Once Bottles Were Corkers

NEW YORK (AP) — Today's wine and beverage bottles have a better standing than their predecessors of 20 years ago. The Glass Container Manufacturers Institute notes that in the 17th Century wine and "soda water" bottles had rounded bottoms. Early wine and soda bottles were sealed with corks that had to be kept moist to maintain the seal. The bottles were thus purposefully designed so they couldn't stand up necessitating horizontal storage to keep the corks wet. Flat-bottom bottles came into popularity in the 19th Century with the development of crown caps.

Home Hints By Sandra

 What is in the future for draperies? Durable press, thermal-lined and new bold patterns, textures and colors—they're all there.

The durable press finishes will probably be more popular than ever. These draperies are washable, machine washable and have no wrinkles.

The new development in draperies that eliminates the need for lining and has insulating properties as well as thermal-lined draperies. These draperies would be especially good to use in a room with large areas of glass. The new drapery fabric has an aerosol-like acrylic lining permanently bonded to it, and gives a lined appearance from the outside of the window. The bonded lining can be machine washed or dry cleaned, so the draperies would be cleaned according to instructions for the fabric itself.

Thermal-lined drapes help insulate against cold in winter and heat in summer. They also help absorb outside noise without disturbing sound inside the room. The lining gives the drapery fabric extra body, helps protect it from sun fading, and gives greater privacy. The lining will not crack or peel off with normal use.
