# \$1,000 Debt To Oviedo Denied By Housing Unit

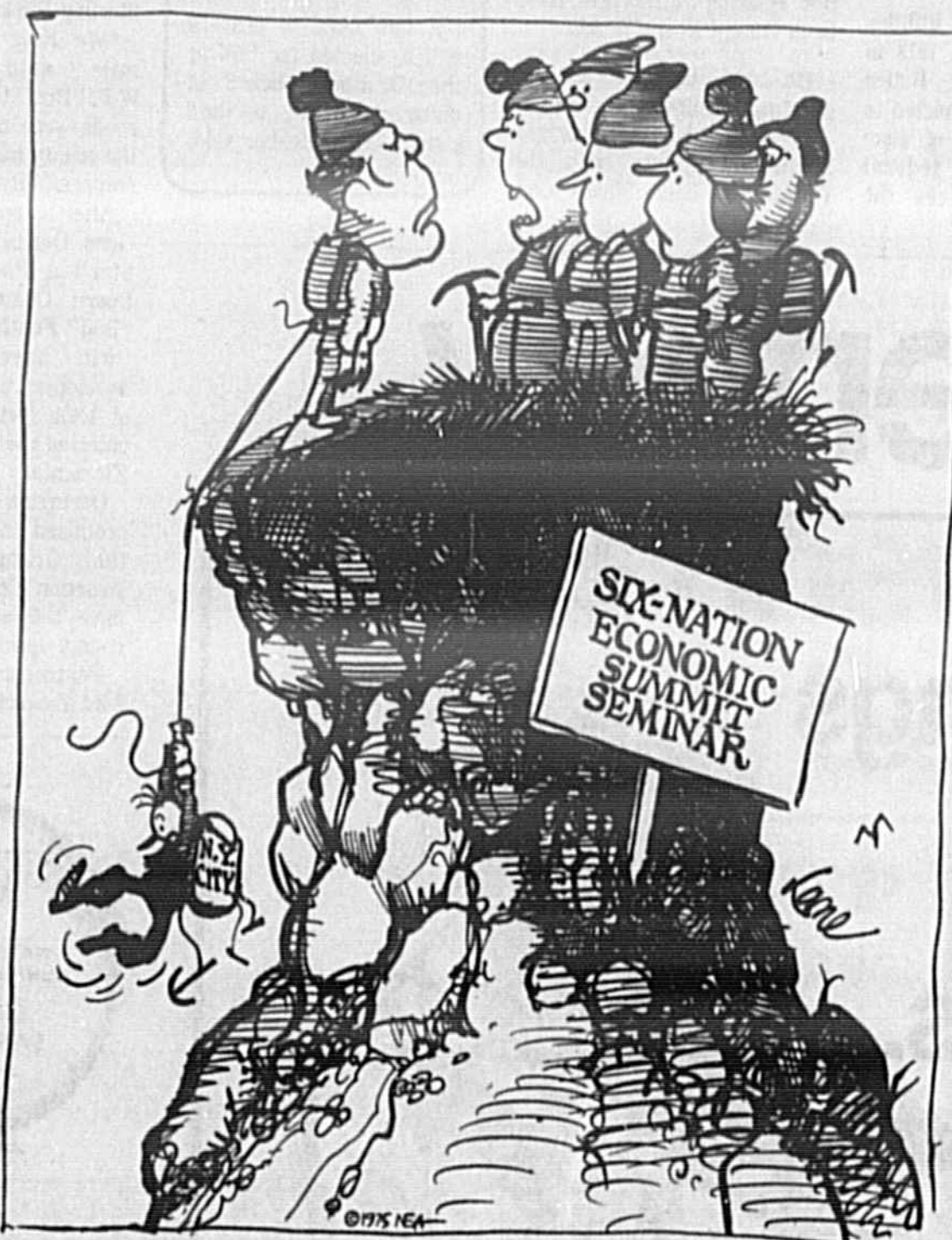

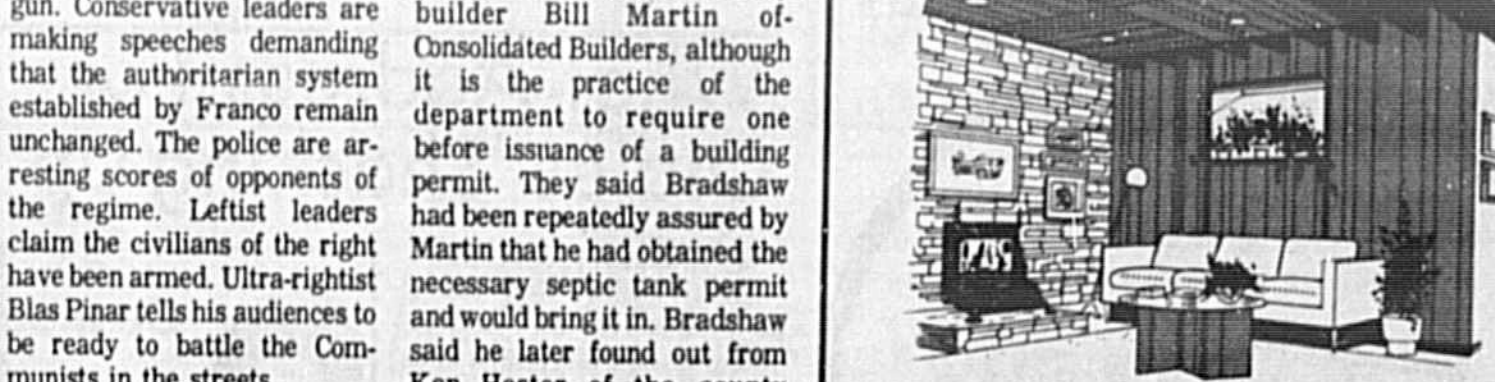

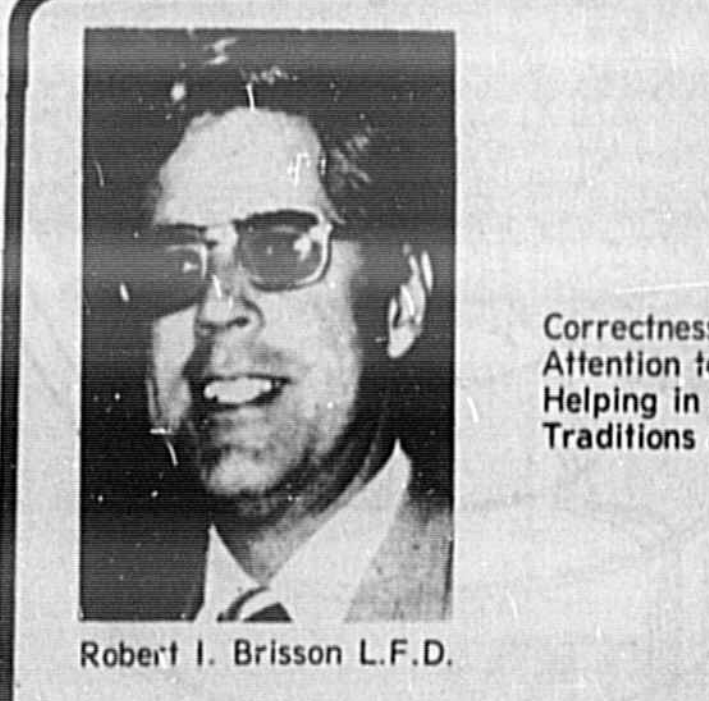

## Joy Of Stitching

### Discover Repousse For New Techniques

By ELSA WILLIAMS

Design and pattern are everywhere we look but distinctive techniques are rare. That's why rediscovering one so beautiful as the ancient Chinese embroidery technique of repousse was such a happy experience for me. Characteristic of Chinese repousse are areas of raised design that create a three-dimensional illusion.

Many of the lines and shapes in repousse, both the fine detail and heavier ornamentation, are achieved through the use of a non-woven fiber. This is twisted and held in place with the embroiderer's left hand while the right hand carefully places stitches in tight formation over the fiber.

This technique should not be confused with the stumpwork of colonial days which was padded or raised with cotton wadding or other soft material which often formed part of the design.

So enchanted was I with the Chinese repousse that I devoted a good deal of time to developing a special fiber for working it. After much trial and error I arrived at one that satisfied me and does a perfect job for the needle artist. Strong and washable, it's available in sheet form and can be torn to precisely the thickness required for individual design areas.

## Goldwater To Take Radio Spot

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Sen. Barry Goldwater, R-Ariz., will take over Ronald Reagan's "Viewpoint" radio commentary show for at least three weeks, the producer of the show says.

