#### **Limiting Terms**

Seniority would cease to be a problem in the United States Congress if some suggestions offered recently by John B. Connally were followed.


The former governor of Texas told an interviewer he would like to see members of the House of Representatives given a four-year term, instead of their present two-year term. Then he would limit each member to serving only three consecutive terms. After 12 years, retirement would be mandatory. Connally proposed to limit U.S. senators, who serve six-year terms, to two terms. They too would have to retire from the Congress after 12 years.

These suggestions have a certain appeal. They would work against "career" politicians who are more at home in Washington than in their home districts. The proposals would favor "citizen" politicians who would expect to return to their careers in private life after temporary service in the Congress. The "citizen" concept is closer to the ideas of the founding

The great weakness of the Connally suggestions is that they would require a constitutional amendment. Barring the unlikely cossibility of another constitutional convention, the only way to amend the Constitution is by a two-thirds vote of both houses of the Congress with ratification by the legislatures of three-

fourths of the states. Does anyone imagine that the congressmen and state legislators, most of whom are career politicians, are ever going to approve proposals which would abolish their vocation?

Labeled H.R. 9603, the proposal, if passed by the House and Senate, and not vetoed by President Ford, would require the Congress to review every federal program every two years - from scratch - as though each project were being proposed for the first time. The Senate and House committees responsible

for every program, however large or small, would be required to ask and check out in detail: -Whether the project objectives were still

-Whether the methods used and operations called for were still the best possible approach to the problems being attacked. -Whether in fact the federal expenditures were having any substantial impact.

-Whether the program duplicated or conflicted with others - public or private. The congressional committees would be required to consider alternate methods of achieving the objectives aimed at. And to study whether any of the alternatives would cost less than the program being reviewed, or achieve greater benefits for the same cost.

The committees would be required to hold open hearings, and to make their studies and results available freely to the public. As part of the exercise, each federal department and agency concerned would be required to provide the Congress with detailed cost and effectiveness studies for current operations, minimal or reduced operations and expanded

Now anyone who has studied the federal budget for any period of time knows that a blind man could slash 10 per cent with ease - and perhaps as much as 15 per cent - simply by eliminating programs which have outgrown their usefulness or which have produced no measurable results for all the millions - or

oillions — of dollars spent But eliminating those programs seems to have been beyond the ability of the president and

Some time back, President Ford sent Congress a list of programs he believed should be declared dead and buried with due grace. Very little

#### Goldwater To Take Radio Spot

LOS ANGELES (AP) - Sen. Barry Goldwater, R-Ariz., will take over Ronald Reagan's "Viewpoint" radio commentary show for at least three weeks, the producer of the show says.

Goldv ater, the 1964 Republican nominee for president, will record 15 broadcasts Thursday in Washington for airing beginning Dec. 8, producer Harry O'Connor said

Reagan is leaving the program - now heard daily on 320 radio stations - to campaign for the Republican nomination for president. O'Connor said other guest hosts, including Julie Nixon Eisenhower and William F. Buckley Jr., have recorded

five-minute daily programs for use before Dec. 8.

#### Solzenitsyn Denies Reports

ZURICH, Switzerland (AP) - Alexander Solzhenitsyn, the exiled Soviet writer, has denied reports that he is suffering from depression.

The reports about his alleged depression came on the eve of the international P.E.N. congress in Vienna. Solzhenitsyn, a Nobel Prize winner, was invited to attend the writers' conference but did not respond.

#### Sakharov Refused Exit Visa

MOSCOW (AP) - Nuclear physicist Andrei Sakharov, who has been refused permission to leave the Soviet Union to receive his Nobel Prize in Oslo, is a "professional anti-Sovieteer," the news agency Tass said Wednesday. The Literary Gazette said earlier that Sakharov, an outspoken dissident, could not go to Oslo because he knows important state and military secrets.




