## Courthouse Hearing On Tuesday



### Palmist Suit Is Reassigned

The hearing, called to comply with the law, is to listen to the public feeling on necessity of constructing the courthouse.

Suit filed by three South Seminole residents protesting the location of the courthouse and claiming Sanford is not the permanent county seat was thrown out of court by Circuit Judge Roger Dykes in early October. Earlier this month, Architects of the complex, John Burton IV, and James (Dangle) Rogers have presented schematics to the County Commission showing a two building plan with courtroom facilities in one building and offices in a separate building with the two joined by a covered walkway. The courtroom facility would be attached to the jail by another covered walkway.

Estimates of cost of the complex have ranged from \$2.1 million to \$2.8 million depending on amount of construction done in the first phase.

County Commission has given tentative approval to the two-building approach.

The architects have recommended the old courthouse "be abandoned and demolished as soon as practicable" following construction of the new facility as it "does not comply with the building code or fire law."

"If necessary to conserve current funds, the old building can be used temporarily for County offices which are not functions are such that loss by fire or otherwise would be less than a catastrophe," the architects said.

## Longwood Says No On Voting

Longwood City Council turned thumbs down on the suggestion of Mayor A. E. Lammann at a charter work meeting last night to change voter registration procedures to permit city residents to register only in their own ward all elections in the county.

"From a good government point of view, I believe it would be helpful to change their registration with the county would be sufficient for them to vote in the city," the mayor declared.

Harmony, however, resigned throughout the meeting and all provisions for two others in the proposed new charter were reviewed, discussed and approved by the Board.

It is planned to hold a public hearing on the charter at 8 p.m. next Thursday and then submit the proposed law to the legislative delegation for introduction and passage in the special session of the Legislature early next year.

Members of the Council with the lone exception of Councilman Eugene Jacques were present. In addition, Mayor Lammann, City Clerk Onnie R. Shomate and Councilmen-elect James Brown and B. H. Ferrell were on hand.

## Herlong OKs Support To GE School Here

Deep interest and support for the location of the proposed General Electric Skilled Training Center on the grounds of the Sanford Naval Air Station was expressed by Congressman A. S. Herlong Jr., in a lengthy conversation with Don Rathel, executive director of the Sanford Industrial Commission in Washington yesterday.

Rathel had been in Washington for several purposes. Chief among these, however, was the necessity to contact every federal agency—and there are many—who would be able to furnish funds for this GE facility. It being the end of the year and a time when such agencies are awaiting Congressional action to determine their fiscal resources for the coming year, it was the time for such talks.

The initial phase report by GE on the training needs in Florida is about to be printed and distributed. Herlong was one of those who saw a preliminary copy and was interested. Rathel said that he asked that a completed report be sent him as soon as available.

Rathel, who has been intimately connected with this study of skilled training needs, explains his interest from at least two standpoints. As director of SIC his job is to attract industries to a Sanford area location. 

## Congress Rushing To Adjournment

WASHINGTON (AP) — A last-minute battle over foreign aid may endanger prompt congressional adjournment after Senate and House conferees agreed on other remaining major bills.

With a chance to go home after more than 11 months in session, both the House and Senate expected to approve today compromise on:

- An appropriation of \$1.7 billion for the antipoverty program that is only slightly below the amount the administration said it needed, although well below the \$2.66 billion it originally wanted.
- A \$2.3 billion, two-year extension of the Elementary and Secondary School Act worked out in what one Senate conferee called "the toughest conference I've ever been in."

The House bill would have put the theory under state control immediately. But the conference version would turn 95 per cent of the money over to the states this year, with the full amount being made available next year. Out of their 95 per cent share, the states would have to allocate 10 per cent to local school districts.

The conference, which dragged on into two late-night sessions, was marked by a bitter fight between urban and rural congressmen over the distribution of funds. Both sides expressed satisfaction with the final version, but Sen. Jacob K. Javits, R-N.Y., who termed the conference the toughest he had been in, said the big city advocates had to make "great sacrifices" to get a bill.