Goldwater, the 1964 Republican nominee for president, will record 15 broadcasts Thursday in Washington for airing beginning Dec. 8, producer Harry O'Connor said Wednesday.

Reagan is leaving the program — now heard daily on 330 radio stations — to campaign for the Republican nomination for president.

O'Connor said other guest hosts, including Julie Nixon Eisenhower and William F. Buckley Jr., have recorded five-minute daily programs for use before Dec. 8.

## Solzenitsyn Denies Reports

ZURICH, Switzerland (AP) — Alexander Solzenitsyn, the exiled Soviet writer, has denied reports that he is suffering from depression.

The reports about his alleged depression came on the eve of the international P.E.N. congress in Vienna. Solzenitsyn, a Nobel Prize winner, was invited to attend the writers' conference but did not respond.

## Sakharov Refused Exit Visa

MOSCOW (AP) — Nuclear physicist Andrei Sakharov, who has been refused permission to leave the Soviet Union to receive his Nobel Prize in Oslo, is a "professional anti-Sovietier," the news agency Tass said Wednesday.

The Literary Gazette said earlier that Sakharov, an outspoken dissident, could not go to Oslo because he knows important state and military secrets.

# Committee To Get Intelligence Documents

WASHINGTON (AP) — Presidential aides are turning over to the House intelligence committee documents subpoenaed before the panel voted to cite Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger for contempt of Congress, a committee report says.

