Rape Victim Tells Jury Of Attack

A 10-man, two-woman Circuit Court bory heard testimony this morning from the victim of the rape for which Willie Anderson, 28, possibly faces the death penalty. Anderson is charged with raping the 17-year-old Sanford girl on April 15. She reported to police she was assaulted in bushes between Oak and Myrtle Avenues, and that she was beaten by her assailant, whom she knew, when she attempted to resist his advances. The victim, barely speaking above a whisper,

related intercourse had lasted for 30 minutes; that she fought her assailant so violently he knocked off her wig, and that she attempted to escape while the defendant retrieved it. Later, she testified, he offered her two \$20 bills and said if she reported the rape, he would kill her. The victim said she recognized the defendant but did not know him on a name-to-name basis. After the alleged rape, she said, she walked to

her home, pursued by the assailant and was scared "he'd grab me again." The young victim, who wore her ebony hair in pigtails, said blows to her eye, inflicted by the defendant, resulted in four stitiches. She returned to her home, after meeting a patrol

Rare Disease Hits Housewife

By JANE CASSELBERRY

Nancy Green, 28-year-old Daytona Beach housewife and mother, is struggling for her life against a cruel and rare disease that is draining her strength both physically and financially. Nancy is the wife of Lonnie W. Green, son of Mrs Juanita Moore of Summerlin Avenue, and the late John W. Green and sister of Mrs. Robert Hosford, 130 Mayfair Circle.

On March 4, Nancy went to Halifax Hospital and was told she would have twins. She did give birth to a healthy four pound, five-ounce girl, but what was thought to be a second fetus turned out to be an extremely rare teratoma tumor discovered during emergency surgery. The tumor was composed of embryonic tissues and

on the X-ray to be a fetus. Her doctors have not

been able to find records of any other live births in association with such a turnor.

Since the triple cheotherapy with which she was being treated was not doing much good and there is no standard remedy for treating teratoma, she was referred to Dr. Hoy Parker, professor of obstetrics at Duke University, who has had some experience with the rare tumor and who was experimenting with a combination of powerful drugs, methrotrexate, chlorambucii and actinomycin. Mrs. Green can only take the drugs, which tend to cause nausea, for five consecutive days every three to four weeks.

With Senator McGovern basking in the warmth of what appears to be a sure win (on the first ballot) his decision to make no personal appearance before the platform committee and to let his campaign position papers do his talking has raised some eyebrows.

National Security Debate Shaping

WASHINGTON — If Senator George McGovern modifies his view on some subjects in order to calm the conservatives in his party — his tax plan, for instance — he will not back away from his super controversial issue; national security. When the leading candidates met with his Democratic opponents, Senators Edmund S, Muskie and Hubert H. Humphrey, a few weeks ago there was no meeting of the minds on Vietnam. McGovern stuck to his long-time position

that we withdraw and cut the defense budget by \$30 billion annually. This would come out of waste and unessential weapons procurement, McGovern says. To draw national security into a Presidential campaign is unprecedented in recent elections. Candidates on both sides have assumed that the public was agreed on a strong defense fitting Pentagon blueprings. Few questions asked.

That has changed. For the last few years change has been growing among the public and in Congress. Now antimilitarism rumbles across Capitol Hill every day. A former member: of the Administration, Defense Assistant Secretary Paul Warnke, tells Congress the recent SALT agreements, an Administration product, will encourage unnecessary military spending in the U.S.

Defense Secretary Melvin Laird attacks McGovern and his budget-cutting plans in much the way GOP campaign speakers will later whale into the Dakota Senator if he is the candidate against Nixon. - with scorn and hints of

Laird points the finger at McGovern with the resounding charge that McGovern's proposal would cost us "\$1 billion in white flags to signal a world-wide surrender."

Snide generalities will not be enough when we reach the nitty-gritty of the election battle. If it is McGovern vs. Nixon there will have to be serious debate in a serious vein. For McGovern's proposals are serious and carefully thought out, right or wrong. His arguments demand answers and cannot be turned aside with a quip. They will force into the open hitherto classified top secret papers. The White House and the Pentagon owe him and the country more candid answers than they have given.

1) Should we stop building B-1 bombers and allow the existing bomber fleet to rot away? 2) Should we stop spreading out the ABM defensive missile system and stop improving the Minutemen missile force? 3) Shall we continue research on the submarine Trident

Political Notebook

Connally in 1976, GOP Bloc Choice

WASHINGTON (NEA) While everyone (almost) is giving rapt attention to this year's political campaigns, a group of rather influential Republicans is worrying about the presidential contest of 1976, when Richard Nixon will no longer be in the run-

But they have a candidate-former Texas governor, ex-Navy and ex-Treasury Secretary John Connally. On the They are convinced the Texas Democrat has more political know-how than any other man on the horizon. They believe Nixon is inclined their way, though they have no convincing evidence as to the President's feel ings on friend Connally as his successor at the White

The group has no formal standing as yet. And no funds

Interestingly enough, this informal group of backers does not favor Connally as Nixon's running mate this year. For one thing, they believe he would not be happy as vice-president. Even more importantly, they're convinced the vice-presidency is not the best stepping stone

History is on the side of their argument. It is true that in the early years of the Republic, three of the first seven U.S. presidents after Washington had been vice-presidents-John Adams, Thomas Jefferson and Martin Van Buren. But since then, except for Nixon, eight vice-presidents have succeeded to the presidency only through death of the president. And Nixon was unable to make it directly from the vice-presidency.

