Three Axis Subs and British Cruiser Go Down in Sea Battle

One London Destroyer Is Sunk While On Convoy Duty As Another Hits Mine

Russians Imperil German Positions

English Capture Over 5,000 Prisoners in Victory At Bardia

At sea, the British today admit the loss of the cruiser, Neptune, and the destroyer, Kandahar, by mines in the Mediterranean, but claim the destruction of at least three submarines and two bombers in the Atlantic after a four day running battle. They admit the loss of two ships from a 30-ship convoy, plus the destroyer, J. Stanley, and the auxiliary, Audacity.

The Russians regained Malaya, imperiling the German position at Moscow. It was officially announced from Cairo today that more than 5,000 Axis prisoners, including German Major Gen. Schmidt, chief of a administrative staff officer of the Nazi "Panzer" corps in Africa, was captured at Bardia.

British losses in the occupation of the port were said to include 50 killed and 300 wounded. The westward push of the British army forces recaptured Malaya, recaptured the port of Bardia, 30 miles south of the German advance positions and a companion Red Army drive drove the Germans facing the prospect of encirclement or a hazardous retreat of more than 80 miles from Moscow to Vienna.

The westward push of the Russian army to Staritsa and Kalgas had thrust deep salients into the Nazi lines both above and below Moscow, menacing the rear of their positions. Moscow itself is under the fire of Russian artillery and seems about to collapse.

As the southern claw of the Red Army shaped up, the Red drive was swinging around Moscow, barn-door fashion.

British Imperial forces set fire to a gasoline carrier west of El Achela on the Gulf of Sirte, attacked nearby air fields, and also a small ship off the coast.

The British said they lost only two planes in all these operations. Official war-end figures released today said that 2000 German and Italian planes were destroyed throughout the Middle East during 1941.

The fall of the stronghold of Bardia, 15 miles from the Egyptian border, removed a serious road-block threat, and released British soldiers for the major contact here that 200 miles to the west where Gen. Erwin Rommel's remainder Nazi armies are bottled out at Agadabia.

On the Malayan front, the British report beating off three Japanese land and one sea attacks, claiming the sinking of four troop laden barges and the firing of a steamer. Japan's attack at Kuantan, the British admit, is making some progress.

Chungking says 15,000 Japs were killed or wounded in the struggle for Changsha. British and untested defenders of Malaya were engaged in battle with newly-landed contingents of Japanese invaders nearly 300 miles above Singapore last night, and latest reports stated that the fighting was becoming increasingly heavy.

The more violent fighting developed in West and Central Malaya as the British came to grips with the enemy along the main front extending roughly east and west. They moved also to check Japanese who have landed in strength on the lower Perak Coast west of the main British positions.

U. S. Casualties Are Few At Fortification Which Guards Vital Manila Bay

Americans Down Three Airships

Enemy Ground Raids Slack Off Against Main Luzon Forces

The War Department today reported a five-hour Japanese air assault on Corregidor Island at the entrance to Manila Bay and said at least three enemy planes were shot down.

At least 60 bombers participated in the attack, the communique said, but the Japs failed to inflict any material damage on the fortification, which guards the entrance to Manila Bay.

American casualties from the attack were put at 13 killed and 45 wounded.

Meanwhile, there was a marked lessening of enemy ground attacks on General Douglas MacArthur's main force on Luzon. Gen. Douglas MacArthur, "stand" Army of U. S. and Filipino troops placed itself astride the Bataan peninsula, prepared for a later struggle to allow the allies time to mobilize at Singapore and the Dutch East Indies.

The War Department's communique referred to intensified Japanese resistance, and military men asserted this made it clear Gen. MacArthur had no intention of resorting to guerrilla tactics at this state of the fighting.

As long as his main force remains intact, it expected to be hit-run.

With these developments, the state of the Philippine defense is a definitely new stage. It was one, moreover, which some strategic experts believed might continue for some time, with Gen. MacArthur's men compelling the Japanese to keep on the island of Luzon men and materials which otherwise would be thrown into the attack on Singapore and the Indies.

Government May Take Over Cars From Civilians

Passenger Autos To Be Used Only For Essential Needs

WASHINGTON, Jan. 3.—Automobile owners who have no vital need for a car received warning yesterday that they may have to surrender it to the government for use by the armed forces or in essential civilian services.

Price Administrator Henderson said a press conference this was the "gloomy prospect" for the future, although he indicated no plans for requisitioning private cars were yet being given of final consideration.

He gave the outline of the situation. The automobile industry will be permitted to produce about 200,000 more passenger automobiles this month, and then production will be shut down for the duration of the war.

These 200,000 units, plus 500,000 cars now held by dealers, will be insufficient to fill the needs of consumers described as essential under the tire rationing program.

This means, he said, that there will not be enough new cars to meet demands of physicians and surgeons, police, fire departments, and other protective agencies of the need for ambulances.

Funeral services for Mrs. Tamm will be conducted at the Congregational Church tomorrow afternoon at 4:00 o'clock with the Rev. J. B. Root officiating. Interment will follow in Lake View Cemetery.

Survivors of Mrs. Tamm include her husband, John H. Tamm of Daytona Beach; an infant son, John Edward, also of Daytona Beach; a sister, Mrs. Emily Gainer of Daytona Beach; her mother Mrs. W. J. McMillan and three brothers, Albert, Charles and Kyle McMillan of Sanford.

ORLANDO, Jan. 3.—(Special) —Termining the "Eight Infants Paralysis" campaign "more important than even before" in the nation's history, Chester B. Treadway, state chairman of the Committee for the Celebration of the President's Birthday, urged that Floridians give full support to the drive.

Mr. Treadway points out that the movement for a strong sense of national defense, for health is a mighty important factor in the nation's production and fighting ability and control of infantile paralysis is imperative as a part of our war effort.

Citizens of the state can cooperate by serving on committees in each locality and in patronizing the events arranged for the celebration. Officials point out that half of the money collected remains in the county for use in caring for paralysis victims and in helping to control and stamp out the disease locally, therefore contributions are actually in the form of insurance for your local community and a protection for yourself and family.

Major Jones Dies In Anniston, Ala.

Major Florence Jones, former Salvation Army officer of Sanford, died in Anniston, Ala., Dec. 31, and was buried in Atlanta on Jan. 2, according to a report received here.

Major Jones, along with Major Bivans, was the first officer to establish Salvation Army work in Sanford.
