WASHINGTON, June 3.-(AP) —After government finances had been discussed by President Honvaer and his cabinet yesterday the White House announced the na-tional debt would be increased \$500,000,000 for the fiscal year anding June 36 because of failing revenue and increased expendi-

On the other hand, it was said, agriculture department officials last year. had informed the president that \$11,000,000 would be saved this fiscal year and \$20,000,000 next year from the department's approgrations.

As part of his announced pro gramet s trim governmental penditures as much as possible, President Hoover yesterday requerted mary department officials to meet with him over the weekend at the Rapidan camp to seek means of saving in that branch of the government.

The deficit, a White House sintement said, will be approximately \$900,000,000 to \$950,000, 100 for the year. Of this amount 0410,000,000 will be due to re-demption of the public debt re-(Continued On Page Three)