The track record of those in Spiro Agnew's post is definitely not good. Therefore, these backers would like Nixon to name connally as secretary of state. They see at Foggy Bot tom a much greater scope for their man's particular by the statistics showing only six secretaries of state have become presidents—Jefferson, Madison, Monroe,

John Quincy Adams, Van Buren and Buchanan. They note that quite a few other secretaries of state have made names for themselves, either at State or the Supreme Court or elsewhere, including John Marshall, Daniel Webster, John C. Calhoun, Elihu Root, Robert Lansing, Charles E. Hughes, Frank Kellogg, Henry Stimson, James Blaine, Cordell Hull, John Foster Dulles and

Dean Acheson. The thinking of these backers, therefore, is that Con nally wouldn't get lost in the wings at State as he might as vice-president, though they admit it difficult in any event to conceive of Connally being out of sight, regardless of his official position.

Connally himself has gotten a taste of international dickering as Treasury secretary, and liked what he was doing in this role as negotiator, following Nixon's dramatic dollar evaluation and drive for a new set of international currency arrangements. The word is that Con nally likes his present assignment, too, as a personal traveling troubleshooter for Nixon abroad.

Wiretap Decision— Freedom's Sentry

You most likely have not been sleeping noticeably easier since the Supreme Court banned wiretapping of political radicals without a court order. Most of us use the telephone to tell our wives we'll be home late for dinner, to see what time the movie starts

it the local theater or to gossip with aunt Josephine. I the FBI has nothing better to do than listen in, it's O.K. with us. So we tend to see wirelapping as something that bothers only people who have guilty consciences. In fact, wiretapping has taken on a symbolic importance far greater than its real impact. Wiretapping is something a repressive government does to stifle criticism on the one hand. It is something a government has a right to do to prevent insidious revolutionaries from

perverting American freedom on the other. Since no subversive who is intelligent and sophisticated enough to represent any danger to this country would also be stupid enough to transmit any significant information over the phone in the first place, wiretapping has in reality become a way of harassing serious radicals and ferreting out embarrassing information about people the government is otherwise displeased with, for one reason

These, obviously, are potentially dangerous distortions of the government's legitimate right to protect itself. And the symbolic aspect of the situation is not a trivial con-

And the decision did, after all, give the government the right to tap phones of domestic radicals if it could persuade the courts that those radicals represent a threat to national security. (The decision also did not touch on the wiretapping of those who are considered to be agents of a foreign power, which gives the government considerable leeway.)

It does, however, prove wrong those who argue that we are pursuing a mad rush toward the figurative 1984. You may not be concerned now. But people seldom are aware of the lost freedoms until it is too late to do any-

tell her I have dusted garden vegetables and flowers with wood and paper ashes and they regained their healthy foliage.—GARDEN LOVER DEAR READERS-Because of the variance in plants and the pests that are attacking them, the authority I consulted said he was not positive as to how the frequently recommended soapsuds treatment really affected the flavor of herbs and felt that frequent washing with plain water would knock off the aphids. However, this also might not be too good for plants prone to disease. Also, I was advised that the dusting with ashes would



Tom Gordie came in with a 514 pounder plus three smaller ones and released them, the largest one having just finished spawning and looking pretty skinny. Speckled perch fishermen are finding some under the bridge, fishing deep with live Missouri minnows

Dollar Fill a Street Street or Otis and Irene Faulk who are on vacation from Camp Seminole on the Wekiva River. Dottie says the hyacinths are bad, covering a lot of the good bass fishing holes, but some of the campers are getting fair strings of catfish and bream from the seawall. The river is closed from the Highway 46 bridge south and on the north side of the camp is only open for about a mile and

Wekiva River Haven Camp, George Cheney, owner, reported a few bass being caught there this week. He also mentioned the hyacinth problem but expects it to clear up in a few days. George Fowler, one of the campers here caught a nice string of catfish Saturday, enough for a fish fry for his entire party.

Salt Water Fishing

Several local anglers including Robert Harvey, Harold Pate, and party visited Red Fish Pass on the West Coast last weekend. In spite of Hurricane Agnes, they came up with a good score. Using live pinfish and Trout-touts this party landed 22 snook, and assorted other smaller fish, according to information received from Don Smith of Seminole Sporting

Jim Blythe, owner of Plaza Sports Shop, selected Homassassa Springs for his fishing trip the same weekend. Jim and his party found tides running so high docks were under water. Some of the tackle shops had water running through them, and winds from "Agnes" causing a 3 to 5 foot chop on the water. Even so, the three boats in the party ventured off shore only to meet blinding rain and some hall. Needless to say, fishing was at a low ebb and Blythe had no "TALL TALES" to report. A real fisherman is hard to discourage and Jim is already looking forward to another excursion in July. (Better luck next time, Jim.)

On the East Coast, this past week, all the pier operators had the same complaint; plenty of fish around the piers but live shrimp for bait. Most of the bait shrimp are hauled in from the Gulf Coast and with the bad weather, none of the suppliers could work.

Merie Keller at the Daytona Main Street Pier said Menhaden minnows were showing up and several kingfish had been hung by anglers using them for bait. "Trout and flounder are plentiful," said Keller, "but they refuse to hit on anything but live shrimp." "Red " Yelvington and brother Harold tore up the sheephead using fiddler crabs for bait. They landed close to 60 in about two hours.

Mostly small stuff such as whiting, sheephead, spots and sailors choice was the word from Ormond Beach Pier. Small private boats have reported some outstanding catches. Among them was a 52 pound king landed from a 16 foot skiff Saturday. Don Smith of New Smyrna outlasted a 70 pound tarpon which hit on a live pigfish bait. This is the largest tarpon entered in the Daytona Chamber of Commerce tournament to date.
