolling in during the summer months, Rich is usually out catching bait in the early morning hours. Dylan loves to watch all the bait swimming in tanks and likes to help dip them into the livewell. He has already learned all the different baits we use.

After loading up on bait it is off to the ramp. We usually are running in the dark and the phosphorus in the water is quite a fight show. When we pull up to our first stop the batt lish and dolphin are darting around the boat with a bright green trail behind them. Dylan really gets excited as we witness this phenomenon.

As the sun rises, the bait really starts -


moving, and then we usually see tailing redfish and dotphin doing their Sea World tricks in the wild. We have witnessed several dolphin slapping bait in the air with their tail and catching it in mid-air. People pay \$40 or \$50 bucks to see this elsewhere.

Dylan has also learned how to tell the difference between redfish and mullet schools. He also likes to play with the bait and

touch the fish After we catch a few reds we will take a break. After about 2 to-2 1/2 hours of fishing kids might get a little bored if you are waiting on fish, so it is usually time to move. Take a 10 minute boat ride then move to deeper water and catch a few front. Several times when we are front fishing we will have manatees come to the boat. They will sit right under the boat and

stay with you for quite a while There are so many things for kids to see. I teach him about respect for our fish, birds and all the wildlife we encounter. There is one critter that really attracts his attention. and that is Mr. Al. E. Gator. There are quite a few gators in the Indian River and Mosquito Lagoon, My son loves those gators and he will watch them as long as they stick around. I wonder cometimes if he is going to be the next Alligator Hunter.

A few things that you must do to keep a kid interested in tishing is try to keep thein with a tight line, don't keep them out too. long bring plenty of snacks, use popping corks so they have something to watch See Outdoors, Page 13

FWC UPDATES HUNTERS ABOUT **QUOTA HUNT PROCEDURES**

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) is modifying procedures to change hunters' quota hunt choices because of recent changes in the wildlife management area (WMA) pro-

The quota hunt program has always enabled hunters to make changes to their applications after they mail them, as long as it was done, in writing, before the random

"We want to make hunters who have applied for Lochloosa, Fort McCoy, Relay, Gulf Hammock, Steinhatchee Falls, Camp Blanding dog hunt and Camp Blanding walk-in area aware of this option," said Eddie White, FWC's quota hunt coordina-

tor.
"Anyone who already has applied for a quota hunt permit in the application process in June for Lochloosa, Fort McCoy, Relay, Gulf Hammock, Steinhatchee Falls, Camp Blanding dog hunt and Camp Blanding walk-in area will have these hunts automatically deleted, because no permits will be issued for these areas in the random drawing. The applicant's next alternate choice will move up in priority when filling permits. If the applicant has one of these hunts as a choice, and no alternate choices, he will receive a preference rejection notice which will make him eligible for the prefer-

If the procedures outline above will result in an unacceptable outcome for the applicant, he can contact the quota hunt office by writing, fax or e-mail, with his name and date of birth, and request his choices to be changed to other hunts. TOP FIVE TIPS FOR BUYING AND **SELLING A BOAT ONLINE**

The old adage, buyer beware, has never been more true than in today's internet age. In the July 2003 issue of BoatU.S. Magazine, two BoatU.S. members detail recent online boat selling experiences rife with fraud in the feature, "A Tale of Two Internet Scams."

Luckily, both members recognized the fraud before they became victims," said Caroline Ajootlan, assistant vice president, BoatU.S. Consumer Affairs. "Desperate sellers, usually those with older boats or those that may not sell easily, are often targets for

Fraud can involve the seller receiving monies without providing the goods, or a buyer receiving goods without providing payment. "Unfortunately, online shoppers usually think they are getting a better deal on the internet, which sometimes clouds

their judgement." adds Ajootian.
To assist boat buyers and sellers with online boat buying transactions, the BoatU.S. Consumer Affairs Dept. has the following Top Five Tips for Buying and Selling a Boat Online:

1. Read the rules: Review all of the rules that an online boat buying or auction site provides and understand them completely before any transaction. A recent court case in California, for example, ruled that eBay did not need a state boat broker's license to operate in the state. Broker licensing generally adds a layer of consumer protection.

2. Escrow funds: Buyers should only use an online auction site that offers escrow, a feature that allows payment to be held by a third party - usually the auction service - until the boat delivery is confirmed.

3. Pay carefully: Buyers should pay by credit card, cashiers check, or online payment systems that provide security, usually indicated by a "lock" icon. Never provide Social Security numbers or bank account numbers. As a seller, never accept a personal check and never release a boat until funds have cleared. In one BoatUS. Magazine case, a BoatU.S. member who was selling a 53-foot ketch was asked to return an "inadvertent" overpayment from a fraudulent buyer's bank draft. Fortunately, the reader's wife was too sharp for the ruse - the draft had yet to clear and was a most likely a fake.

4. No POB's: Buyers and sellers alike should ensure that the other party has a physical address and full contact information. Post Office boxes can be a red flag for scam artists.

5. Read Up or Report: The Federal Trade Commission has many of the internet scams posted at http://www.ftc.gov (click on "For Consumers," then "E-Commerce and the Internet"). You can also file a complaint here. The National Fraud Information Center/Internet Fraud Watch reports that 90% of all internet fraud is related to online auctions. 
