# Sale Of Cars

Passenger Autos And Trucks Can Not Be

WASHINGTON, Jan. 2.-(A)

WASHINGTON, Jan. 2.—(A)

The government yesterday prohibited purchase, sale or delivery of new passenger cars and trucks pending establishment of an automobile rationing system and disclosed simultaneously that production of new automobiles and light trucks would be stopped entirely within a few weeks.

The order, isaued by Locald M. Nelson, O.P.M. priorities director, is effective immediately. Stoppage of production, in line with a policy adonted today by the supply priorities and allocations board, will compel the establishment of a rationing system, O.P.M. said, and it is expected that purchases of new cars and trucks will be limited under the plan to government, lend-lease, and the most "essential" eivilian users.

Price Administrator Leon Henderson, who is administering the tire ration program effective. the tire ration program effec-tive Jan. 5. also will supervise the automobile rationing which is expected to become operative about Jan. 15.