But the committee's draft report says new material handed over to the panel is not enough to quash the contempt citation against Kissinger.

Chairman Otis G. Pike said Wednesday the State Department found and turned over to the panel seven more requests by previous secretaries of state for covert intelligence operations abroad since 1961. That makes a total of 17 such requests now in the hands of the committee.

The report, to accompany the committee's three contempt citations against Kissinger when they are handed to the full House, was to be presented at a meeting today before committee members who subpoenaed Kissinger on Oct. 15. The report also lists intelligence costs.

John Marsh, President Ford's chief negotiator with the panel, met with the staff members Wednesday but no compromise was reported. Kissinger was cited after he failed to turn over subpoenaed information.

Ford invoked executive privilege against turning over State Department requests for covert operations but the panel voted contempt action against Kissinger for not complying with that and two other subpoenas.

The panel was told then that 10 requests for covert operations were made between 1962 and 1972. All were approved by previous presidents.

The committee's senior Republican, Rep. Robert McClory of Illinois, said in a radio broadcast that of the 10 requests, one went to President Richard M. Nixon, one to President John F. Kennedy, and "seven or eight" to President Lyndon B. Johnson.

The other two contempt actions were voted for Kissinger's refusal to turn over material on approval of all covert operations since 1965, and intelligence data on Soviet compliance with arms agreements.

## Caucus Kills Bill

# Anti-Busing Measure Buried

WASHINGTON (AP) — By refusing to push for a constitutional amendment that would ban busing as a desegregation tool, House Democrats are laying to rest any chance that such a measure will be considered this year.

The Democratic caucus voted 172 to 86 on Wednesday to kill a plan that would have required an antibusing amendment to be sent by the House Judiciary Committee to the floor within 30 days.

The vote not only killed prospects for consideration of an antibusing amendment before the end of the year, it also reduced the possibility of action on such a measure next year.

The caucus was pushed into deciding whether to support the antibusing plans by Reps. Dale Milford and Olin E. Teague, both Texas Democrats, who submitted a petition signed by 51 party colleagues who want to see the amendment reach the floor.

House Speaker Carl Albert of Oklahoma and Judiciary Committee Chairman Peter W. Rodino Jr. of New Jersey strongly opposed the move, contending it was ill-advised and not conducive to party unity.

"I believe that the Constitution of the United States should be amended only on a matter of last resort, to deal with an issue that cannot be resolved in any other way, on which there is a substantial national consensus," declared Rodino.

Albert said the antibusing amendment controversy is so "explosive" that it could harm the Democratic party in the long run. But Albert said his chief objection to the move was that it would override decisions of the U.S. Supreme Court.

The Milford-Teague resolution sought a constitutional amendment that would give children the right to attend the school nearest to their homes.

Milford said the amendment would not violate the spirit of the Constitution. "Quite to the contrary, we are adding one very important individual citizen right to this long list of rights already specifically guaranteed by the Constitution ... the right to attend the school within the neighborhood is an individual right that our citizens are demanding and that is well worth protecting," he said.

For the first time in history the Democratic Caucus was open to the public and press.

## Senate Approves Picketing Bill

WASHINGTON (AP) — A 25-year controversy apparently is at an end following Senate passage of a labor-backed measure that will allow striking building trades unions to picket an entire construction site.

The bill was passed 52 to 45 Wednesday night after the Senate twice invoked cloture to shut off filibusters against it.

The measure was sent to a conference that will iron out differences between House and Senate versions. But sponsors say they see no great difficulty in reconciling the two versions.

The proposal would give unions the power to close down an entire construction site even if they have a dispute with only one subcontractor.

Riding the bill as a second major section is a Ford administration proposal designed to bring quicker and less inflationary settlements in construction industry labor disputes. The President has said he will not sign the picketing legislation without the companion proposal.

Construction unions contended that the general contractors and subcontractors on a site are a single entity engaged in one enterprise and that unions should have the right to picket an entire work site.

Without this power, they say they do not have the same rights as industrial unions which can seek to shut down an entire company.

Opponents of the bill argue that the measure bill will further drive up construction costs.

Under the bill, local unions would have to give 10-day written notice of their intention to picket an entire construction site and would have to obtain strike approval from their national union.

## Teen-Age Drinking Increases

RESEARCH TRIANGLE PARK, N.C. (AP) — A study of teen-age drinking habits says 28 per cent of the nation's teenagers are problem drinkers.

The national survey of 13,000 youths in 450 schools across the country found that the 28 per cent reported themselves as drunk at least four times in the past year or said that their drinking got them in trouble with peers or superiors at least twice in the past year. The surveyors said that constituted a drinking problem.

The survey, released Wednesday, was done for the National Institute of Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism by the Research Triangle Institute. Students in the survey filled out a questionnaire.

The survey results indicated that less than 18 per cent of the nation's 17-year-olds have never taken a drink although the legal drinking age in all states is at least 18.
