



But a PSC spokesman said not to look for any decreases in monthly utility bills because of Tuesday's ruling. After studying the issue for more than six years, the commission voted unanimously to remove certain advertising and promotional activities from consideration in setting rates.

**Utility Advertising** 

Companies can still spend money on advertising in the restricted areas, but the PSC said it would not allow them to use these costs when figuring bills for customers. Removed from consideration in setting a utility's rate

-Advertising which states a firm's position on a matter of public controversy. -Dues paid to clubs and nonprofessional organizations. -Promoting or providing financial aid involving sponsorship of community affairs unless specifically

authorized by the PSC. -Films and slides for community support. -Promotional practices and advertising in areas where the quality or availability of service is below acceptable

In addition, gas and electric companies would not be allowed to include the cost of free appliance maintenance calls, allowances involving appliances furnished free or below cost and appliance rentals with the monthly charge below actual cost. Also disallowed for gas and electric companies would be

## Hanks Indictment Dropped, Again

A legal oversight by State Atty. Abbott Herring's office has resulted in the remaining grand jury charges against Seminole County Zoning Board member Richard Hanks being thrown out by County Court Judge Harold

However, according to prosecutor Ralph Eriksson. charges Hanks conspired to violate the state's election laws will be renewed - either by a direct information or a new grand jury indictment. Johnson Tuesday threw out the remaining charges

against Hanks because state law forbids a grand jury from amending its own indictment, and the second set of indictments issued by the grand jury used the words "as amended" after correcting errors in dates made in the first indictments July 11.

Eriksson today said he did not know who in the state attorney's office was responsible for advising the grand jury when the error was made. Assistant State Atty. Bill Staley, who supervised the

grand jury during the week long probe into the regime of former Altamonte Mayor Lawrence Swofford, was on vacation and could not be reached for comment. The errors uncovered Tuesday marked the latest in a

series of legal oversights which have plagued the indictments. First to cause dismissal of the charges were errors in dates. Later, Circuit Court Judge Volie Williams was forced

the throw out charges against suspended Altamonte public works director Don Bundy because the indictment failed to state that the alleged violations occured in Seminole County. Williams, who is locked in a bitter legal battle with

Herring over whether he should disqualify himself because of his comments on the state's handling of the case, earlier dismissed sections of the indictment because Bundy's constitutional rights were compromised. The judge ruled that Herring's office ignored warnings in a previous case and allowed investigators to

for the state being present. Because of the series of dismissals and hearings still to be held, scheduled Sept. 9 trial dates are expected to be postponed until at least Oct. 1-if any of the charges



## Three Parties Not Acceptable In U.S.

How quickly political tides change directions is evident in the increasing optimism of Republicans and the increasing gloom of Democrats now that Watergate, as it applies to incumbent public of ficials, is behind us

Republicans are buoyed by the popularity of the Ford Administration — which can be translated into improved party outlooks in elections this year and in 1976.

Democrats are pessimistic for the same reasons, and because the deep divisions that scarred the party in 1972 emerged again during a recent Democrat charter drafting session in Kansas City.

Unfortunately, what we are seeing is more than an ordinary two-party tug of war. A number of polls have indicated that only 44 per cent of the voters consider themselves Democrats, 23 per cent consider themselves Republicans and fully 33 per cent decline to affiliate with either party

This constitutes a serious erosion of the two party system, a slippage that raises visions of ineffective coalition governments which now exist in Europe and elsewhere.

Republicans and Democrats should by all means hold to their convictions and compete in their traditional fashion.

Indeed, there is every reason for them to exhibit their basic differences in philosophy to the voters so that they have a clear choice on all major issues, and thus avoid splintering what has proven to be the most effective political system in the

## Into Shadows


It now appears that Emperor Haile Selassie of Ethiopia will end his days as a monarch in name only. The armed forces have all but completed stripping the last remnants of political power from the "Lion of Judah" who has reigned as regent or emperor for more than half a century.

The Ethiopian military leaders clearly are determined to diminish the symbolic status of the emperor as well as eliminate his role in the government. A new constitution that will probably become law by their decres leaves the emperor without authority and also would "dis-establish" the Coptic Christian Church of Ethiopia, of which the emperor is the nominal head. Thus both the throne and the "official" church of Ethiopia would be swept to the sidelines for the sake of political and social

It is hard to view these events without some sadness, even if the autocratic rule of the 82-year-old Haile Selassie had become anachronistic in this day of burgeoning African democracy. While the emperor may have been slow to grasp the extent of discontent and the demand for reform among his people, he probably knows them well enough to fear the consequences of moving too rapidly toward democratic government.

The experience of other African nations in replacing a stable old order with a new order high on aspiration but low on experience has not always been a fruitful one. Ethiopia is now moving down that unhappy road, with its stalwart old emperor
